OVERVIEW

Further to the school opening period, there was a concern regarding fire incidents reported in boarding learning institutions. Four schools, Huruma Girls High Schools, Chogoria Girls Boarding Primary School, Ulanda Girls High School, and Musingu Boys High School were this week affected prompting the need for investigations as some of the school administrators suspected foul play.

Other than the above, continuous partnership between the public and security agencies saw the arrest of notorious criminals and crackdowns on car theft and fake currency syndicates.



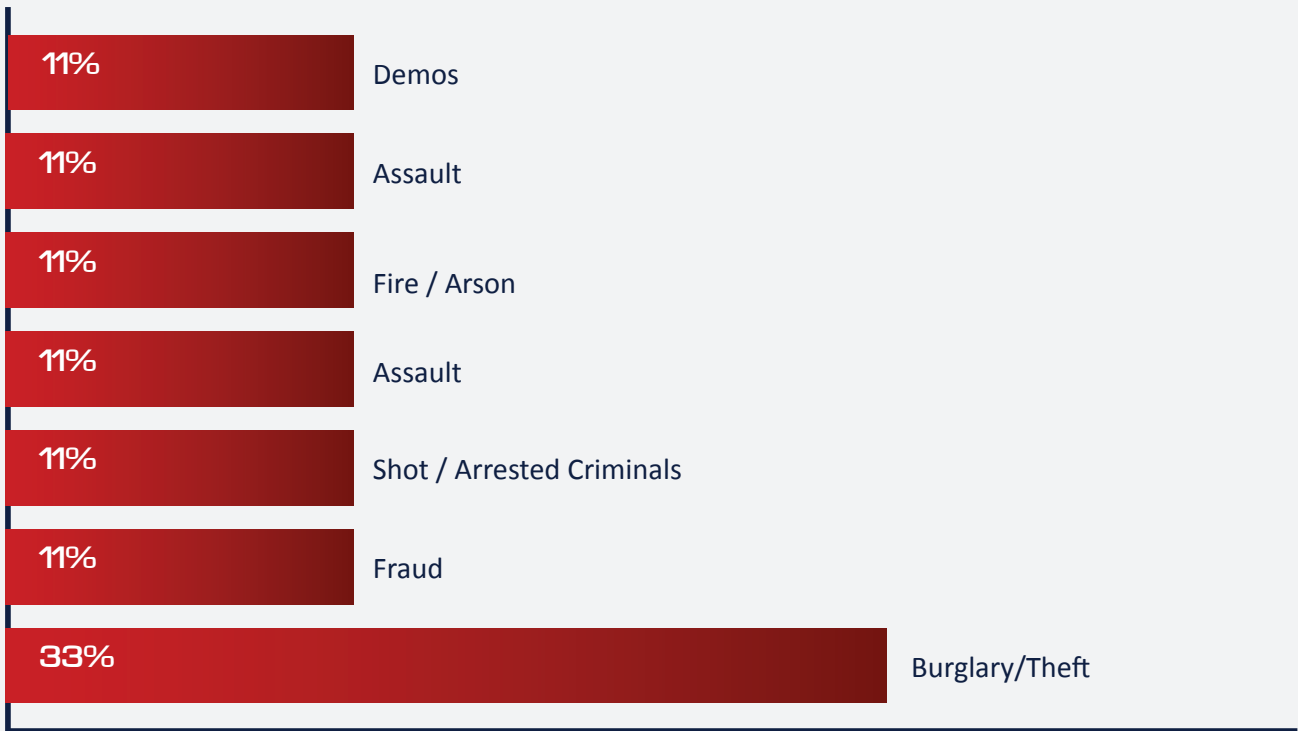
HIGHLIGHTS OF THE WEEK NAIROBI

The key crime-related incidents reported in Nairobi included:

- Two motor vehicle theft suspects were on Tuesday arrested and car parts recovered after police raided a godown in Kariobangi South, Nairobi.
- Property of unknown value was on Tuesday destroyed following a fire incident at Huruma Girls in Nairobi.
- Thugs armed with guns and machetes on Wednesday attacked a construction site located off Kiambu Road in Nairobi and made away with materials worth over Sh5 million.
- Thieves masquerading as police officers on Thursday morning stole Sh 72 million from a local bank in Nairobi West.
- Police officers acting on a tip-off on Thursday confiscated over 200 million shillings in fake US dollars, Euros and Pounds in Kileleshwa, Nairobi.
- Suspected burglars on Friday broke into a residential house located along 3rd Parklands Avenue and made away with unknown number of items.
- A most wanted criminal from Kisauni was on Sunday arrested at 11th street in Eastleigh by detectives from the Directorate of Criminal Investigations.

