

# WEEKLY CRIME REPORT

10<sup>th</sup> September - 16<sup>th</sup> September '19

## **OVERVIEW**

The resurgence of juvenile gangs in the Coastal region and the local bank heists were this week's key security concerns. Our security sources indicate that at least five individuals were over the weekend seriously injured in Kongowea, VOK, and Leisure areas of Kisauni Sub-County by an alleged criminal organization made up of youth.

In a well-orchestrated robbery of ten minutes, two gunmen managed to seize an estimated Sh42 million cash from a pilot at Odda airstrip in Marsabit County while in transit to a local bank branch in Moyale town. So far, two bank robberies have been reported within a week this month, a worrying trend that has prompted police investigation to recover the stolen funds.





## HIGHLIGHTS OF THE WEEK NAIROBI

The key crime-related incidents reported in Nairobi included:


- Police on Tuesday gunned down three men who were part of a 5-man gang that attempted to rob a wife of a policeman at Matopeni in Kayole, Nairobi.
- Two men were on Tuesday arrested at the Thika Road Mall in connection to stolen motor vehicles. A bunch of assorted car keys and alarms belonging to different vehicles were also recovered during the arrest.
- A suspected gangster was on Wednesday caught following a foiled robbery attempt in Nairobi's Industrial Area.
- Kenya Revenue Authority officials at the Jomo Kenyatta International Airport (JKIA) on Thursday arrested a suspect returning from a trip to China with 10 boxes of fake excise duty stamps.
- The body of a foreign businessman was on Friday found in his home in Kitisuru after he reportedly went missing.
- A suspected burglar was on Saturday lynched after he broke into a house in Mukuru Fuata Nyayo slum, Nairobi.











## AN AERIAL VIEW OF SECURITY INCIDENTS IN NAIROBI & KENYA


## BELOW ARE SOME OF THE KEY SECURITY INCIDENTS



- Police are looking for a man who on Tuesday disappeared with a seven-month-old baby girl in Kiamunyi Estate, Nakuru County.
- Two gunmen on Wednesday morning seized an estimated Sh42 million cash on transit to a local bank after a 10-minute robbery at Odda airstrip in Marsabit County.
- A police officer was on Wednesday night murdered inside her rental house at Miti Moja in Eldoret, Uasin Gishu County.
- A teacher in Isiolo County was on Thursday arrested for allegedly defiling and impregnating a grade seven pupil of Lobarishereki Primary School.
- Three men including a local church elder were on Friday arrested at Timboni in Kilifi County in connection with criminal activities in the area.
- Suspected robbers on Friday night broke into Ramba Catholic Church in Siaya County and stole mobile

- phones belonging to nuns, priests and some visitors from Uganda.
- More than 80 students of Senator Otieno Kajwang' Secondary School in Homa Bay County suffered losses after their dormitory was on Saturday night razed down by a fire.
- A boda boda operator in Voi, Taita Taveta County was on Saturday night killed and his motorbike stolen by a thug who disguised himself as a potential client.
- At least five people were on Sunday seriously injured after they were attacked by a suspected juvenile gang in Kisauni, Mombasa County.
- Three herdsmen were on Monday killed and more than 100 camels stolen by bandits who raided Garba Tula in Isiolo County.
- Two primary schools in Mosocho, Kisii County were on Monday night broken into by suspected burglars who made away with valuable electronics.
