

## OVERVIEW

The overall security incidents recorded across the country in the third week of October seemed to have slightly reduced as compared to the past two weeks. Despite the notable reduction, the spate of muggings and car thefts continued to be of key concern in the week under reference.

Our security sources indicate that at least six incidents of car thefts are reported every week while a majority of muggings were often associated with thugs disguising themselves as Boda Boda riders. For instance, two men on a motorbike on Thursday snatched a handbag from a woman just a few meters from the Kahawa bus terminus in Kiambu County.



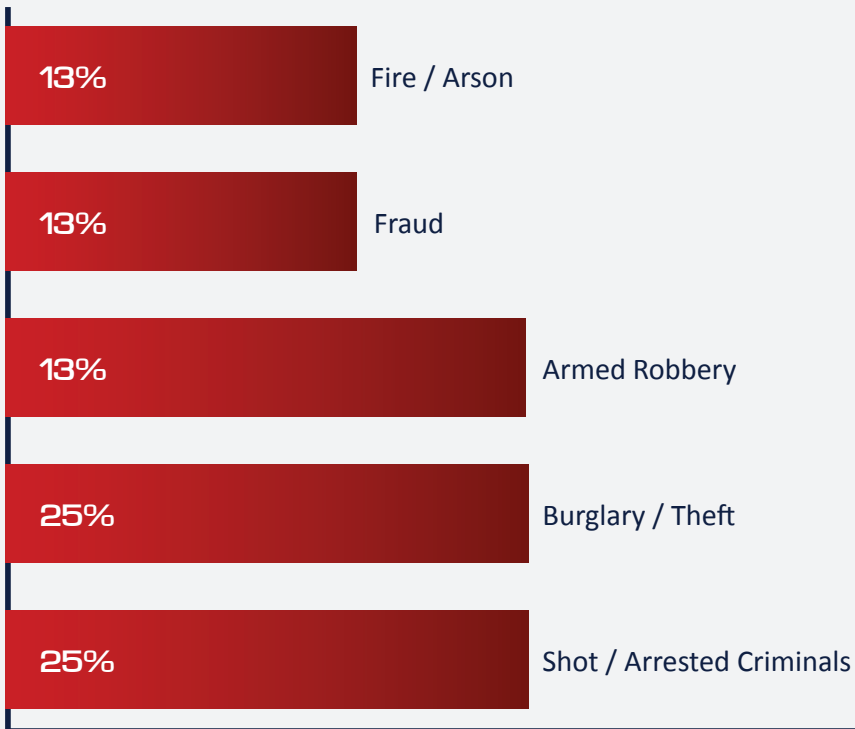
## HIGHLIGHTS OF THE WEEK NAIROBI

The notable incidents recorded in Nairobi included the following:

- A Chinese national was on Tuesday night arrested at the Jomo Kenyatta International Airport while in possession of one ivory bangle beaded and concealed in a cigarette packet that weighed 60 grams.
- One thug was on Friday morning shot dead and others escaped after they broke into homes in Ngando area.
- A gang of youths in Nairobi's Mukuru Kayaba on Saturday broke into houses whose tenants were away and stole electronics, food and other items.
- Detectives from the Directorate of Criminal Investigations on Saturday arrested a suspect linked to various cases of M-Pesa fraud. The suspect was arrested alongside two security guards stationed at Automated Teller Machines (ATMs) in Nairobi's Central Business Development.
- Some families were left in the cold after a fire on Sunday night razed down their houses in Kawangware.
- A robbery suspect was on Monday night arrested after he attacked two men in Kamulu area of Njiru Sub-County.