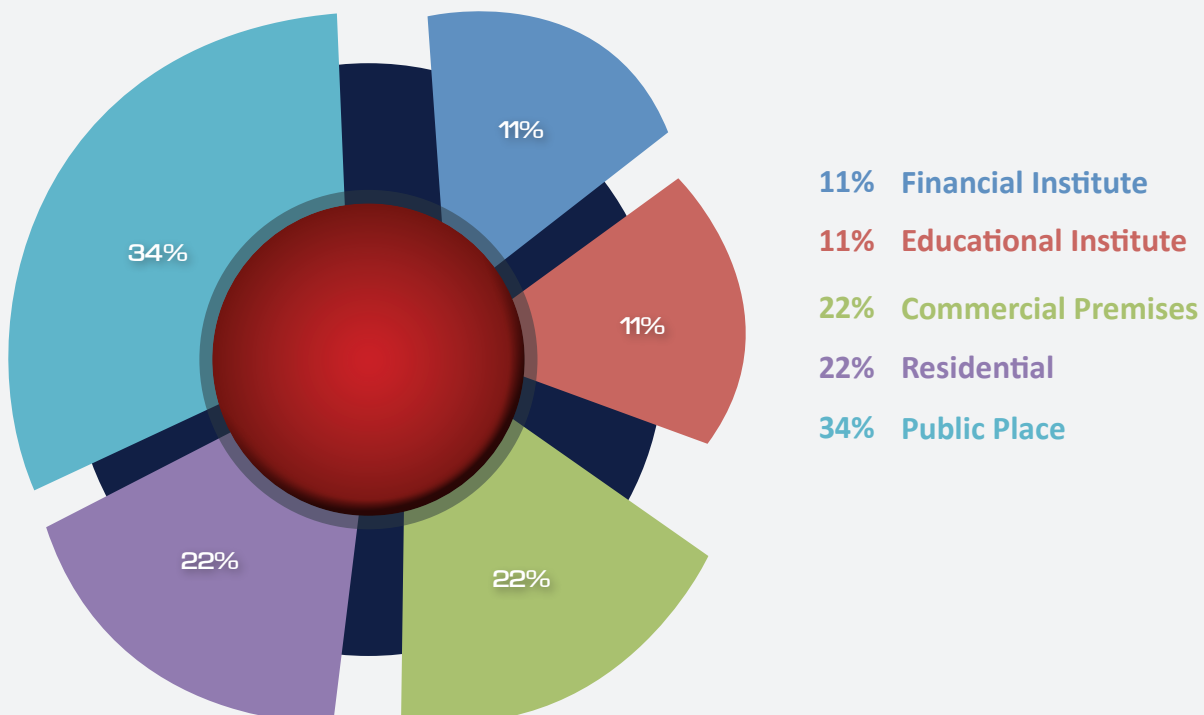

Unlike the previous periods, financial institutions were of key concern following this week's local bank heist incident

