Some of the key mapped areas include Mombasa, Naivasha, Nanyuki and Maasai Mara game reserve.





HIGHLIGHTS OF THE WEEK NAIROBI

The key crime-related incidents reported in Nairobi included:


- Thirty-three Nigerians were on Thursday morning arrested from an apartment in Kasarani for being in the Country illegally.
- A gas burst on Friday afternoon razed down a two bedroom house in an Eastleigh based apartment.
- More than 100 people were on Saturday left homeless after an inferno razed down 50 houses in Dallas in Nairobi's Mukuru Kaiyaba slums.
- A private security guard was on Monday caught on camera assaulting an unidentified woman at Lobelia Court in Kilimani
- Police on Monday arrested six suspects and seized unspecified amount of fake gold in Kilimani.
- Police officers on patrol in Mlango Kubwa areas of Nairobi County on Tuesday morning managed to rescue three victims of armed robbery.
- Detectives from the Directorate of Criminal Investigation department on Tuesday arrested eight suspects with a cache of fake foreign cash and 100Kg of gold nuggets following a raid on Kiboko-Mukoma road in Nairobi County.






AN AERIAL VIEW OF SECURITY INCIDENTS IN NAIROBI & KENYA

BELOW ARE SOME OF THE KEY SECURITY INCIDENTS




- Two armed robbers were on Thursday lynched by angry residents of Nchiru in Meru County.
- A 30-year-old woman was on Thursday night stabbed 17 times by her husband after they quarrelled at their home in Karatina, Nyeri County.
- Three children on Friday died after a 13-room rental house caught fire at Mwembe Ngoma in Mombasa County.
- Suspected gunmen on Friday shot dead a police officer and kidnapped two Cuban doctors in Mandera County.
- A sixth year medical student of Kenyatta University is alleged to have on Saturday committed suicide under unclear circumstances at the institution compound.
- Two groups on Saturday clashed over ownership of a prime piece of land in Taita village, Taita Taveta County.
- A Pwani University student was on Sunday stabbed

- several times by her estranged boyfriend at her house in Mkwajuni village, Kilifi County,
- Irate members of the public on Sunday morning lynched a man and set on fire his house after the body of a missing boy was found in his compound at Kinamba estate, Nakuru County.
- A 24-year-old woman resident of Nyaribo village in Nyeri County was on Monday found dead after reportedly being stabbed to death by her estranged husband.
- Police in Taita Taveta County are investigating the cause of a fire that on Monday razed a store and staff houses at Wundayi Prisons.
- Three suspected robbers were on Tuesday night lynched by a mob in Matungulu, Machakos County.
- Two suspected drug traffickers were on Tuesday arrested following a raid by DCI detectives in Mombasa County.

A landlady and her husband on Wednesday survived lynching in Bungoma County after the body of a middle-aged man was found inside their house in Mpeli village.

SCENE OF INCIDENTS ANALYSIS IN RELATION TO THE DAYS OF THE WEEK







Security awareness during this festive season ought to be everyone's responsibility. The existing statistics show that criminal activities tend to increase during the holiday season. It is, therefore, advisable to be vigilant and careful with your family and belongings. Below are some of the tips for safety and security during this festive period:

■ Ensure Doors and Windows are locked. The vulnerability of homes to burglars tends to be high during this season especially when left unoccupied in the late afternoon and early evenings. It is advisable to ensure that all windows and doors are locked when leaving the house unattended.

- Illuminate the Environment Burglars work best in the dark, and therefore an automated outside light could act as a good deterrent within the residential area. Leave lights on in two or more rooms to show people that you are home
- Keep things out of sight Items such as car and house keys need to be kept hidden if living in estates where apartments are not fenced. Do not leave such keys under an outside plant pot or a doormat. Also, make sure house shopping is kept out of sight to ensure the contents of the house are not being advertised unintentionally.
- Run a check on your Security Systems
 It could be of great importance to run a check
 and ensure that installed security systems work
 properly before leaving for holiday. Advise
 your security company if you are going away
 and ensure that you provide all the necessary
 information in case of an emergency.