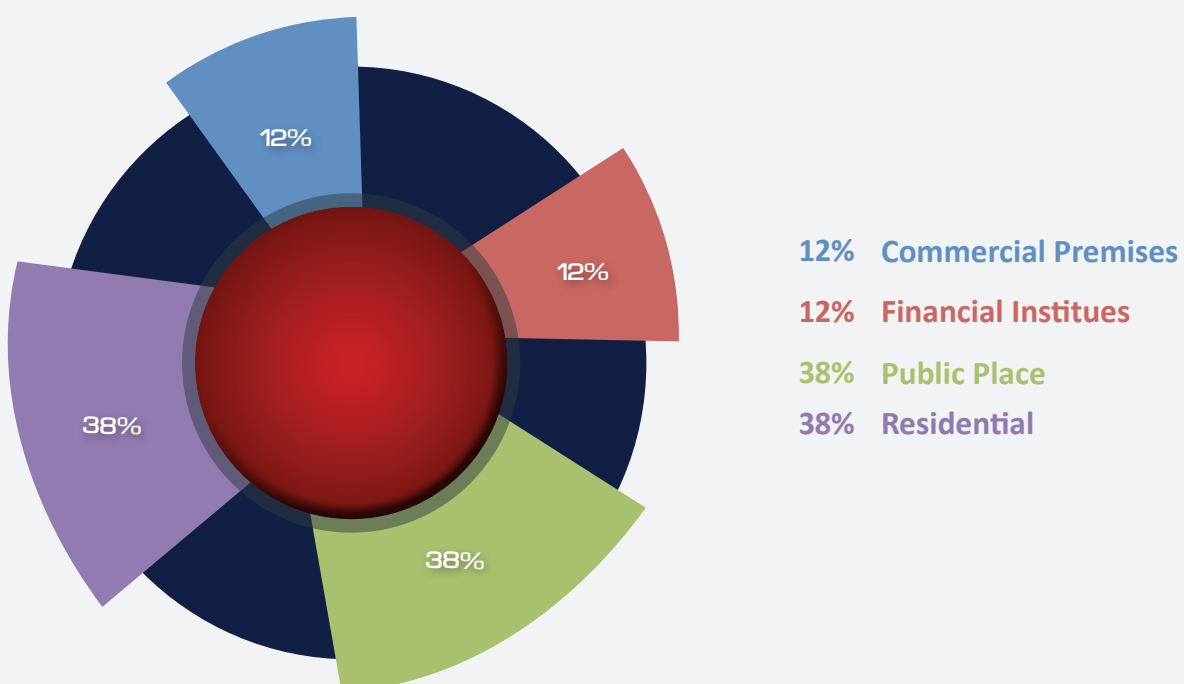

*Police intervention helped minimize robbery-related cases as per the above chart.*

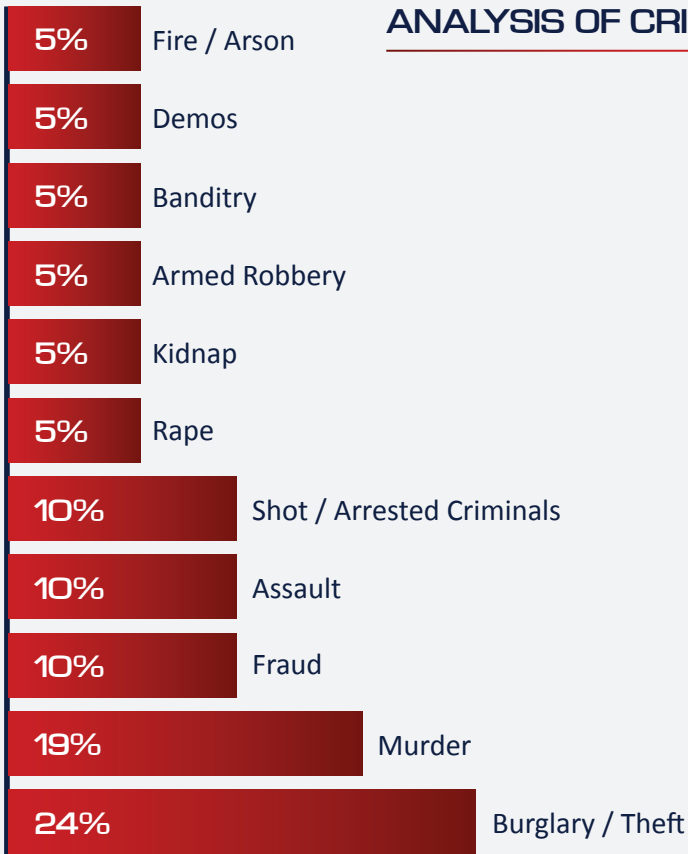
## SCENE OF INCIDENTS ANALYSIS IN RELATION TO INCIDENTS



*Residential areas continued to be the most prevalent scenes of crime incidents for the second consecutive week*

