


WEEKLY CRIME REPORT

INTRODUCTION

The brutal murder of a sixthyear medical student at the Moi University has raised concerns on the insecurity status of Universities in Kenya.

This latest incident falls right into the series of mysterious killings and attacks on University students reported since the start of February 2019 at Kirinyaga University, Moi University, University of Nairobi, and Jomo Kenyatta University of Agriculture and Technology.

In efforts to reassure students of their safety, various school authorities have called upon the security agencies to crackdown instances of insecurity in higher learning institutions.




HIGHLIGHTS OF THE WEEK NAIROBI


The key crime-related incidents reported in Nairobi included:

- Unknown number of families were on Thursday left homeless after their houses were razed down by a fire at Kinyago area, Nairobi County.
- Two bank tellers are accused to have on Friday stole Ksh 600,000 from Equity Bank, Githurai Branch.
- Police in Nairobi are probing an incident where a maid on Saturday kidnapped a baby from Zimmerman estate and asked a ransom fee worth Ksh 10,000.
- Authorities at Jomo Kenyatta International Airport (JKIA) on Monday seized 500 Kg of miraa that had been passed as tea.
- Dozens of people were on Tuesday left homeless, while traders are counting losses after a fire razed down shacks in Kaloleni estate behind City Stadium.
- DCI detectives based at JKIA on Wednesday confiscated narcotic drugs packaged as HIV medicines and on transit to Nigeria.


ANALYSIS OF CRIME INCIDENTS IN NAIROBI




A total of three drug trafficking crackdowns were made at JKIA by DCI detectives



ANALYSIS OF CRIME INCIDENTS IN KENYA




A total of 36 incidents were recorded in the Rest of the Country.




AN AERIAL VIEW OF SECURITY INCIDENTS IN NAIROBI & KENYA

BELOW ARE SOME OF THE KEY SECURITY INCIDENTS



- Suspected cattle thieves on Thursday night stole 14 cows from a cattle shed in Kariamu village, Nyandarua County.
- Police in Taita Taveta County are looking for a male teacher who on Thursday defiled a class six pupil at a local school in Voi.
- Two traffic police officers in Bomet County are nursing injuries after they were on Friday attacked by members of the public while cracking down vehicles in Kapkorosa area.
- Police on Friday seized 2160 stones of bhang worth Sh2.5 million from an abandoned vehicle in Salgaa on the Nakuru-Nairobi highway.
- More than 20 goats were on Saturday evening stolen by raiders at Kasses village on the West Pokot-Turkana border.
- Two people were on Saturday hacked to death and two others seriously injured when gangsters raided a bar in Runyenjes town, Embu County.

- Police officers on Sunday intercepted a lorry carrying a suspected contraband ethanol on the Namanga road, Kajiado County.
- A man from Nyandarua County on Sunday morning hanged himself after killing his wife and critically injuring his son in Mawingu village.
- A fire on Monday destroyed 17 houses and rendered 24 families homeless at Kasarani slum in Elburgon, Nakuru County.
- A man is accused to have on Monday night stabbed his wife to death after a dispute ensued between them at their house in Eldoret, Uasin Gishu County.
- A 43-year-old man on Tuesday committed suicide after having a fall-out with his wife at Thumaita village in Kirinyaga County.
- Angry residents on Tuesday set on fire three houses in Marangetit village in Bomet County belonging to suspected

- night runners after they failed to get them.
- A huge fire on Wednesday broke out at Malindi Causarina along the Kilifi Baharani road in Malindi, Kilifi County.
- Four gangsters on Wednesday raided a shop in Likoni and made away with Ksh500,000.
