INTRODUCTION

The launch of the new generation currency banknotes during the Madaraka Day celebrations was a strategic step towards the war on corruption. However, there has been a growing concern on the authenticity of new currency notes with fears of circulation of fake 1000 notes in the Kenyan market. This reporting week saw police arrest eight suspects and unveiled three syndicates behind the fake currency notes in Nairobi, Kisii, and Bungoma Counties.

It is important to mention that in the absence of a counterfeit note detector, the verification of genuine banknotes will depend on one's accuracy and attention to detail. The four key security features outlined by the Central Bank of Kenya include the Portrait Watermark, Serial Numbers, See through Feature and Security Thread.



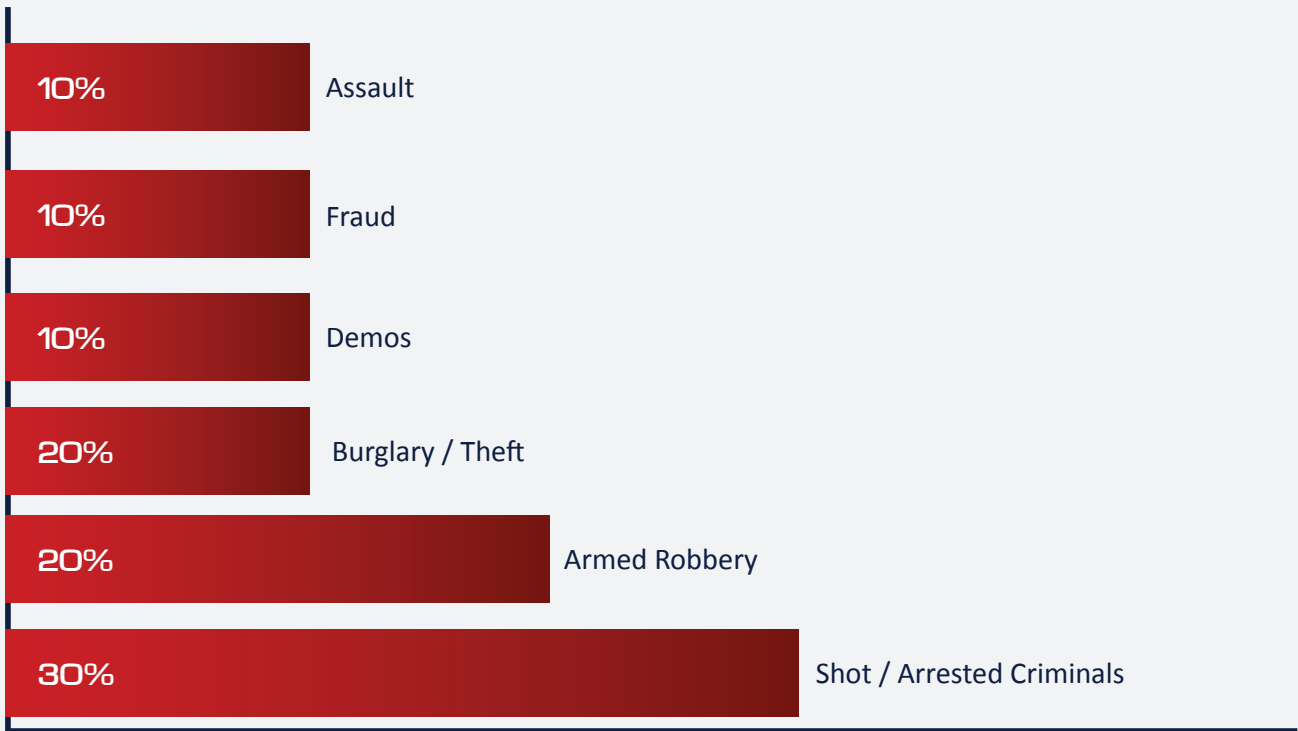
HIGHLIGHTS OF THE WEEK NAIROBI

The key crime-related incidents reported in Nairobi included:

- A rogue motorist is alleged to have on Thursday assaulted a traffic police officer along Ngong Road in Karen area
- Flying Squad detectives on Friday recovered a stolen vehicle in Dandora following a major crackdown of stolen vehicles in Nairobi
- Two female suspects were on Friday nabbed in Kasarani in possession of fake US dollars and stolen mobile phones.
- A General Service Unit (GSU) officer was in Saturday night fatally shot by unknown assailants at main entrance of Wilson Airport.
- DCI detectives on Saturday raided an illegal alcohol manufacturing plant and arrested four people in Kayole, Nairobi.
- Police in Nairobi on Monday night shot dead two suspected armed thugs after they robbed a Nigeria national along the Makueni Road in Kilimani.

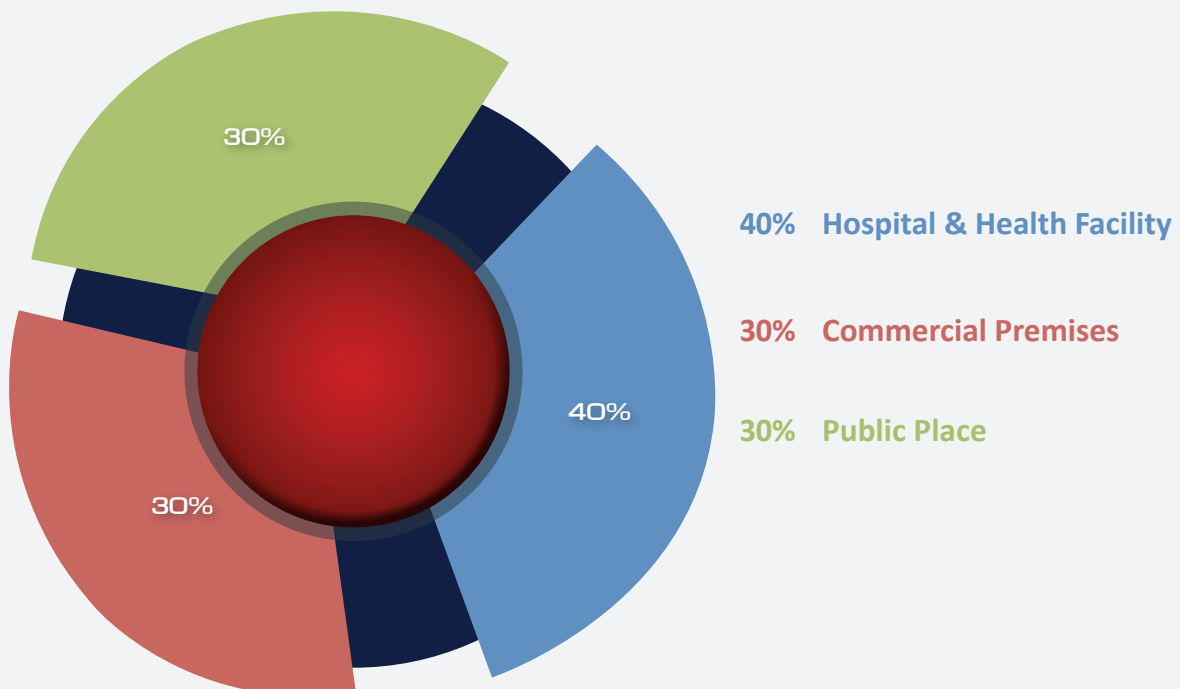

There was an overall reduction in the incidents reported in the corresponding scenes

