

INTRODUCTION

The weekend of Easter saw a string of robberies reported in Nairobi and Rest of the Country. Of particular concern on this period was the thefts of four automated teller machines belonging to Barclays Bank of Kenya.

Preliminary Police reports show that the tactical thieves stole over 11 million after tampering with CCTV cameras using petroleum jelly on the targeted ATMs in four different locations- Buruburu, South B, Nairobi CBD, and Kenyatta Hospital.

Other the above, the onset of heavy downpours will see criminals take advantage of the situation to hijack motorists, rob passengers, homes and business premises. The public is advised to be vigilant and report any suspicious individuals or activities to the immediate security agencies.

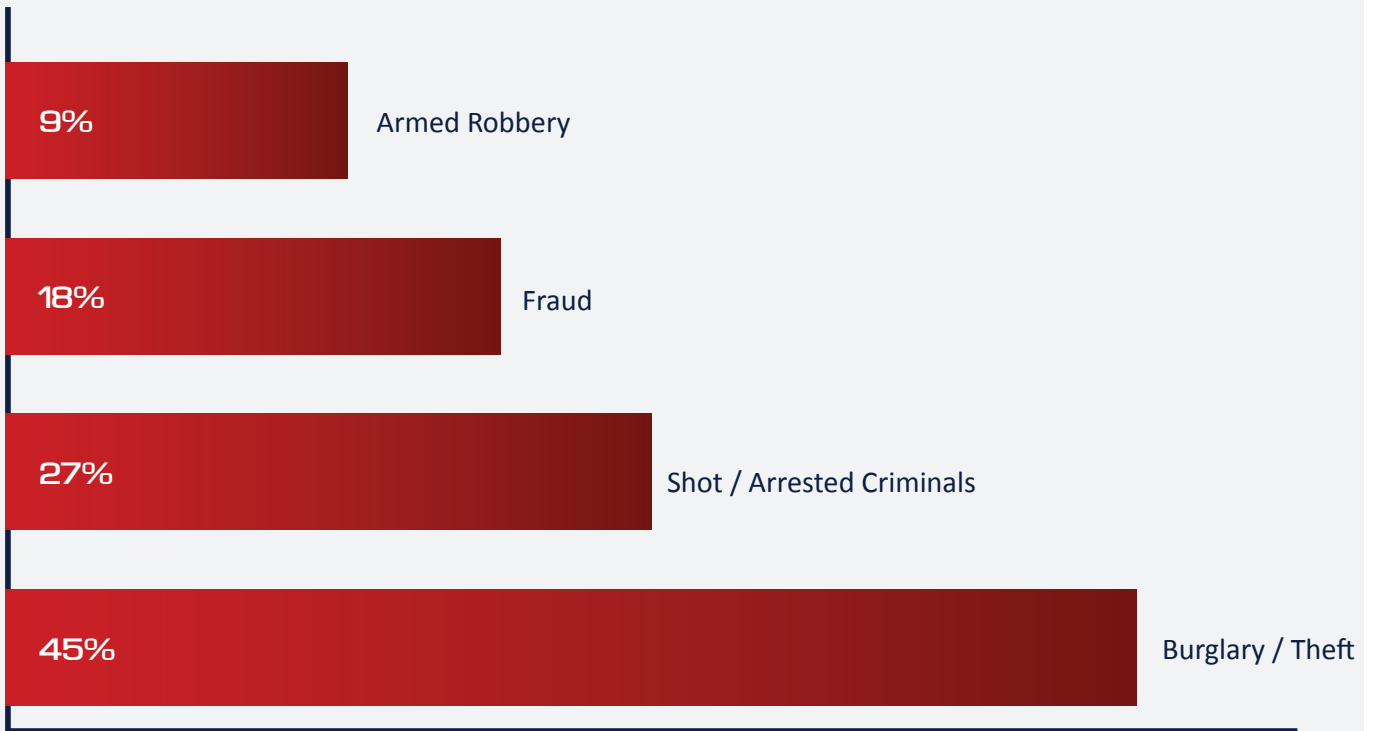
NAIROBI

The key crime-related incidents reported in Nairobi included:

- Police officers on patrol in Mlango Kubwa areas of Nairobi County on Tuesday morning managed to rescue three victims of armed robbery.
- Detectives from the Directorate of Criminal Investigation department on Tuesday arrested eight suspects with a cache of fake foreign cash and 100Kg of gold nuggets following a raid on Kiboko-Mukoma road in Nairobi County.
- Suspected burglars on Thursday night broke into a house on the first parklands avenue and made away with valuables.
- Flying squad officers on Friday arrested one suspect at his residence in Umoja area and confiscated two motor vehicles believed to had been stolen.
- Robbers over the weekend stole over Sh11 million from four ATMs belonging to Barclays Bank in Buruburu, South B, Nairobi CBD, and Kenyatta National Hospital.
- Fake Samsung phones and accessories worth over Sh10 million were on Saturday seized by anti-counterfeit officers following a raid on several electronics outlets along Mfangano street.

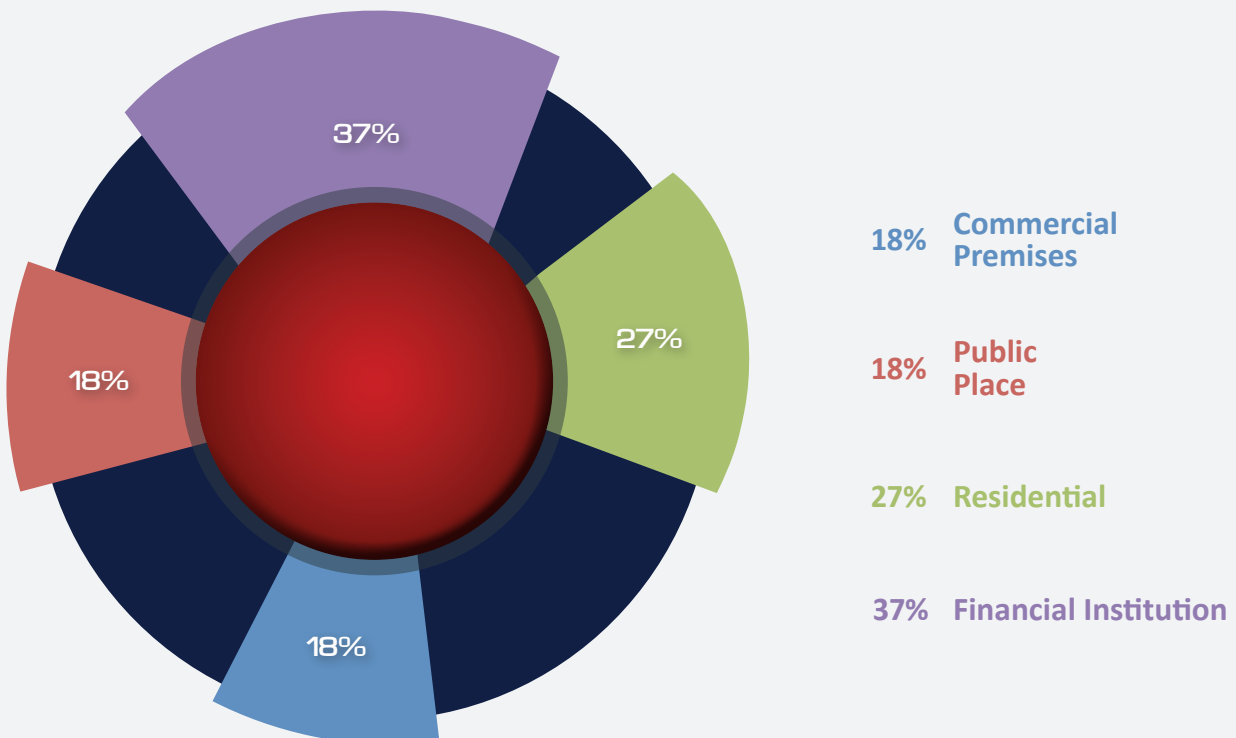

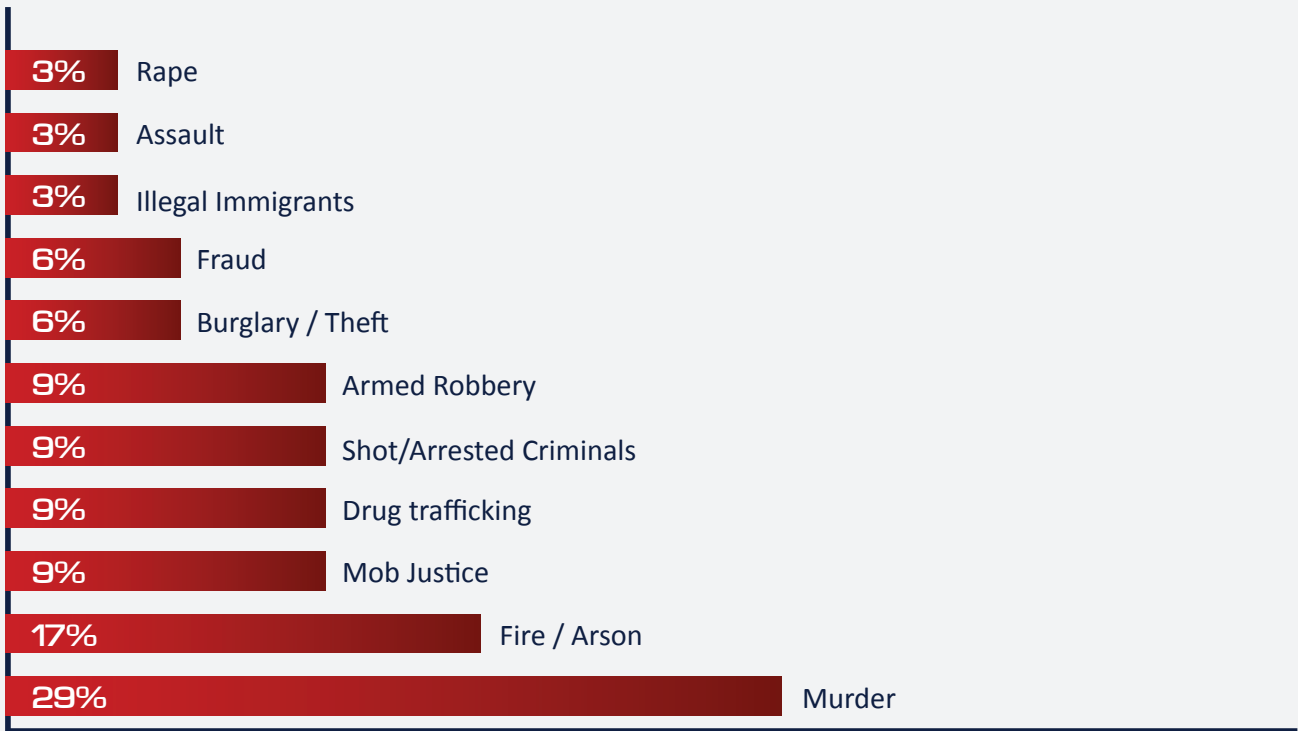
SCENE OF INCIDENTS ANALYSIS IN RELATION TO INCIDENTS



Unlike the previous weeks, this reporting week saw a notable target on Financial Institutions