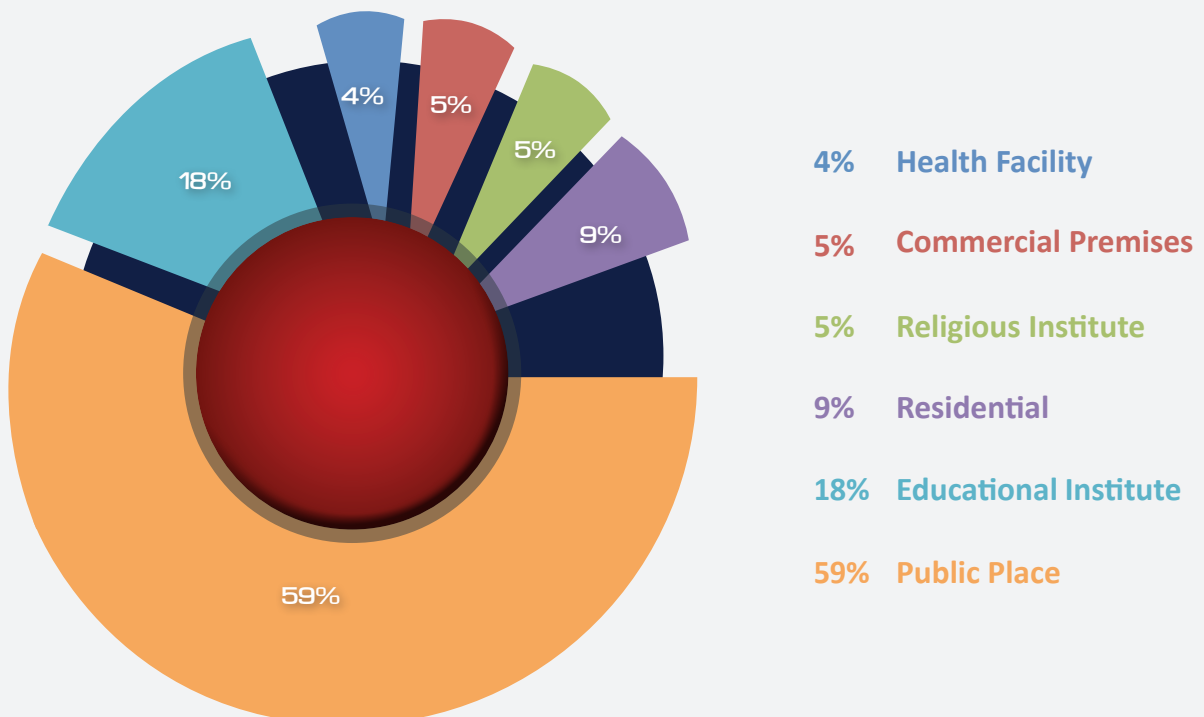

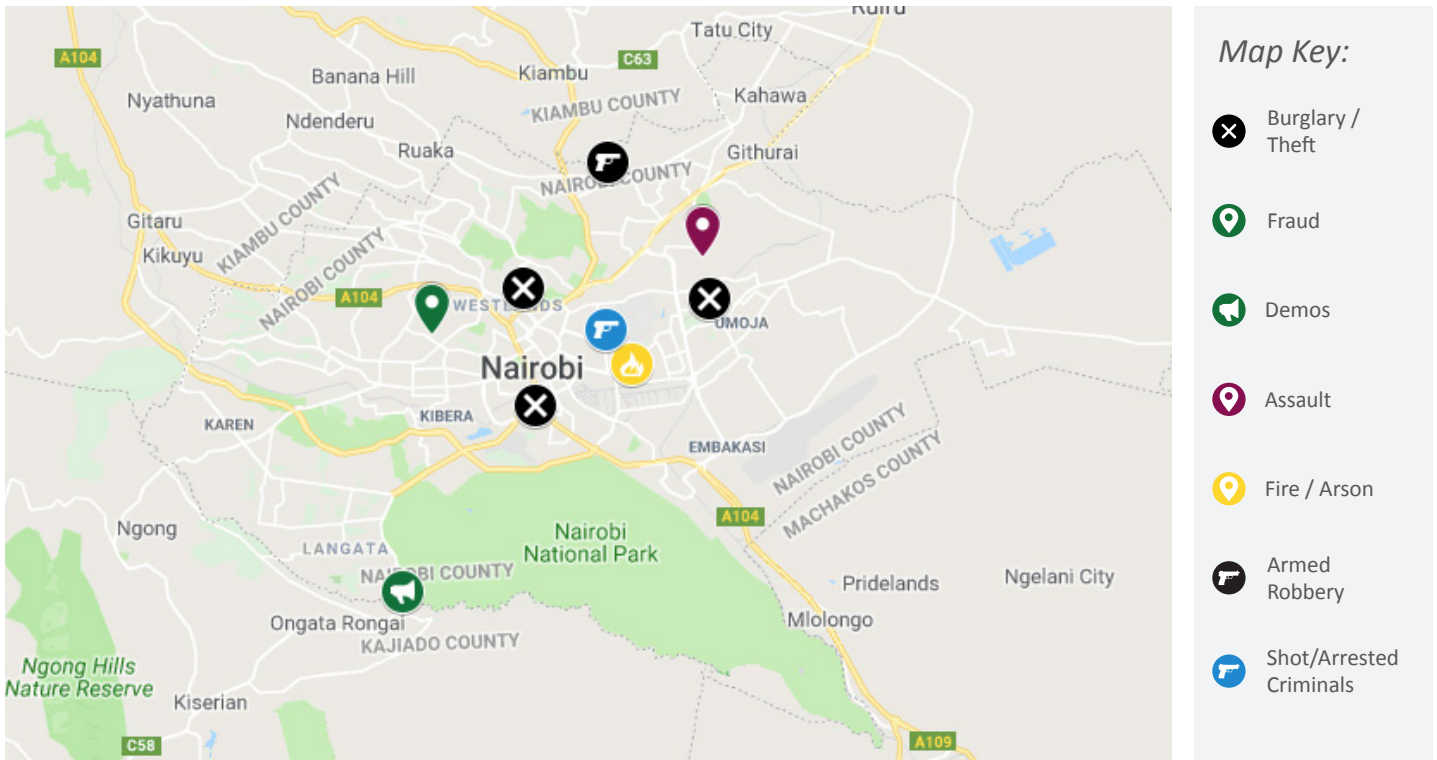
SCENE OF INCIDENTS ANALYSIS IN RELATION TO INCIDENTS



At least three schools reported fire incidents this reporting week

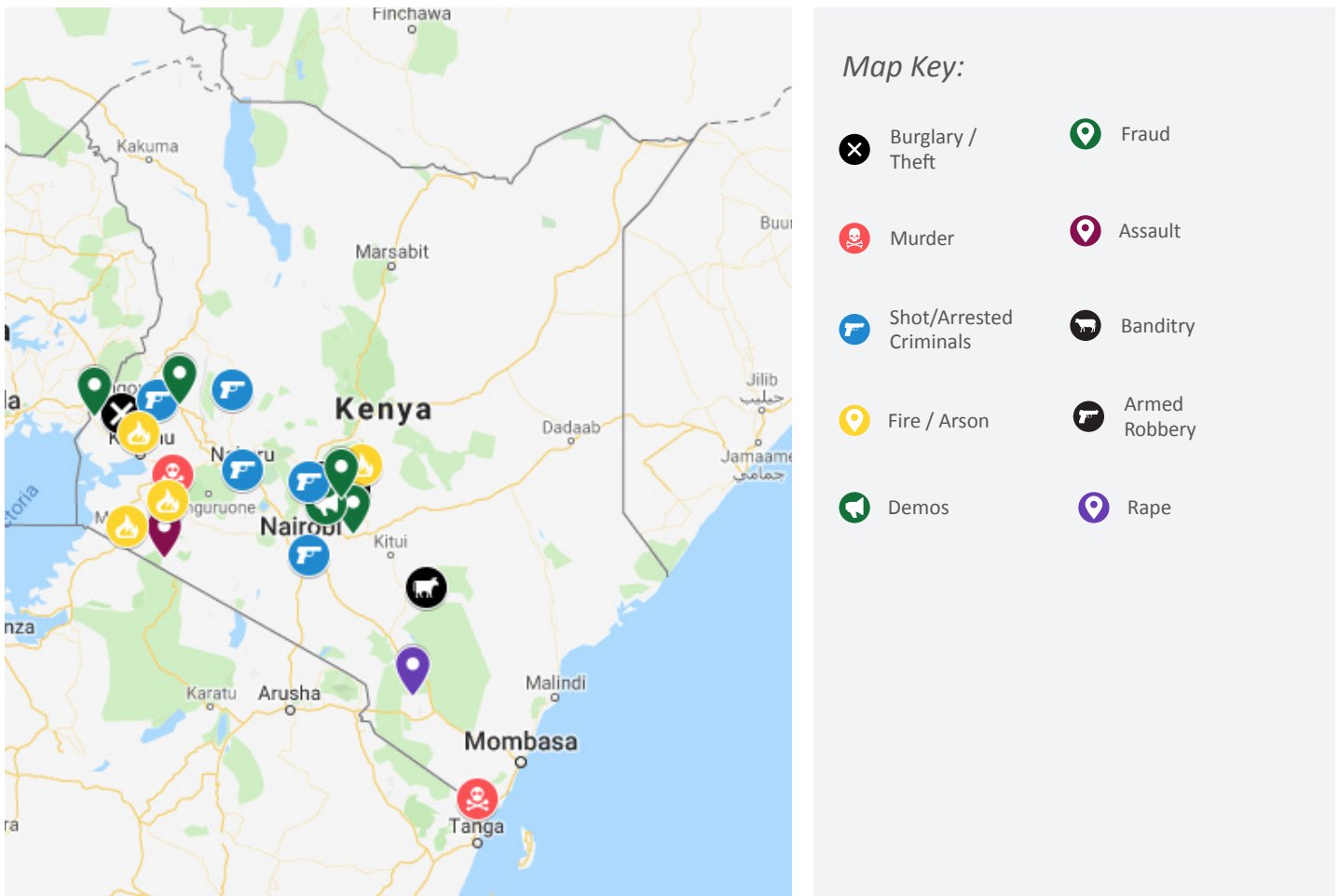
AN AERIAL VIEW OF SECURITY INCIDENTS IN NAIROBI & KENYA

BELOW ARE SOME OF THE KEY SECURITY INCIDENTS

- A morning fire on Sunday destroyed a dormitory housing 350 students at Musingu Boys High School in Kakamega County.
- A man and his wife were on Monday killed by unknown assailants in a suspected land tussle at Maasai village in Nzombo, Kwale County.
