

WEEKLY CRIME REPORT



INTRODUCTION

The re-emergence of criminal gangs in some parts of the country was of key concern in this reporting week.

In Nairobi County, the security agencies cautioned the residents about the resurgence of robbers back in the city centre disguising as matatu touts. Many of the criminals are armed with knives and ready to pounce on pedestrians and shoppers leaving retail outlets.

In Mombasa County, police were able to thwart an attack on pedestrians by the outlawed criminal gang, Wakili Kwanza in Kisauni area. Police also arrested suspected members of Mombasa Republic Council as they assembled at a house in Kibudani area of Kwale County.

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE WEEK NAIROBI


The key crime-related incidents reported in Nairobi included:

- Two apartments along First Parkland Avenue were on Thursday morning broken into and valuables of unknown value stolen
- Two knife-wielding robbers were on Friday gunned down by police officers in Huruma Las Vegas area
- A vehicle parked outside Quick Mart in Lavington was on Saturday broken into by unknown persons who made away with valuables
- Three men were on Tuesday arrested for allegedly stealing from a Chinese Water Tunnel Construction Company at Mairi site in Nairobi County
- Three suspected thugs were on Wednesday morning shot dead and crude


weapons found on them in a botched robbery in Lucky Summer area

 Scores were injured in Mathare slums on Wednesday afternoon after chang'aa traders engaged police in running battles to protest operations against illicit brew in the area






SCENE OF INCIDENTS ANALYSIS IN RELATION TO INCIDENTS IN NAIROBI




The number of incidents reported in public places were slightly above as compared to the previous week.

AN AERIAL VIEW OF SECURITY INCIDENTS IN NAIROBI













ANALYSIS IN RELATION TO INCIDENTS IN KENYA SCENE INCIDENTS


BELOW ARE SOME OF THE KEY SECURITY INCIDENTS

- A man is nursing gunshot wounds after he was on Thursday allegedly shot by a businessman over land in Mtwapa, Kilifi County.
- A couple was on Thursday brutally murdered at their home in Panyako village, Kakamega County.
- Angry boda boda riders on Friday killed a suspected thief and set on fire two houses belonging to his girlfriend in Kithioro village, Kirinyaga County.
- Police in Taita Taveta County are holding a police constable who on Friday allegedly shot dead a patron at a club.
- Gangsters on Saturday night killed a watchman before raiding a bar he was guarding in Siakago town, Embu County.
- Police on Saturday shot and wounded two people for allegedly kidnapping a young man in Karuku village, Embu County.
- A woman arrested for selling illicit brew on Sunday allegedly committed suicide at Mai Mahiu police cells in Naivasha, Nakuru County.
- Two men aged 39 and 40 years old were on Sunday arrested by detectives in Mombasa on suspicion of selling counterfeit medicines

- A go-down in Busia County was on Monday night broken into and goods of unknown value and Sh900,000 stolen.
- A Form Four student on Monday night allegedly committed suicide under unclear circumstances at Chinga Boys High School, Nyeri County
- A 45-year-old man from Kamucege village in Kirinyaga County was on Tuesday evening stabbed to death for having an affair with someone's wife.
- A couple and its eight-year-old son were on Tuesday found brutally murdered at Melit village in Kericho County.
- One person was on Wednesday killed and unknown number of livestock stolen after suspected bandits raided Baragoi town in Samburu County.
- A Second Year student at Kirinyaga University in company of two other learners was on Wednesday evening stabbed to death by suspected thugs who robbed them of their phones near Thiba River a few metres away from the campus.
