

INTRODUCTION

The Kenyan Government through the National Police Service has rolled out a plan to build at least one police station in every ward in the country, a move aimed at ensuring the security and safety of her citizens.

Whereas there was a notable reduction in the number of crime-related incidents reported across the country, cases of school unrest was of concern for school heads and police.

A recently released national report by the police indicated that at least three schools are hit by cases of student unrest every day. A worrying trend that prompted police to launch investigations behind the causes of school fires as a majority of school administrators suspected foul play.




HIGHLIGHTS OF THE WEEK NAIROBI


The key crime-related incidents reported in Nairobi included:

- A childless nurse was on Wednesday arrested for allegedly attempting to steal her friend's newborn baby at Pumwani Maternity Hospital, Nairobi.
- Suspected armed thugs on Thursday night raided an office in Lavington and made away with electronics.
- DCI detectives on Thursday night seized fake US dollars and arrested three suspects from a house in Fedha Estate following a tip-off.
- A security officer attached to Meru County Assembly speaker was on Sunday morning shot dead at Kamiti Corner in Nairobi.
- DCI detectives on Saturday raided an illegal alcohol manufacturing plant and arrested four people in Kayole, Nairobi.
- A foreign businessman was on Monday evening accosted at gunpoint on the Prof. Wangari Maathi Road (formerly Forest Road), Nairobi.





Fraudulent activities seemed to have slightly increased with two key cases reported in Nairobi




AN AERIAL VIEW OF SECURITY INCIDENTS IN NAIROBI & KENYA


BELOW ARE SOME OF THE KEY SECURITY INCIDENTS



- Suspected armed gangsters on Tuesday night attacked patrons in a local pub in Kisekini area of Machakos County.
- An officer was on Tuesday shot after a police vehicle was attacked by suspected bandits at Kapedo bridge in Turkana County.
- Property worth thousands of shillings was on Wednesday destroyed when a fire broke out at Kamuiru Boys Secondary School, Kirinyaga County.
- A couple was on Wednesday found mysteriously murdered in their house in Barkuogo village in Bar-Kowino locatioqwwn, Siaya County.
- Students of ABC Kyanda Secondary School in Mutituni, Machakos County, are counting losses after fire gutted their dormitory on Thursday morning.
- Police arrested a 24-year-old man suspected to have on Thursday killed his stepson in Naivasha, Nakuru County.

- Three people are nursing serious injuries after two communities clashed over pasture and water on Friday night at Mikululo area in Kibwezi West, Makueni County.
- A 21-year-old man is accused to have on Saturday defiled an eight-year-old girl in Migori County.
- Three police officers on Saturday escaped lynching after they were attacked by the public at Nyamware Beach in Nyando, Kisumu County.
- One person was on Sunday shot dead as protesters engaged police in running battles at Magena market, Kisii County.
- Records and gadgets valued at millions of shillings were on Monday destroyed when a fire gutted the Kitui County Finance department building.
- Police in Elburgon, Nakuru County, are holding a 34-yearold woman alleged to have on Monday stabbed her husband to death at a bar in the area.
