

INTRODUCTION

As schools reopened for the second term, the Ministry of Education through its Cabinet Secretary Professor George Magoha cautioned students against engaging in the second term curse of school unrests and arsons.

Parents and teachers were also called upon to be vigilant to mitigate any case of school unrest, unlike the previous three years where an estimated 694 cases were reported in secondary schools across the Country.

- Police officers dressed as “women in religious garb from a night service” on Tuesday morning killed two gangsters who had been robbing pedestrians of valuables in Dandora.
- A drug-dealing suspect was on Friday afternoon arrested with bhang worth Sh15 million following a police raid at his house in Githurai 44, Nairobi.
- Two Nairobi Members of County Assembly were on Friday arrested by EACC officials for trying to extort a businessman Sh500,000 at Bellevue, Nairobi.
- A man is alleged to have on Saturday brutally murdered his wife at Transami area in Embakasi.
- A vehicle was on Sunday morning stolen from Obama Estate off Kangundo road, Nairobi.
- Police are investigating an incident in which a torso of a woman was on Monday found wrapped in a paper and dumped in Umoja, Nairobi.
- Seven people were on Monday arrested in Industrial Area over fuel adulteration.

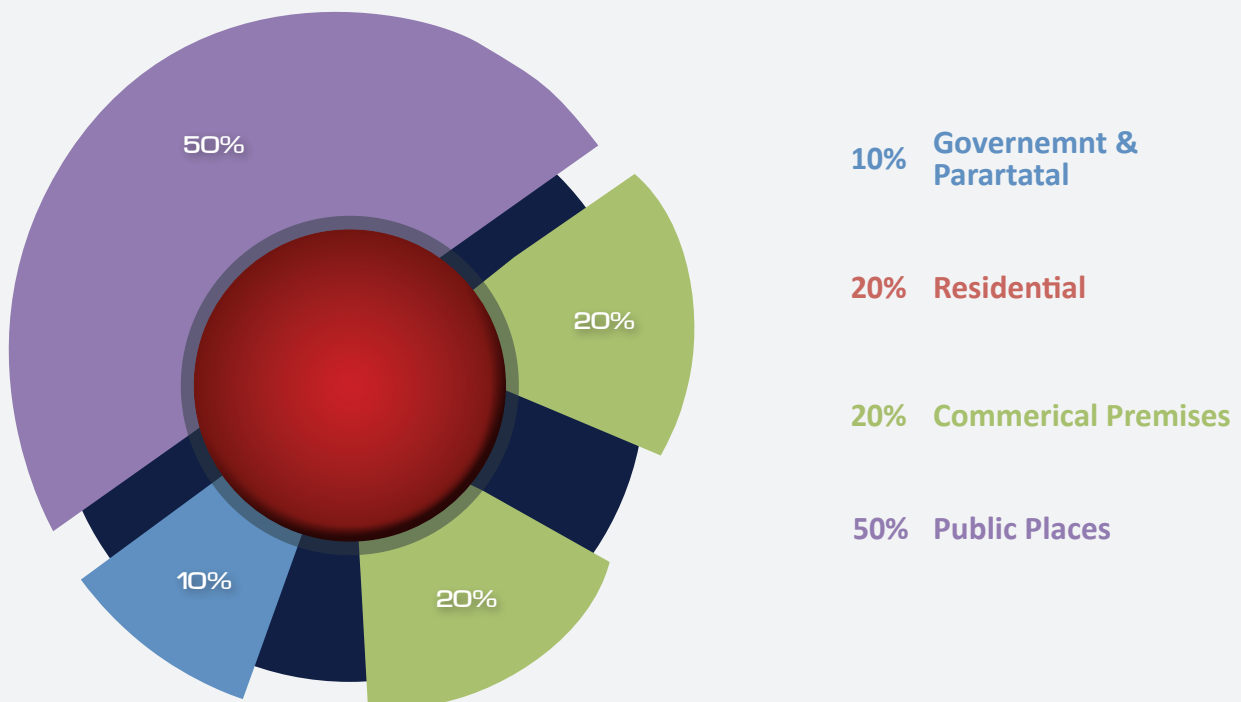

There was a slight drop of incidents reported in Public Places

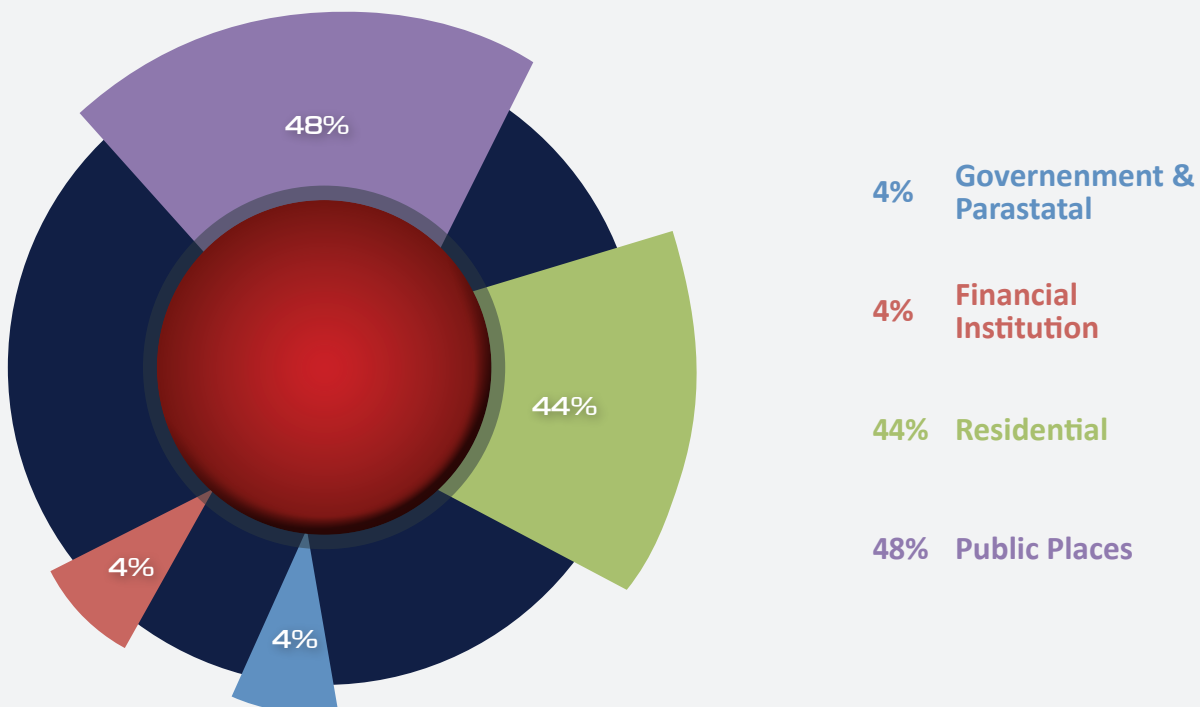

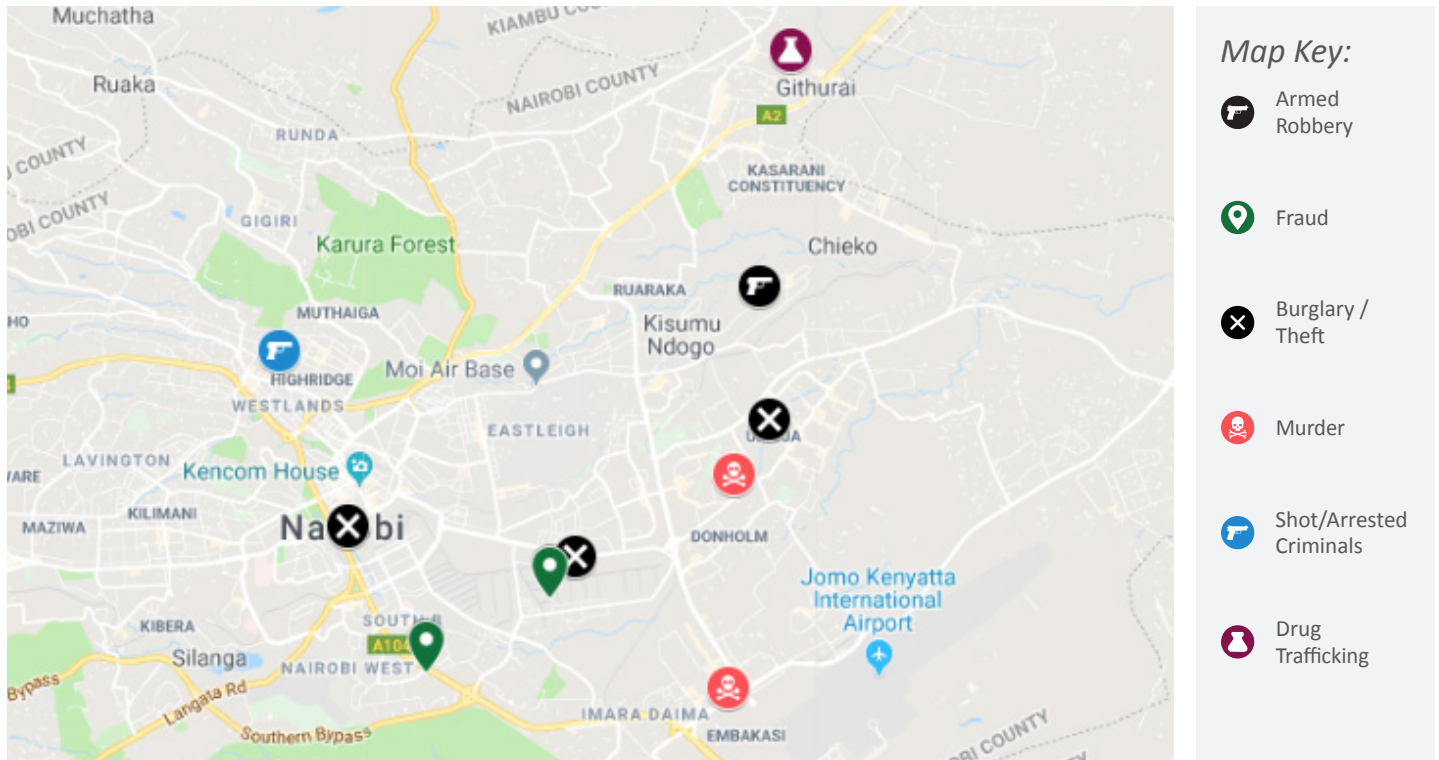
SCENE OF INCIDENTS ANALYSIS IN RELATION TO INCIDENTS



There was a slight increase of the overall incidences reported in Rest of the Country

