



WEEKLY CRIME REPORT

17th September - 23rd September '19

OVERVIEW

The continuous crackdown on car theft syndicates in the Country has seen security agencies recover stolen vehicles that had their chassis numbers altered. Our security sources indicate that out of the 15 vehicles recovered, two vehicles were reported stolen from Nyali's Nippon Korea Investment Limited Yard in 2014 while the remaining 13 were stolen from a homestead in Mosoriot, Nandi County.

Other than the above, recent crime related incidents reported in four churches in Nairobi, Nakuru, Kirinyaga and Nyamira Counties respectively highlighted the need to incorporate necessities that adhere to security measures. Like any other premise, religious institutions are not exempted from acts of crime thus calling for services such as manned guarding, CCTV solutions, alarm response services, fire detections services and Cash-In-Transit services.



HIGHLIGHTS OF THE WEEK NAIROBI

The key crime-related incidents reported in Nairobi included:

- Three suspects found repackaging expired rice were on Thursday arrested by a multi-agency team and over 1500 bags of assorted rice brands confiscated in Kamukunji, Nairobi.
- A money dealer was on Saturday allegedly robbed of 150,000 US dollars in Upper Hill, Nairobi.
- A middle aged woman was arrested after she was on Saturday captured by CCTV cameras stealing bags and phones during a wedding ceremony at All Saints Cathedral, Nairobi.
- A cook is on the run since Sunday after he stabbed a security guard to death at a restaurant along Tom Mboya Street in Nairobi.
- A 73-year-old woman and her daughter were on Monday found strangled to death at their house in South B Estate, Nairobi.
- At least 45 families in Mandazi Road area in Nairobi's Mukuru Kayaba slum on Monday night slept in the cold after a fire destroyed their homes.

