

WEEKLY CRIME REPORT

INTRODUCTION

Police have beefed up security in parts of North Eastern and Coastal regions following intelligence reports of a possible Al Shabaab attack during and after Idd-ul-Fitr celebrations.

The report further indicates that the militia group is regrouping in Fino area of Mandera County and will channel their attacks on the security agencies in the region.

Other than the above, increased cases of banditry in the North Rift regions have prompted the Government to carry out operations to flush out criminals and masterminds behind the vice.

The key crime-related incidents reported in Nairobi included:


- A number of stalls were on Tuesday razed down after a fire broke out at Pipeline in Nairobi County.
- DCI detectives on Tuesday rescued a 4-year-old girl who was kidnapped from Utawala, Nairobi.
- Seven Ethiopia Nationals were on Wednesday at an M-Pesa shop in Kiamaiko, Nairobi County.
- Nema and DCI officers on Wednesday arrested a major distributor of banned plastics bags on the Temple Road, Nairobi.
- Property worth more than Ksh 5 million was on Thursday destroyed when a fire burnt a yard along Kitui Road in Nairobi's Industrial Area.
- Two thieves were on Friday evening caught stealing a laptop bag at Java Monrovia within the City Centre.
- An ice cream vendor was on Saturday arrested on suspicion of hawking drug in Nairobi's Pangani Estate. Recovered from his icebox were sachets suspected to contain cocaine, heroin, and methamphetamine.
- A fire on Monday night broke out at Malik Heights building located along Ngong Road, Nairobi County.


Unlike the previous weeks, there was a slight upsurge of incidents reported in Commercial Premises


A total of 34 incidents were recorded in the Rest of the Country




There was a slight upsurge of incidents reported in Public Places as opposed to the past three weeks.

BELOW ARE SOME OF THE KEY SECURITY INCIDENTS




- A four-man gang on Tuesday broke into a house of a magistrate and stole household goods worth thousands of shillings in Bomet County.
- Five students are accused to have on Tuesday morning burnt a dormitory at Otieno Oyoo High School in Kisumu County.
- Police in Lamu County on Wednesday evening arrested three people found trafficking bhang and heroin worth Ksh. 22,400.
- A pistol belonging to Bungoma Central Police Commander was on Wednesday stolen from his house by unknown people.
- A 26-year-old refugee in Dadaab camp on Thursday committed suicide because of depression over low national exam score and few prospects in life.
- A 28-year-old woman from Rangwe sub-county was on Thursday arrested after being accused of stealing a six-

month-old baby from Ngegu village in Homa Bay County.

- At least 22 cows were on Friday reported stolen in Kabiego location along the border of Elgeyo Marakwet and West Pokot Counties.
- A nine-year-old boy was on Saturday kidnapped and later murdered in Shitungu village, Kakamega County.
- A 25-year-old man is alleged to have on Saturday committed suicide in Kamakori village in Homa Bay County.
- Students of St Puis Uriri Boys High School in Migori County on Sunday burnt down their dormitory after they were denied a chance to mingle with secondary school girls.
- A man was in Sunday violently robbed of his mobile phone and wallet along Simu ya Upepo road in Mombasa County.
- A man is suspected to have on Monday killed a woman at her house in Asenwet, Kericho County.

 At least one National Police Reservist was on Monday night killed and another injured in a clash between Kenyan Security Agencies and Al Shabaab militants in Dawaduba area of Fino, Mandera County.