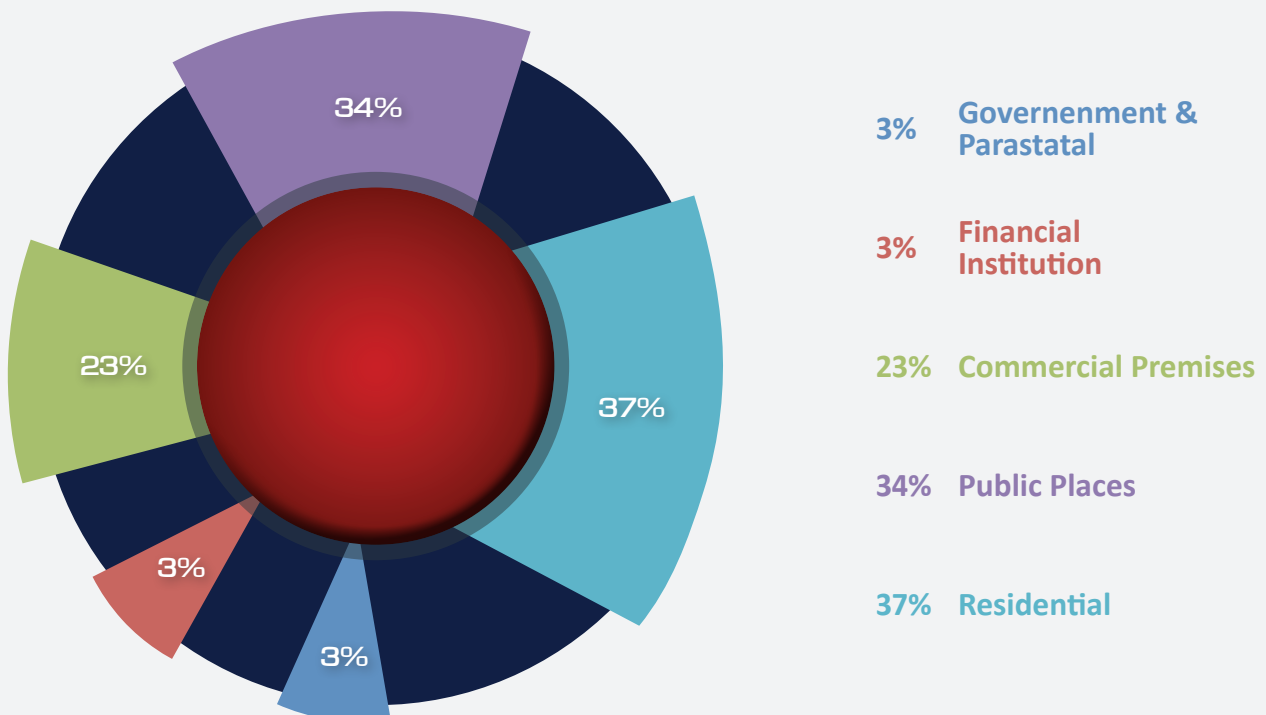

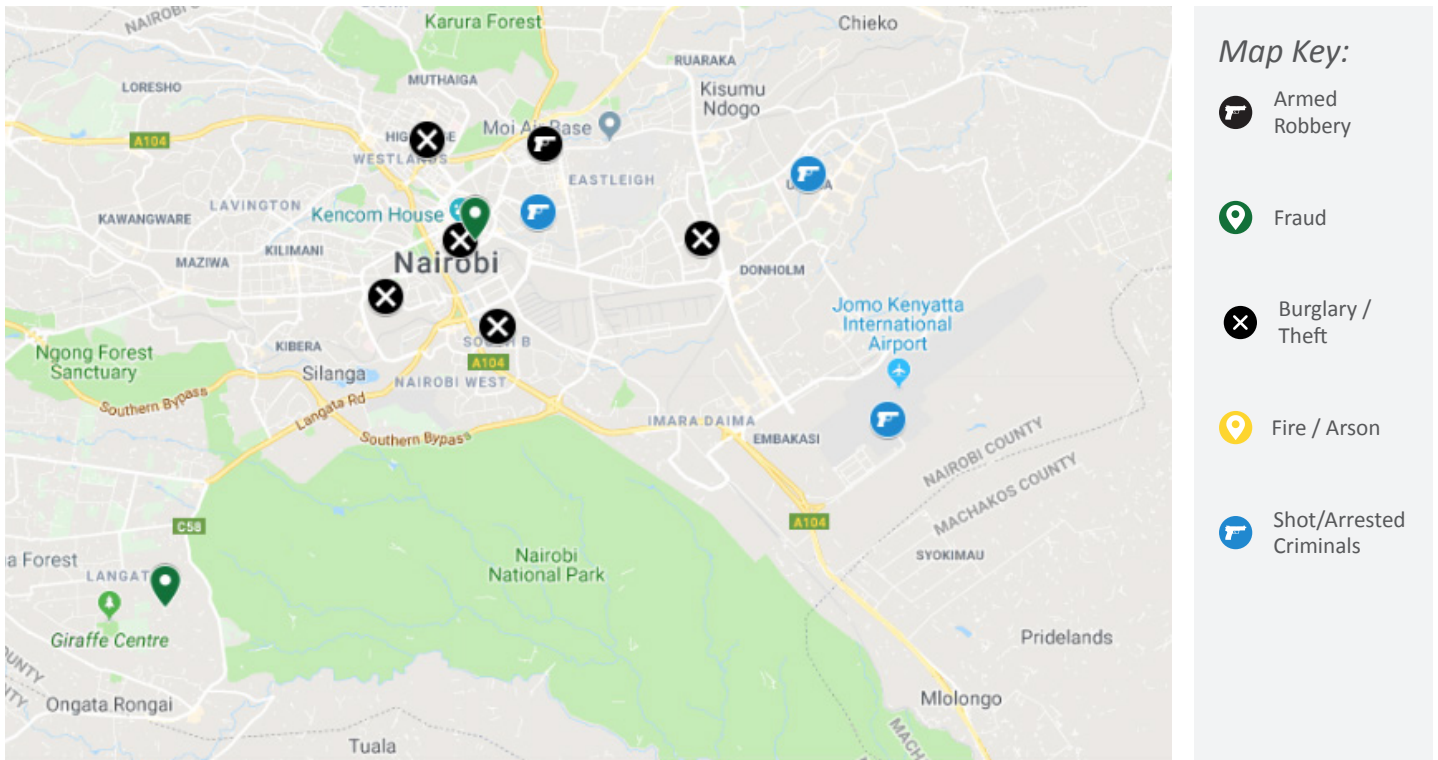
SCENE OF INCIDENTS ANALYSIS IN RELATION TO INCIDENTS



There was a slight increase of the overall incidences reported in Rest of the Country

