



HIGHLIGHTS OF THE WEEK NAIROBI

The key crime-related incidents reported in Nairobi included:

- A 29-year-old suspect who defiled a 16-year-old form two student in a school within Nairobi was on Tuesday evening arrested with DCI detectives based in Kilimani.
- Two people were on Wednesday arrested at Kariobangi South in Nairobi County while repackaging several bags of assorted expired rice into bags of foreign brands with extended expiry dates.
- Three taxi drivers on Thursday allegedly stole Bibles worth Ksh 900,000 from Bible Translation and Literacy Centre in Upper Hill, Nairobi County, after issuing fake bank cheques.
- Business was on Friday closed in Kiamaiko area of Nairobi County as police engaged two religious groups fighting over the right to conduct worship in the area.
- Police on Saturday arrested six notorious criminals in Kilimani in connection with violent robbery incidents within Nairobi and its environs.
- A 37-year-old man was on Monday arrested with thousands of suspected sachets of heroin in Mathare, Nairobi County.





Educational Institutes recorded two significant cases of fire and suicide


AN AERIAL VIEW OF SECURITY INCIDENTS IN NAIROBI & KENYA

BELOW ARE SOME OF THE KEY SECURITY INCIDENTS




- A woman is fighting for her life after she was on Tuesday stabbed several times by her workmate on their way home in Laikipia County.
- Two brothers were on Tuesday evening arrested for allegedly defiling a Form Two student in their rental house at Pala trading centre, Homa Bay County.
- Robbers armed with two pistols on Wednesday night raided a retail shop at the Kitui bus terminus. The gang made away with Ksh 185,000 in cash, airtime worth Ksh 8,000 and later shot dead a taxi driver who attempted to intercept them.
- An Israeli man was on Wednesday morning killed when robbers broke into his house in Spring Valley Estate in Trans Nzoia County
- A disabled woman was on Thursday morning found defiled and murdered in her bed at Kalama location in Machakos County.

- 11 cows were on Thursday night stolen from an elderly farmer from Upper Gilgil in Tumaini, Nyandarua County.
- Two suspected juvenile criminal gang members were on Friday lynched by a mob in Likoni, Mombasa County.
- A 13-year-old school boy was on Friday allegedly murdered and his body dumped into a sugarcane plantation at Aenyo village in Uriri, Migori County.
- A fire on Saturday destroyed property worth more than Ksh 1.8 million after it gutted business premises at Ndhiwa market, Homa Bay County.
- Police on Saturday confiscated bhang worth Ksh 4.2 million after a dramatic car chase in Londiani, Kericho County.
- Three people were on Sunday left with bullet wounds and 300 goats stolen after suspected Pokot bandits raided Nawoiyeregaiin village in Turkana County.

- A student was on Sunday found dead in a dormitory at Bishop Gatimu Ngandu Girls in Nyeri County in a suspected suicide case.
- A 57-year-old man is alleged to have on Monday hanged himself in his father's house at Nthangathi village in Makueni County following a disagreement with his wife.
- A fire on Monday morning gutted down a dormitory at Tengecha Boys High School in Kericho County.