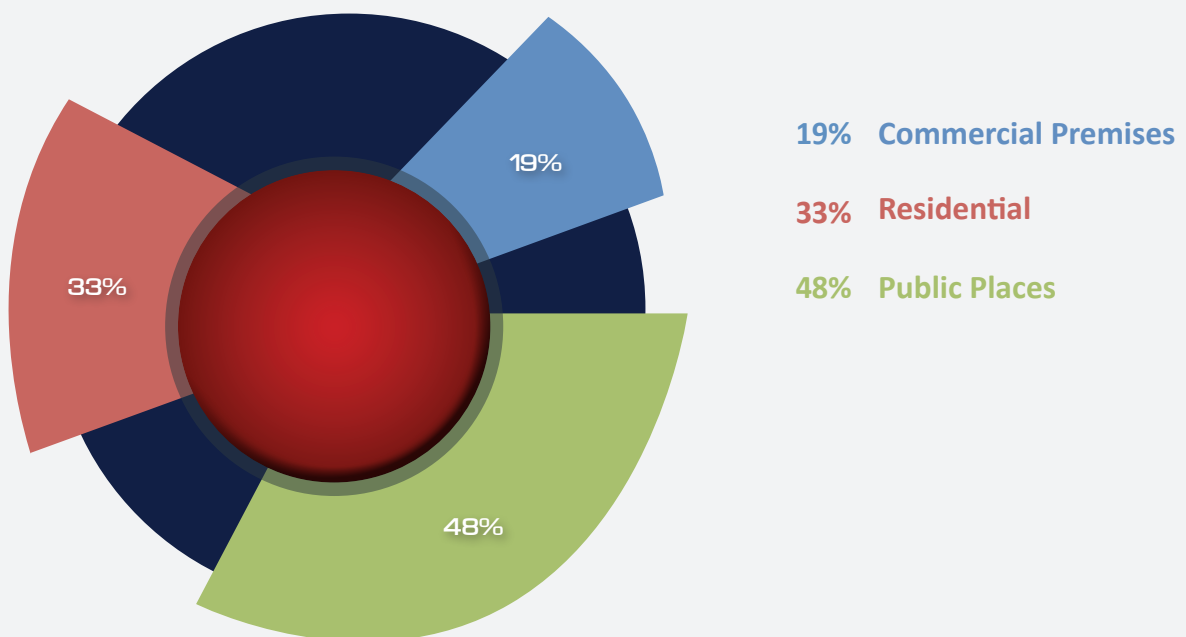

A total of 21 incidents were recorded in the Rest of the Country.