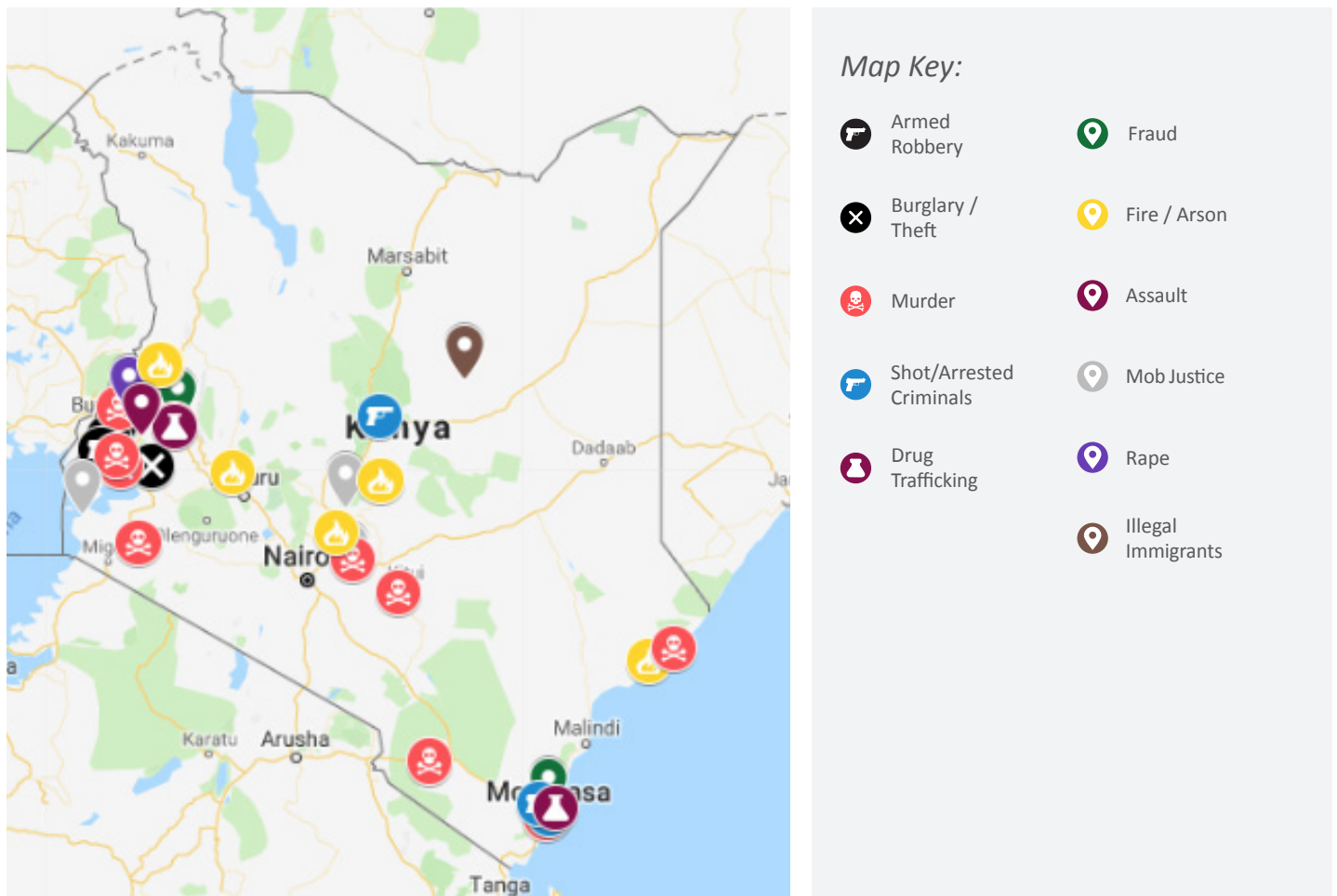
AN AERIAL VIEW OF SECURITY INCIDENTS IN NAIROBI & KENYA

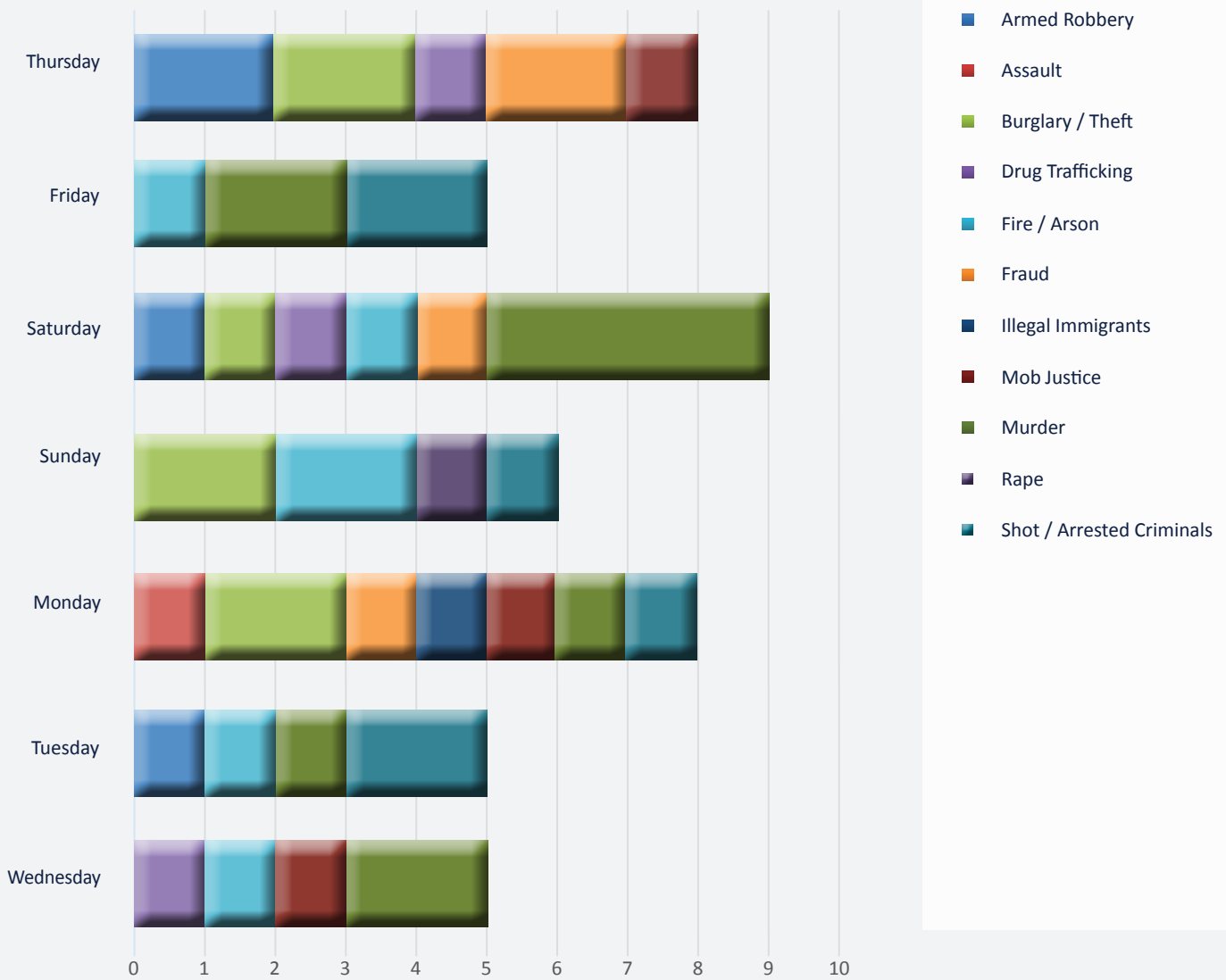

BELOW ARE SOME OF THE KEY SECURITY INCIDENTS



- Three suspected robbers were on Tuesday night lynched by a mob in Matungulu, Machakos County.
- Two suspected drug traffickers were on Tuesday arrested following a raid by DCI detectives in Mombasa County.
- A landlady and her husband on Wednesday survived lynching in Bungoma County after the body of a middle-aged man was found inside their house in Mpele village.
- A 51-year-old man was on Wednesday night burnt beyond recognition in a house in Kapenguria town in a suspected arson attack.
- Police have launched a manhunt for suspects behind the Thursday killing of two night guards at Ywaya market in Ugunja, Siaya County.
- A senior police officer on Thursday evening killed himself after shooting dead his girlfriend and a bar attendant at Lovely Bar in Mtongwe, Mombasa County.
- Police in Webuye have arrested a 48-year-old man suspected to have defiled his 95-year-old neighbour in Namawanga village, Bungoma County.
- One person died and several others injured after petrol-vendor kiosks caught fire on Friday at Mokowe Jetty in Lamu County.
- A 47-year-old woman on Saturday allegedly killed and burnt her husband's body in Matunda village, Murang'a County.
- A court clerk was on Saturday burned to death by villagers in Kirinyaga County after he refused to bury his dead son on a family land.
- Police on Sunday gunned down three notorious criminals following a botched robbery attempt in Rabai, Kilifi County.
- Armed gangsters on Sunday killed a night guard when they raided the home of a businessman in Ngurui village, Kirinyaga County.
- Police on Monday seized 1705 rolls of bhang from a store in Shanzu, Mombasa County.
- Two suspected robbers were on Monday afternoon lynched by angry residents at Sindo market in Suba South, Homa Bay County.

SAFETY SECURITY TIPS AGAINST CARJACKING



The rainy season often see some motorists fall victim to carjacking. - Have your key ready but not visible. Unlock your car when you are close to it. Don't talk on your cell phone as you walk.
- Check the back seat before getting into your car.
- A well-maintained car is less likely to break down and leave you vulnerable.
- Plan your route and let someone know what your route is and when to expect you at your destination.
- Always check the rear view mirror to see if you are being followed.
- Put all valuables out of sight. Do not travel with huge amounts of money while on board.
- If you suspect you are being followed, drive to a nearest police station or a busy public area.
- Change your routes and your schedule if possible on a regular basis.
- Make arriving at your destination safer by calling ahead and asking someone to open and close the gate for you.
