

# WEEKLY CRIME REPORT



The debate on whether to arm Private Security officers has been a concern for the past three years and the matter took a significant step following the gazette of new regulations that will allow them to carry guns and arrest criminals.

The said regulations that are in line with the Private Security Regulation Act 2016 will see private security officers enjoy these privileges under the guidance of the Inspector General of Police.

Most importantly, the Government through the Private Security Regulatory Authority will guide on the issuance of firearms first through the fresh registration of all private security firms in the next six months to the provision of a standard curriculum for training security officers.




## HIGHLIGHTS OF THE WEEK NAIROBI


The key crime-related incidents reported in Nairobi included:

- A 32-year-old woman is alleged to have on Tuesday killed her husband before strangling her two children and hanging herself at their house in Thome Estate, Nairobi.
- A University student is accused to have on Tuesday led a group of expelled and suspended students to extort cash from traders along Mamlaka Road, Nairobi.
- Armed thugs on Friday morning killed one worshiper and injured others following a raid at a church in Makongeni, Nairobi.
- A suspected barber is accused to have on Friday robbed a woman of Ksh. 50.00 and a mobile phone while on her way home in Uthiru, Nairobi.
- Five people were on Saturday shot and wounded by a gang of thugs who raided a premise in Ngara, Nairobi.
- A security guard is accused to have on Monday poisoned a dog and stole electronics from an apartment in Nairobi.





This reporting week noted a slight increase in robbery-related incidents.



Of particular concern, this week was the vulnerability of some religious institutions to acts of crime




## AN AERIAL VIEW OF SECURITY INCIDENTS IN NAIROBI & KENYA

## BELOW ARE SOME OF THE KEY SECURITY INCIDENTS





- A suspected robber was on Tuesday night shot dead by police near Deep Sea Resort in Kitale town of Trans Nzoia County.
- Traders suffered huge losses on Tuesday when a fire broke out at Chemaner trading centre in Bomet County.
- Two school girls were on Wednesday evening killed by unknown assailants at Keberesi village in Kisii County.
- Police are investigating an incident in which a dormitory at Shanderema Boys
   Secondary School in Kakamega County was on Wednesday set ablaze by a suspected arsonist.
- Police in Embu County on Thursday arrested three suspects who were found with fake Sh. 1000 notes at Manyatta trading centre.
- A fifth year student of Egerton University was on Thursday murdered by unknown assailants at his rental house in Njoro, Nakuru County.

- Two suspects were on Friday apprehended with four pieces of elephant tusks in Silaloni area of Kwale County.
- A 25-year-old man on Friday night went berserk and beheaded his neighbour before injuring two other people at Menet village, Bomet County.
- Crucial documents were on Saturday destroyed when the administration block at Kihoya Secondary School in Murang'a County went up in flames.
- One student was on Saturday shot dead and another was injured after they were attacked by suspected bandits at Kabaldamet border, Elgeyo Marakwet County.
- A 39-year-old man was on Sunday night hacked to death by unknown assailants and his body dumped near Kodula trading centre in Rachuonyo North, Homa Bay County.
- A suspected burglar on Sunday night allegedly broke into a church in Engineer town, Nyandarua County.

- Two people were on Monday shot dead by suspected bandits in Kainuk area of Turkana County.
- Police on Monday seized 300Kg of uninspected meat at a residential house in Nyeri County.