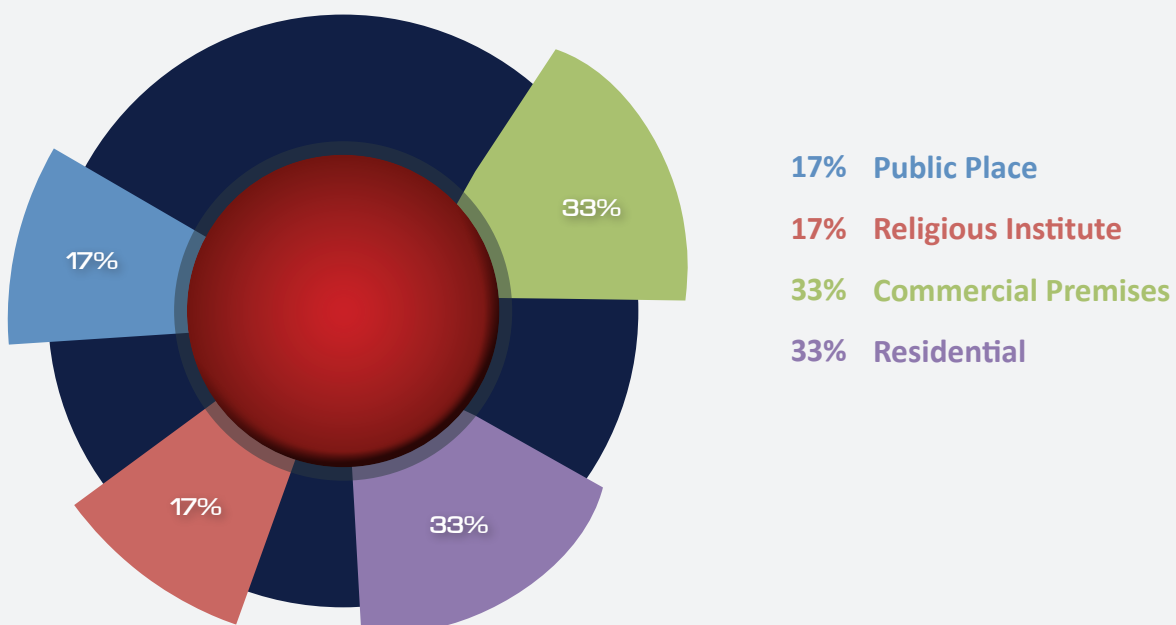

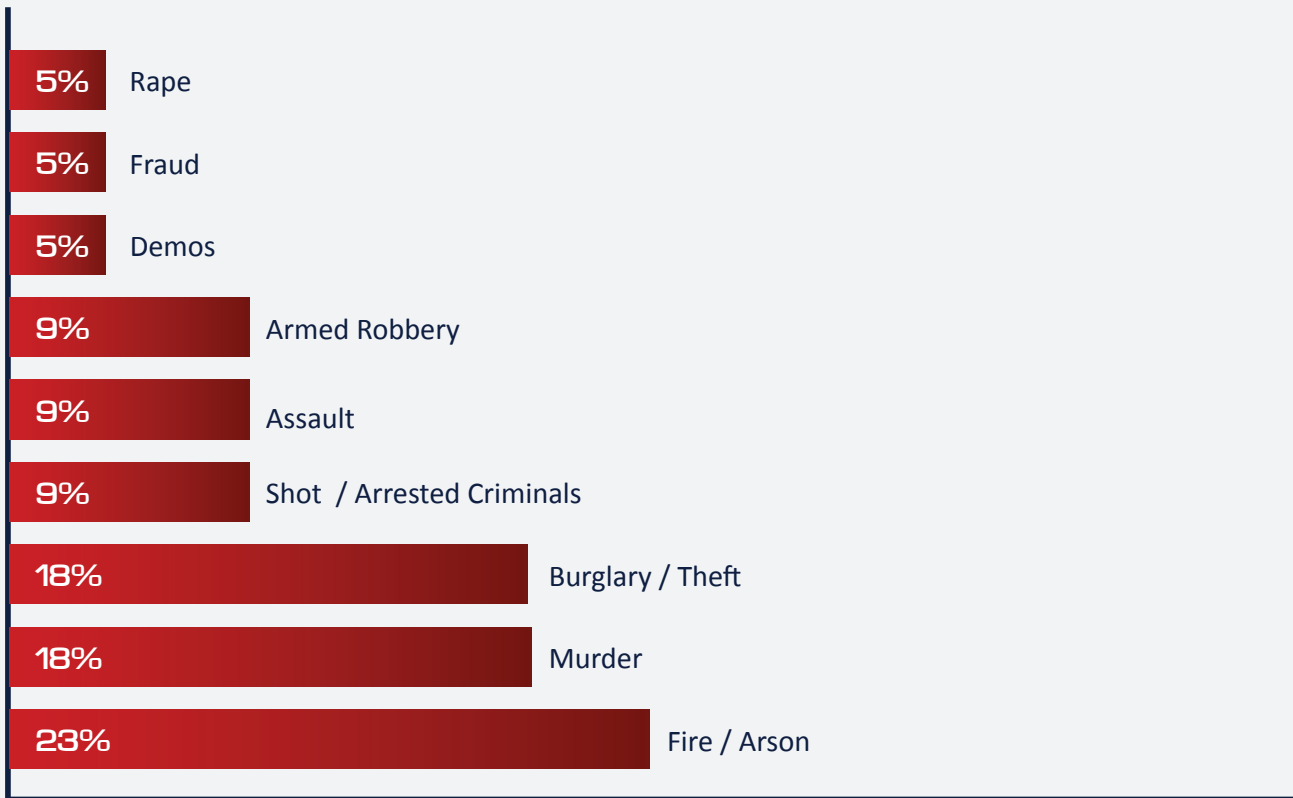


Going by statistics, houses located in informal settlements are always prone to cases of fire.

