OVERVIEW

Our security records on the second week of August 2019 indicate that crime-related incidents had slightly reduced as compared to the past two weeks. Whereas we may attribute this noted decline to the continuous fight on crime by police, similar credit needs to be extended to the members of the public for being vigilant. Other than the above, the preparations for the upcoming 2019 National Census are topnotch with the Government set to deploy security personnel alongside officials who will conduct the exercise on the night of 24th and 25th August 2019. Given the timings of this important exercise, the public should be vigilant of criminals who might pose as Census agents.




HIGHLIGHTS OF THE WEEK NAIROBI


The key crime-related incidents reported in Nairobi included:

- Five robbery with violence suspects were on Tuesday arrested in Utawala and Thome estates following an armed robbery incident in Nairobi
- A notorious armed robber was on Thursday morning shot dead by Special Crime Police Unit at his hideout in Kariobangi South, Nairobi
- A suspected burglar was on Friday captured on CCTV stealing a backpack from a crowded restaurant in Nairobi's Central Business District
- Detectives on Saturday arrested a matatu crew in Githurai, Nairobi
 County, for killing a man after pushing him out of a moving bus
- Property of unknown value was on Sunday destroyed after a fire broke out at an apartment in Tassia Estate, Nairobi


ANALYSIS OF CRIME INCIDENTS IN NAIROBI




There was a notable reduction in the number of incidents reported in Nairobi









AN AERIAL VIEW OF SECURITY INCIDENTS IN NAIROBI & KENYA

BELOW ARE SOME OF THE KEY SECURITY INCIDENTS




- A 33-year-old teacher was on Tuesday night attacked by gangsters and her eyes gouged out while on road to see her ailing sister in Eldama Ravine, Baringo County.
- Police in Migori County on Tuesday arrested two suspects impersonating Census officials.
- A University student was on Wednesday evening found dead under unclear circumstances inside her house in Lurambi estate, Kakamega County.
- Suspected militia
 on Wednesday
 morning destroyed a
 telecommunication mast at
 Hulugho border in Garissa
 County.

- Two children aged 6 and 12 years on Thursday died after their house caught fire at Kiriari village in Embu County.
- An unidentified man at Nakoyo village in Turkana County on Friday evening set ablaze a relief food consignment shortly after it had been offloaded from a lorry.
- Detectives are holding a 21-year-old suspect who on Saturday tried to rob an M-Pesa agent at gunpoint at the town bus terminus in Nakuru County.
- A four year old girl was on Sunday evening defiled, killed, and her body dumped in a coffee farm in Kirinyaga County.

- Property of unknown value was on Sunday evening destroyed after an inferno razed down the residence of Homa Bay County Commissioner.
- Police officers in Nakuru County on Monday arrested one suspect in connection to burglary incidents in Kanyoni and Bondeni areas.