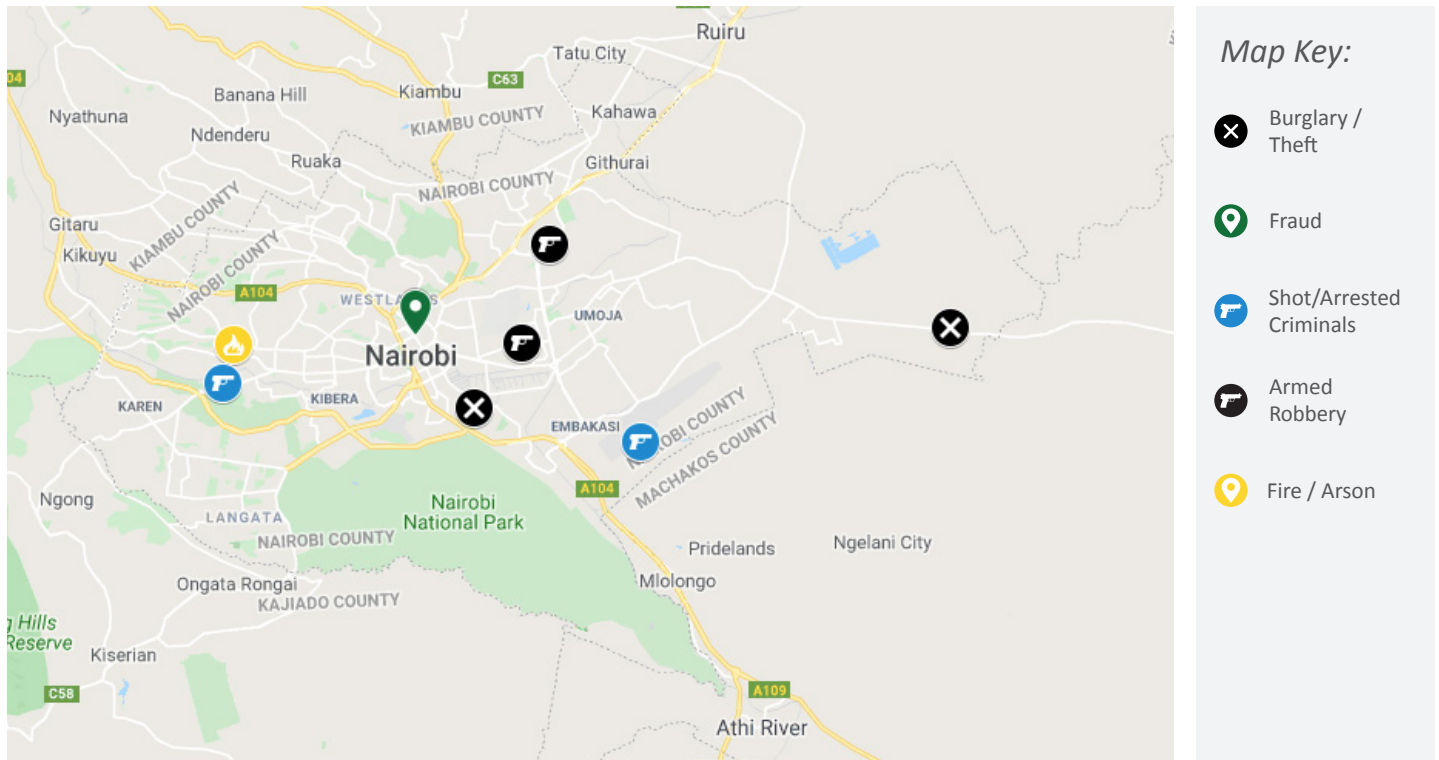
## SCENE OF INCIDENTS ANALYSIS IN RELATION TO INCIDENTS



There was a notable reduction in the number of scenes of incidents reported in Rest of the Country.