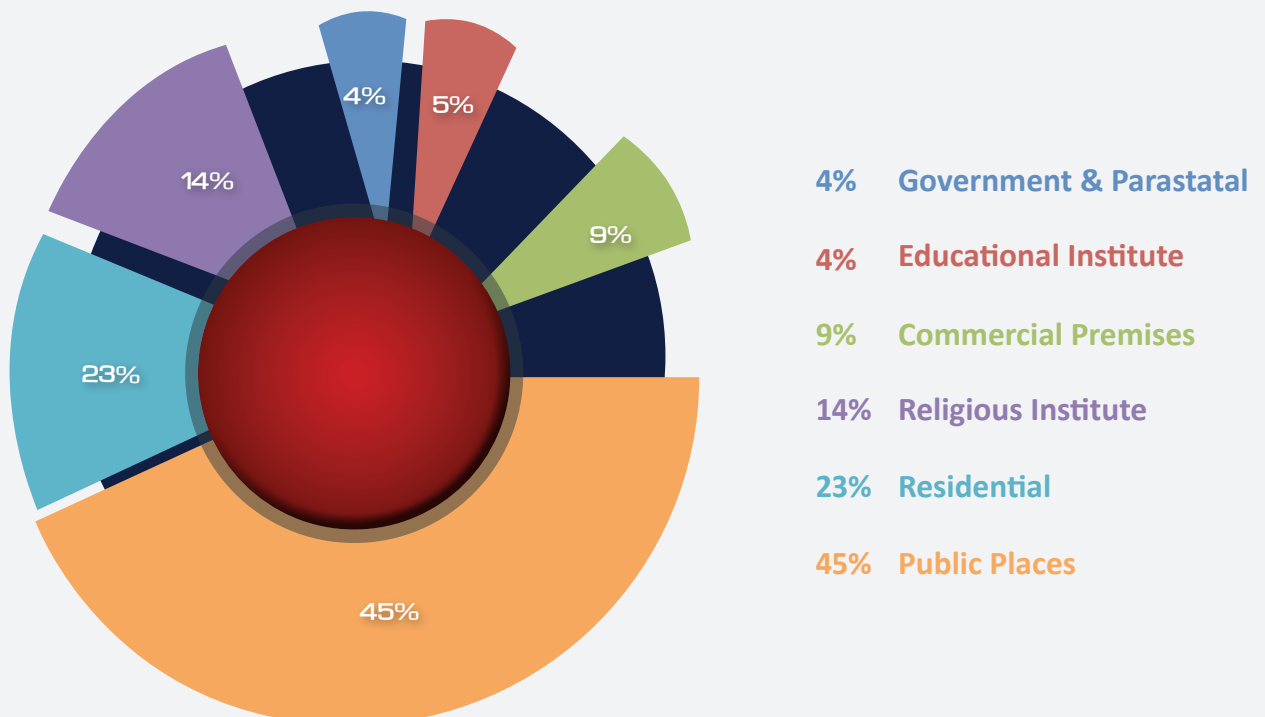

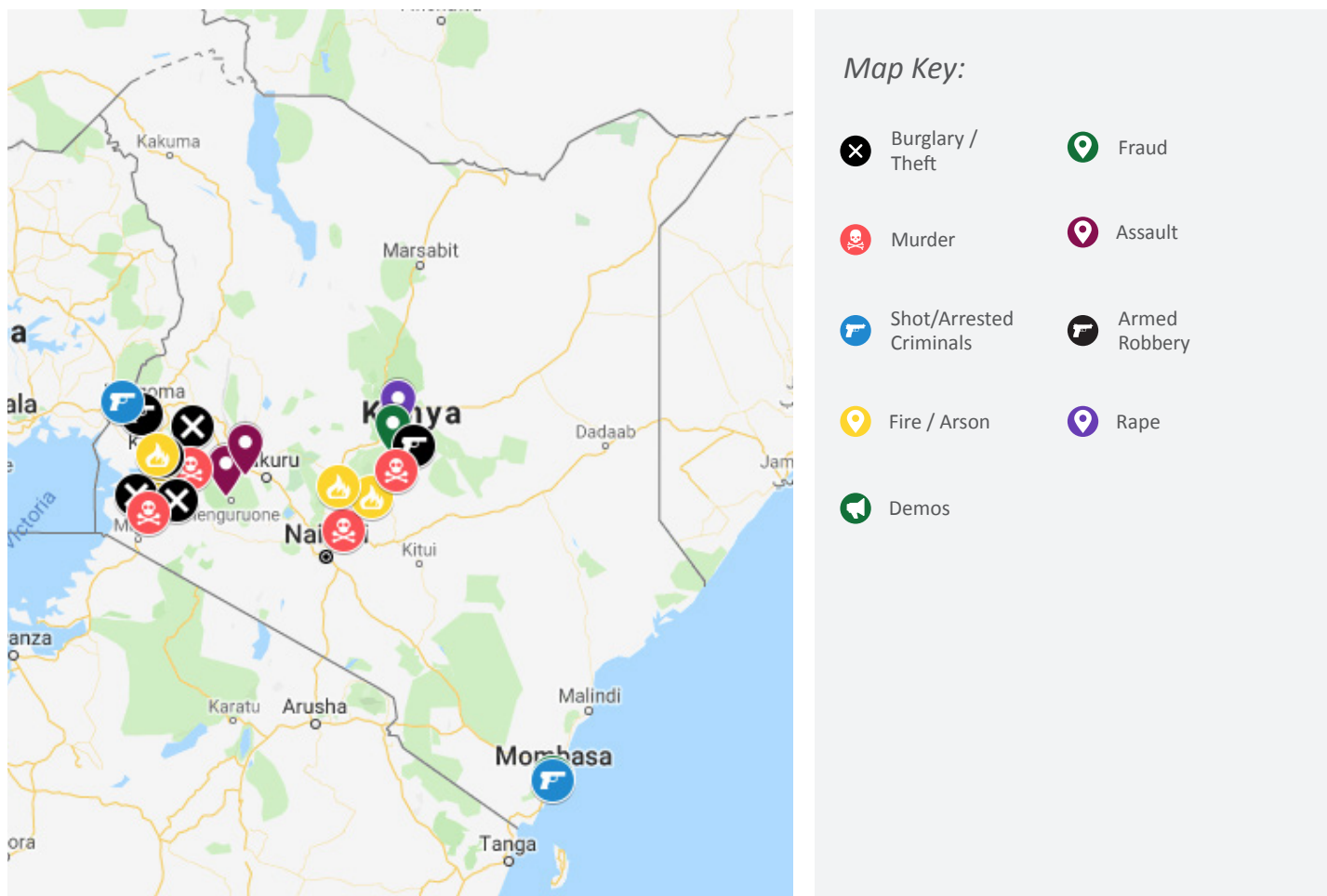
AN AERIAL VIEW OF SECURITY INCIDENTS IN NAIROBI & KENYA

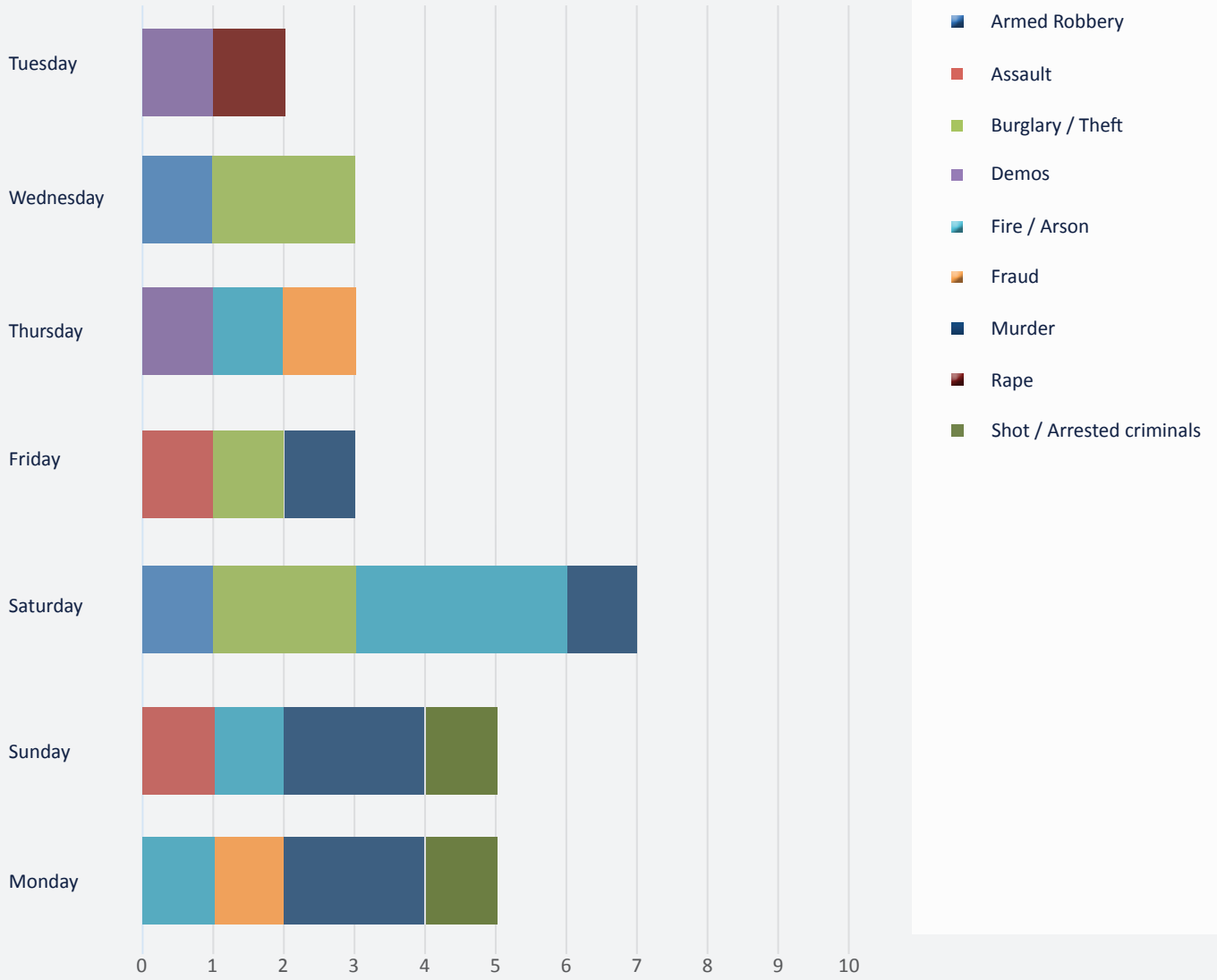

BELOW ARE SOME OF THE KEY SECURITY INCIDENTS



- Two boda boda operators were on Tuesday killed and their motorcycles stolen in Kabula ward of Bumula Sub-County, Bungoma County.
- Traders at Nyakuru market in Homa Bay County were on Thursday night left counting losses after a fire razed down their stalls.
- The residents of Waitua village in Kandara Sub-County in Murang'a County woke up to a rude shock on Sunday after a woman and her son were killed by unknown assailants.
- Police in Tigania East, Meru County are looking for a gang that on Tuesday defiled a 14-year-old girl at Lacia Thuriu area.