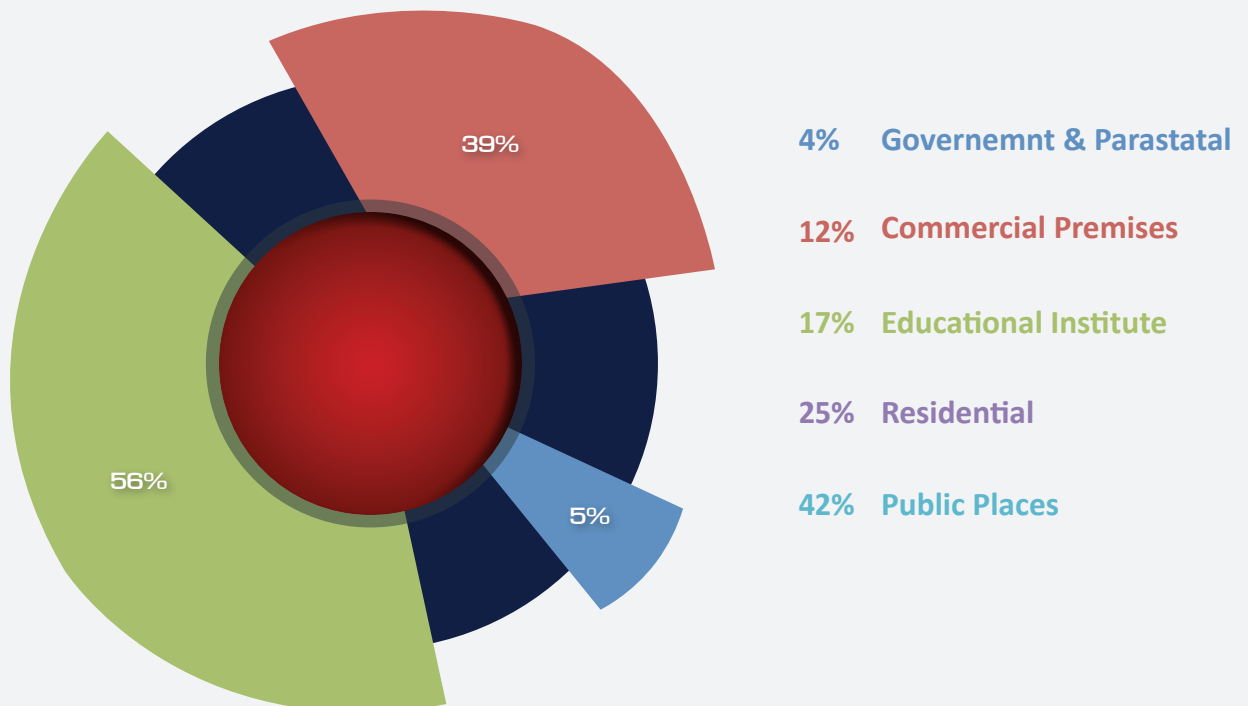

A total of 18 incidents were recorded in the Rest of the Country

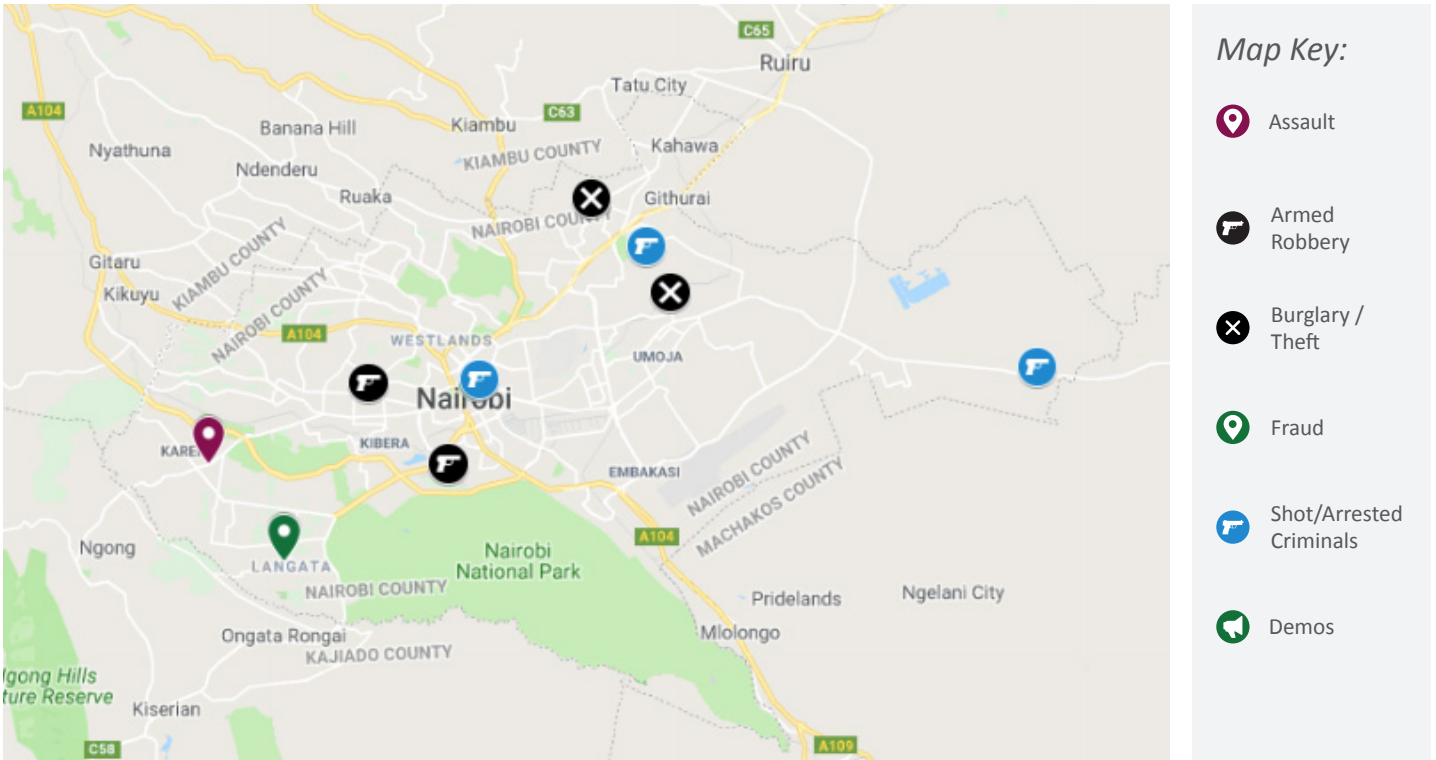
SCENE OF INCIDENTS ANALYSIS IN RELATION TO INCIDENTS



There was a slight reduction in the incidents reported in the corresponding scenes