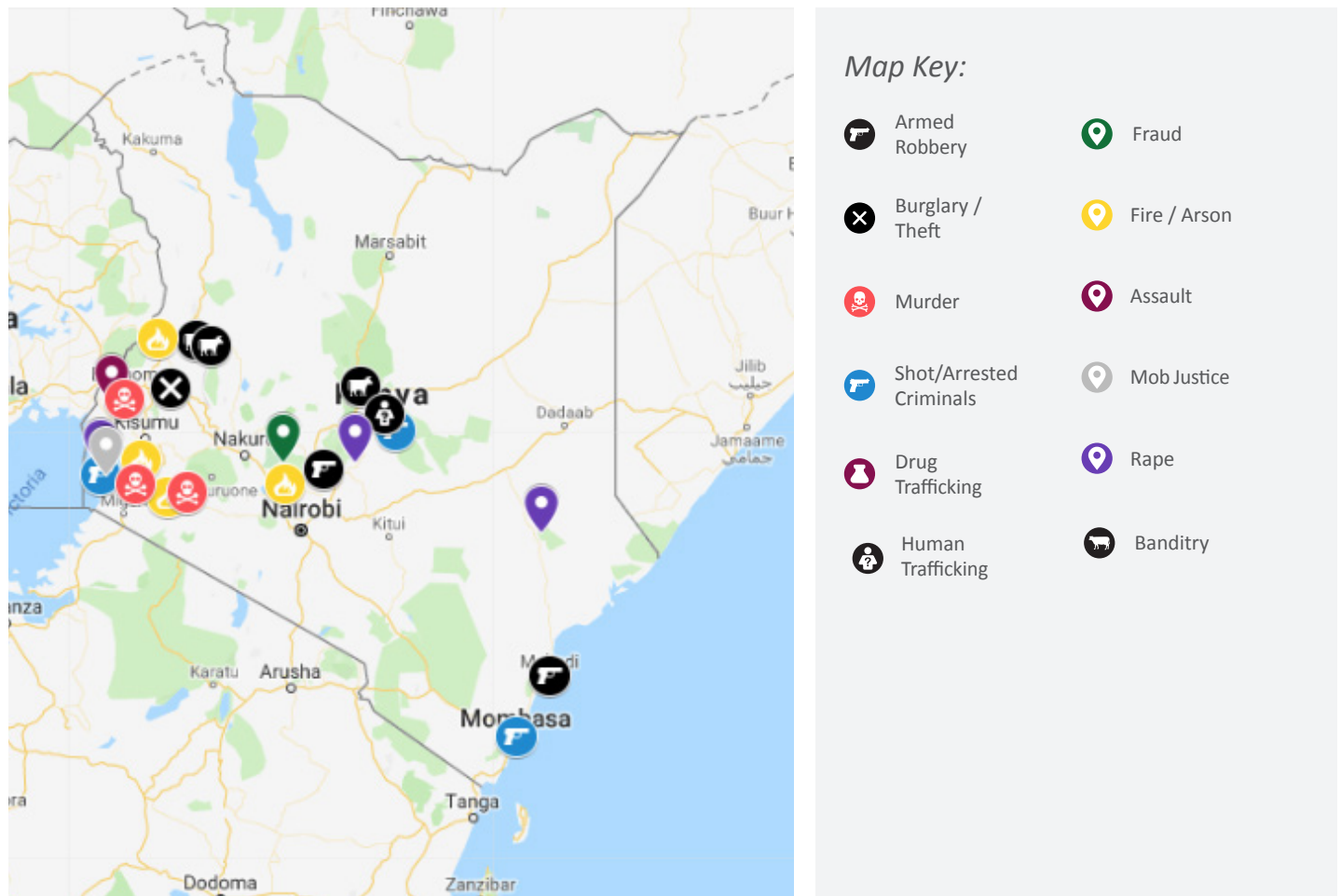
AN AERIAL VIEW OF SECURITY INCIDENTS IN NAIROBI & KENYA

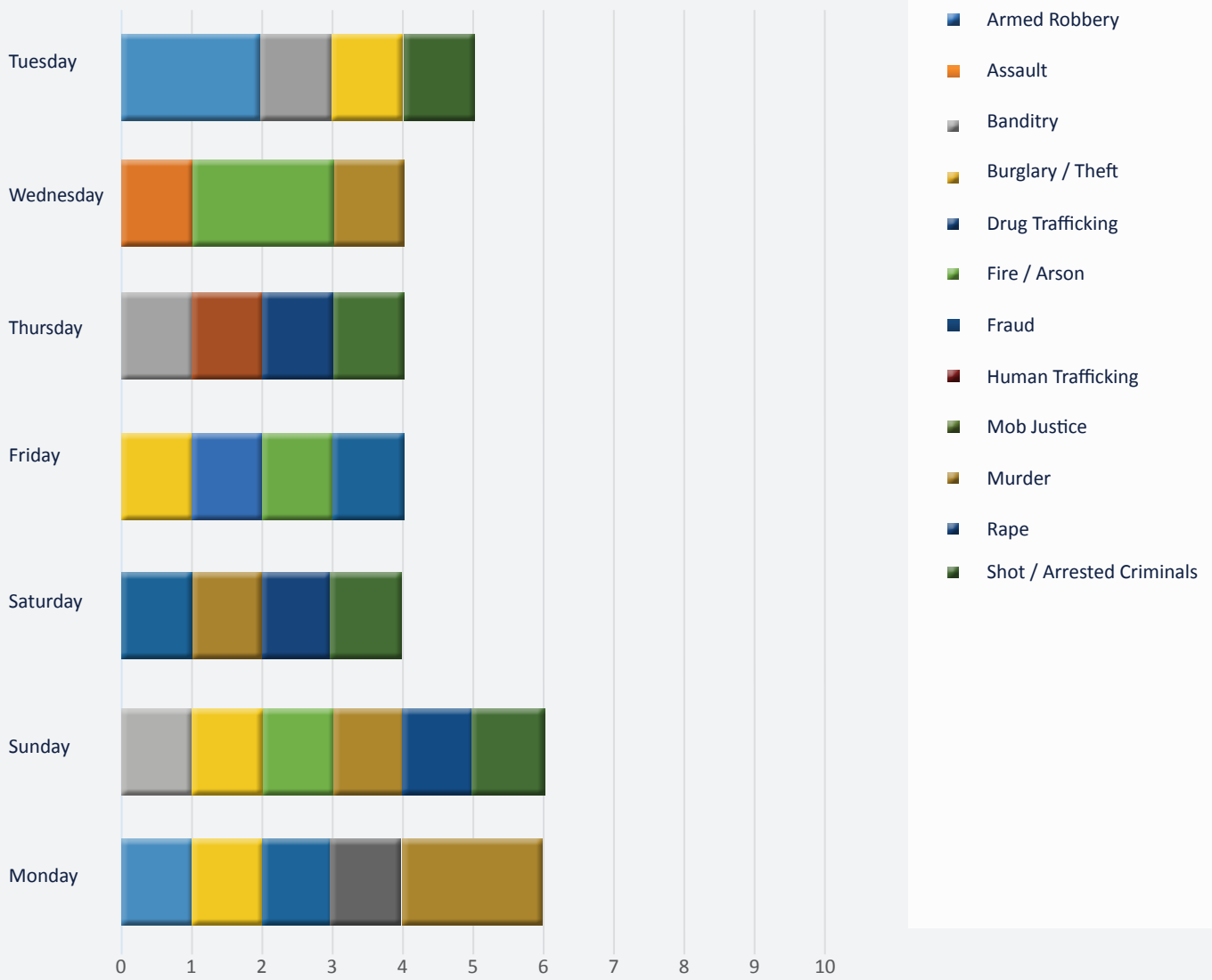

BELOW ARE SOME OF THE KEY SECURITY INCIDENTS



- Police in Tharaka Nithi County on Tuesday arrested three suspected rustlers and seized an AK-47 assault rifle and nine bullets.
- A senior police officer was on Tuesday evening shot dead by suspected bandits in Marti area of Samburu County.
- A family on Wednesday lost property worth Sh1 million after suspected arsonists torched their home at Kogana village in Karabondi location, Homa Bay County.
- A 25 year old hawker was on Wednesday died after he was allegedly beaten severely by suspected capital offenders in a cell at Bomet Police Station.
- A 30-year-old Tanzania national was on Thursday arrested in Maua town on suspicion of trafficking children with special needs and using them to beg at various strategic points.
- An 11 year old girl was on Thursday allegedly defiled by a cleric in Kathuriri village, Embu County.
- A family of 10 was on Friday left homeless after a fire razed down its house at Sariti village in Kinangop Constituency, Nyandarua County.
- Police in Homa Bay County are holding two suspects who were on Saturday arrested with military uniforms within Sindo township.
- Police in Kakamega County are investigating the death of a Form Two student who was on Sunday found murdered at Namasanda village in Matungu Constituency.
- Two suspected robbers were on Sunday morning shot dead around mwisho wa lami area of Mishomoroni, Mombasa County.
- Two suspects accused of stealing a phone were on Monday lynched by National Youth Service trainees at Lambwe camp in Suba South, Homa Bay County.
- Suspected robbers on Monday night stole over Sh1 million from Equity Bank, Karatina branch, Nyeri County.