- Burglars on Friday night broke into Ibara Seventh Day Adventist Church in Nyamira County and stole holy wine and bread meant for Eucharist.
- A man suspected of conning a number of people in Meru town was on Monday traced and arrested in Nkubu area in Imenti South, Meru County.
- Suspected thugs on Wednesday broke into the residence of a Cuban Doctor attached to Homa Bay County and made away with electronics of unknown value.
- A gang of three men is suspected to have on Friday strangled to death a Senior manager of a local cement factory at his house in Soin ward, Kericho County.
- Two Ugandan suspects who had stolen a baby and a motor vehicle in Nairobi were on Monday arrested by detectives at the Malaba border in Busia County.
- Police on Wednesday recovered eight vehicles and five tractors suspected to have been stolen in a homestead in Mosoriot, Nandi County.
- Police in Kisumu County are holding two watchmen after a school they were guarding was on Saturday night broken into and learning materials stolen.
- Technical University of Mombasa (TUM) students on Thursday burnt tyres and barricaded the Mombasa-Malindi highway as they protested over allegations of high handedness by the Institution's Administration.
- The Full Gospel Life Mission Church in Kirinyaga County was on Saturday reduced to ashes when gangsters attacked it in broad day light.
- Police on Sunday gunned down a suspected machete-wielding criminal at Ushindi area in Likoni, Mombasa County.