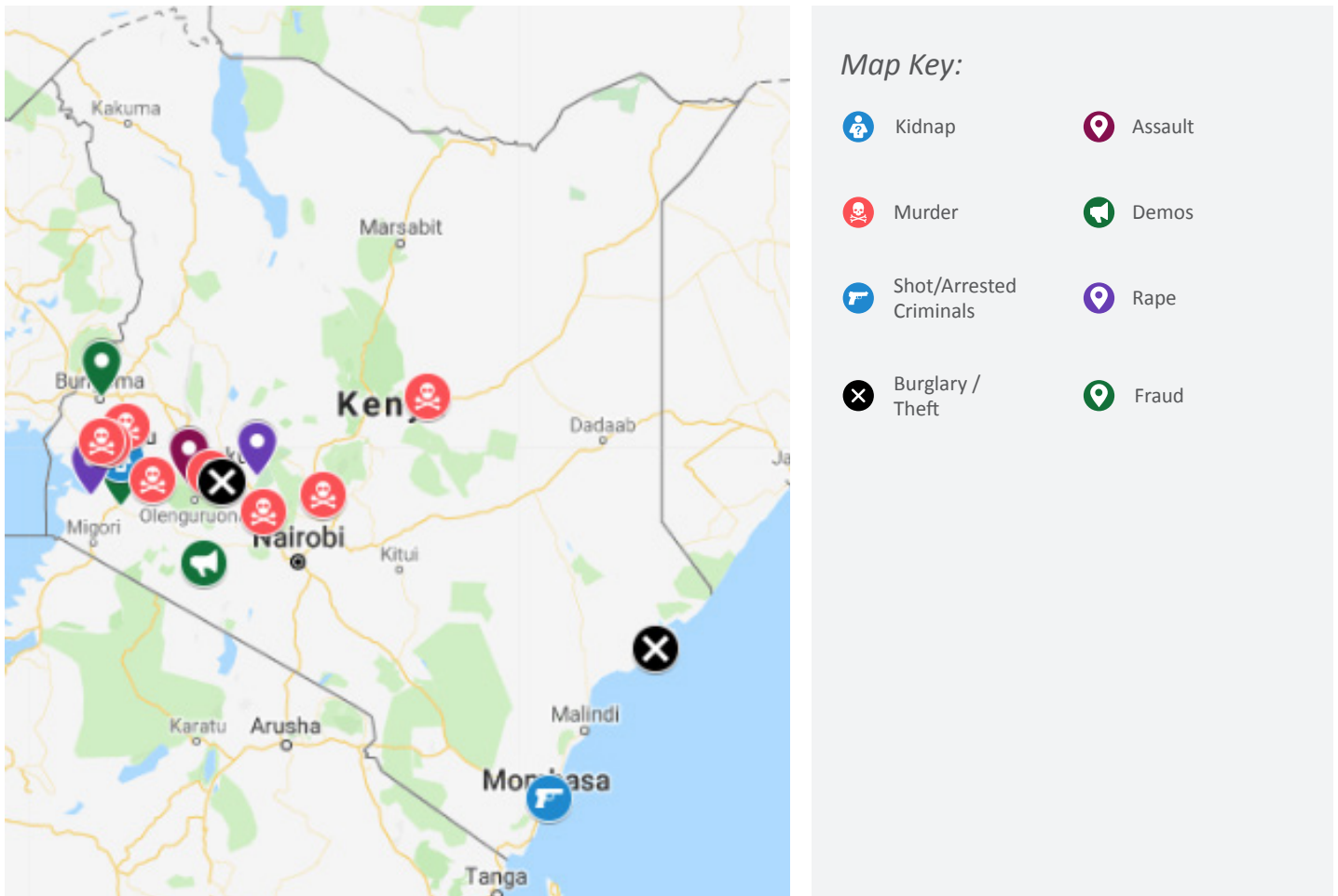
AN AERIAL VIEW OF SECURITY INCIDENTS IN NAIROBI & KENYA

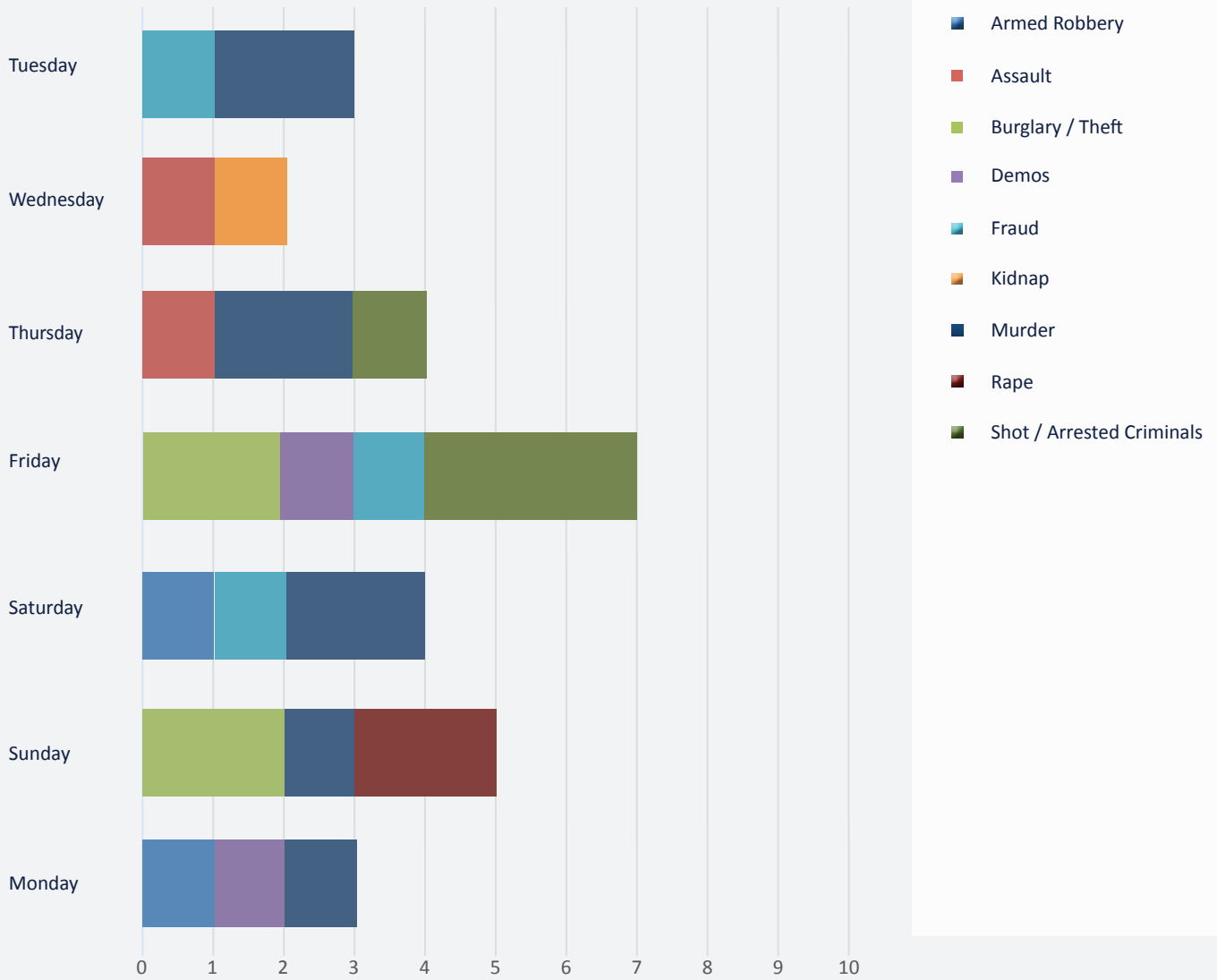

BELOW ARE SOME OF THE KEY SECURITY INCIDENTS



- A woman was on Tuesday mysteriously murdered and her body dumped in a ditch on the outskirts of Isiolo town.
- Police on Tuesday arrested two people with Sh1.6 million fake currency notes in Kisii town after a tip off.
- An irate mob on Wednesday attacked police officers and torched their vehicle at Kamwaura trading centre, Nakuru County.
- The body of a nurse was retrieved from a forest in Nandi after he was on Wednesday kidnapped from his home in Nyamasaria, Kisumu County.
- A man is alleged to have on Thursday slashed a chicken thief to death at Shinyalu area of Kakamega County.
- Police on Friday arrested two notorious criminals with suspected narcotics and Sh3 million in cash in Bamburi, Mombasa County.
- A 14-year-old girl was on Sunday morning defiled after a man broke into their house at Kagua village in Ol Kalou, Nyandarua County.
- A 30-year-old man in Emuhaya, Vihiga County is alleged to have on Monday killed his 27-year-old wife and later committed suicide.