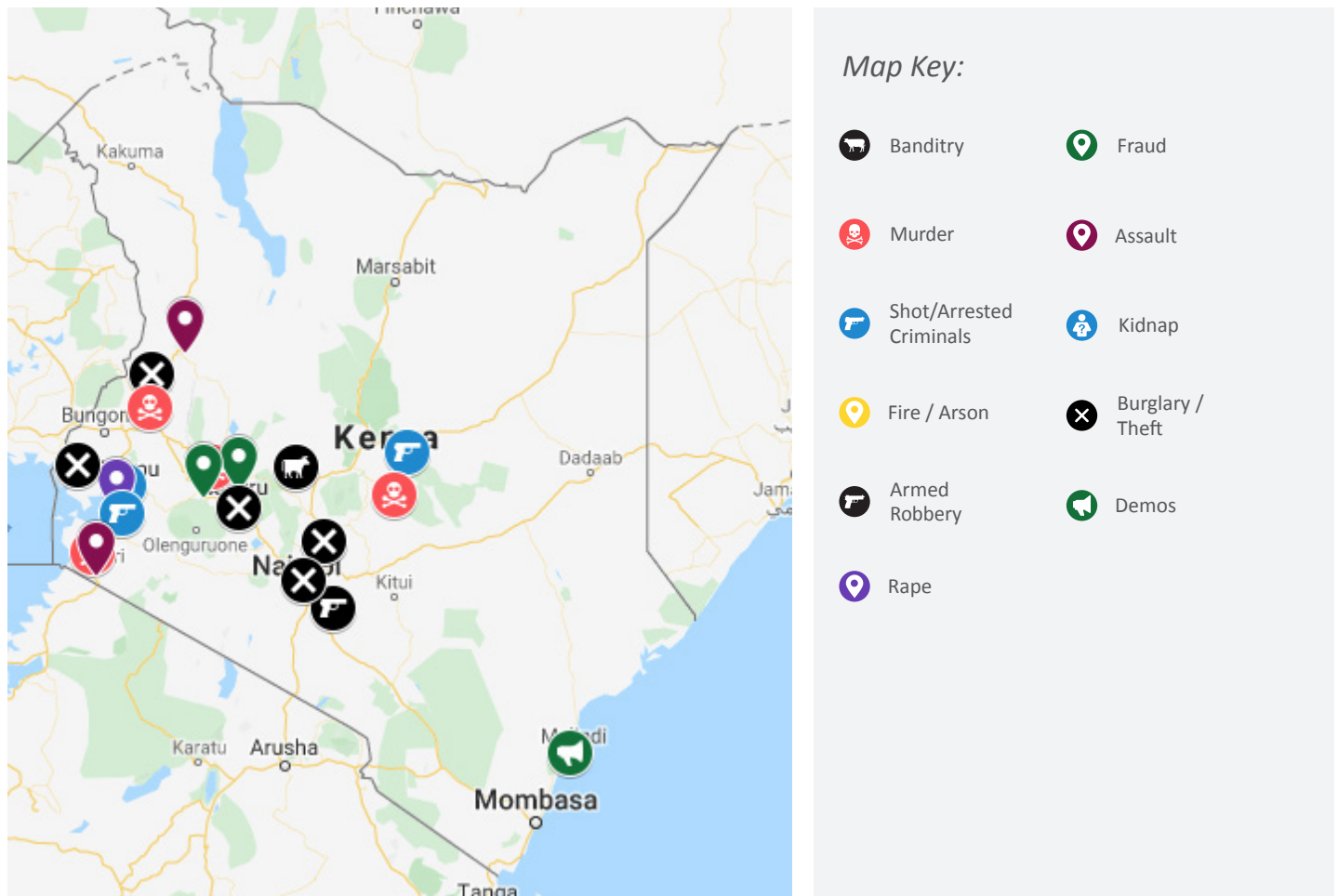

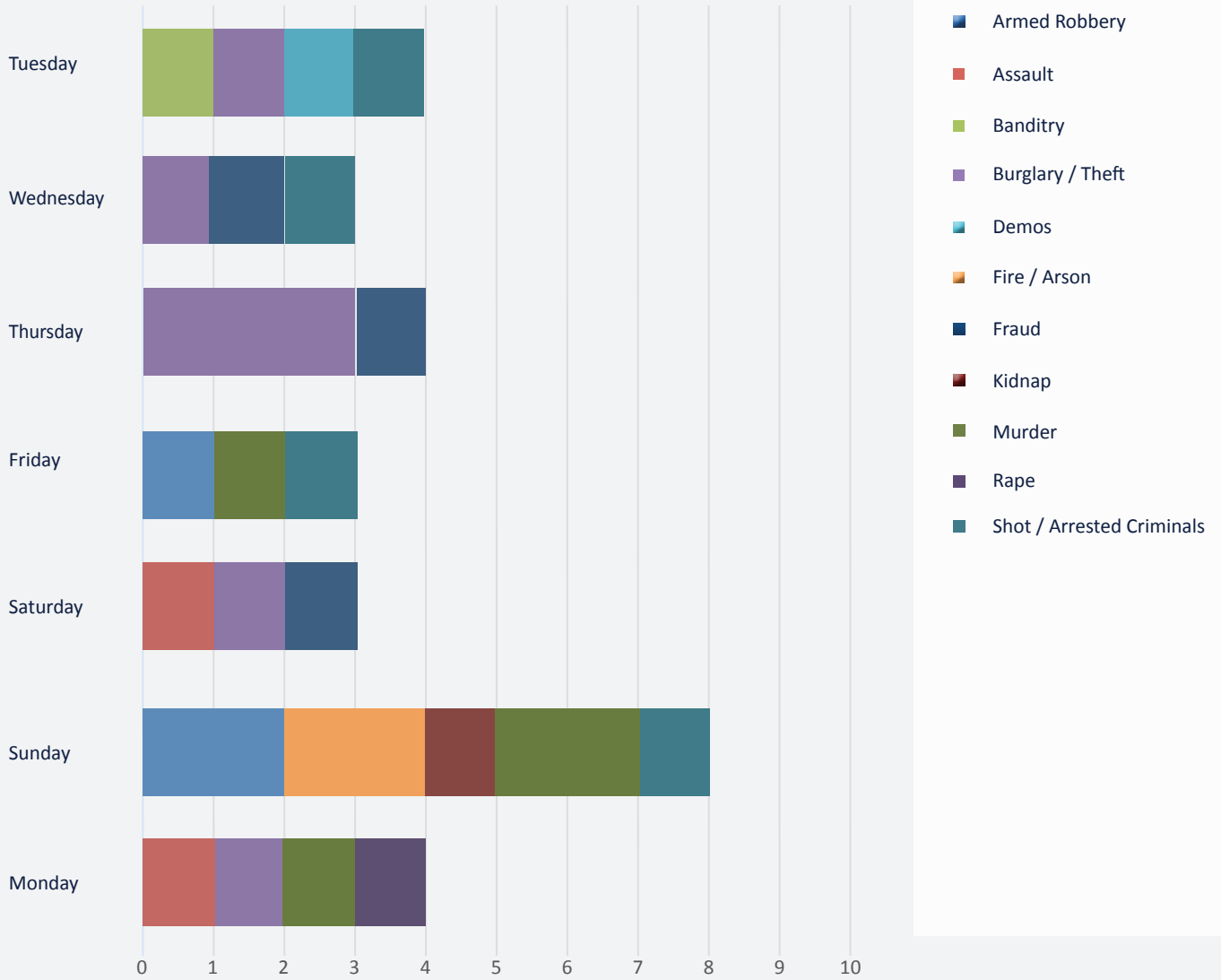
# BELOW ARE SOME OF THE KEY SECURITY INCIDENTS



- Suspected bandits on Tuesday night shot dead a ranger at Laikipia Nature and Conservancy ranch - Laikipia County, creating tension in the region.
- A vehicle belonging to Sikom Peace Organization was on Tuesday reported stolen in Kapenguria, West Pokot County.
- A 25-year-old man is accused to have on Wednesday stolen four cows from Ugunja, Siaya County.
- Police in Tigania East, Meru County on Wednesday gunned down a suspected cattle rustler, arrested another and recovered a rifle following heavy gunfire at Murutui near the Meru-Isiolo border.
- A suspected member of a criminal gang was on Thursday arrested after he was caught ransacking a house in Makuyu market, Murang'a County.
- A businessman who runs an electronic shop in Molo was on Thursday conned of Ksh.600,000 by two women who posed as nuns from a local Seminary in Molo, Nakuru County.
- Detectives in Baringo County are investigating the Friday killing of a 37-year-old man in Koitebes village, Mogotio Sub-County.
- Suspected gangsters on Friday night raided a pub at Kisekini village in Machakos County and injured patrons before making away with the day's collection.
- A man from Runo area of West Pokot County on Saturday night allegedly chopped off his wife's right hand following a disagreement that ensued between the two.
- Property worth millions of Kenya Shillings was on Sunday night destroyed after a fire razed Maathai Supermarket in Murang'a County.
- A 75-year-old woman was on Sunday morning defiled and killed at her house in Namunyiri village, Kakamega County.
- A 40-year-old man was arrested in Homa Bay County on suspicion that he on Monday allegedly defiled a Grade One pupil in Kamidigo sub-location, Rachuonyo South Sub-County.
- A 38-year-old man was on Monday found murdered and his body dumped near a school in Uriri, Migori County.
