



WEEKLY CRIME REPORT

1st October - 7th October '19

OVERVIEW

The beginning week of October 2019 depicted an increasing concern in the cases of fraud and armed robberies. This ranged from the arrest of nine suspects by the Directorate of Criminal Investigations in connection with electronic fraud in Kiambu and Bomet Counties to attacks of motorists, passengers, and pedestrians by unknown assailants. In particular, our security sources indicate that a 14-seater matatu heading to Nairobi from Nyahururu town was on Saturday night hijacked and passengers robbed of their belongings.

Other than the above, the findings captured in this report will provide a better understanding of the crime trends in Nairobi and the Rest of the Country in the week under reference.



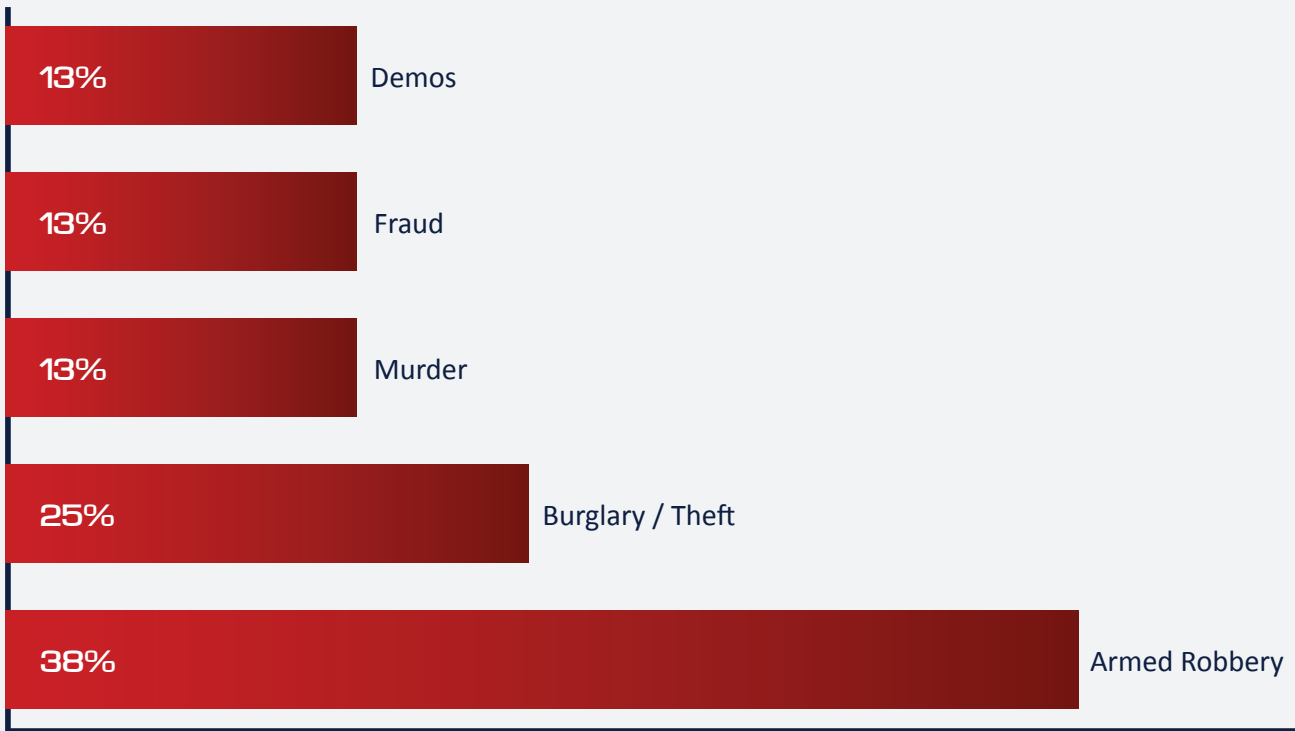
HIGHLIGHTS OF THE WEEK NAIROBI

The key crime-related incidents reported in Nairobi included:

- Over 1800 litres of siphoned diesel was on Thursday seized and four suspects arrested at Nairobi Joint Depot following a raid by police.
- A motorist was on Friday night allegedly robbed of his belongings after a gang of four men attacked him along the sixth parklands avenue, Nairobi.
- Three police officers on Saturday night allegedly robbed Ksh.6 million from two businessmen at a lodge in Eastleigh, Nairobi.
- A white Toyota Corolla vehicle was on Sunday evening reported stolen from a parking lot outside a mall on the fourth parklands avenue, Nairobi.
- A middle aged man is accused to have on Monday night hacked his wife to death following a squabble at their house at the Waruku-Kangemi border in Nairobi.
- Thugs armed with knives on Monday night accosted pedestrians along the General Waruingi Street in Kariokor area, Nairobi .

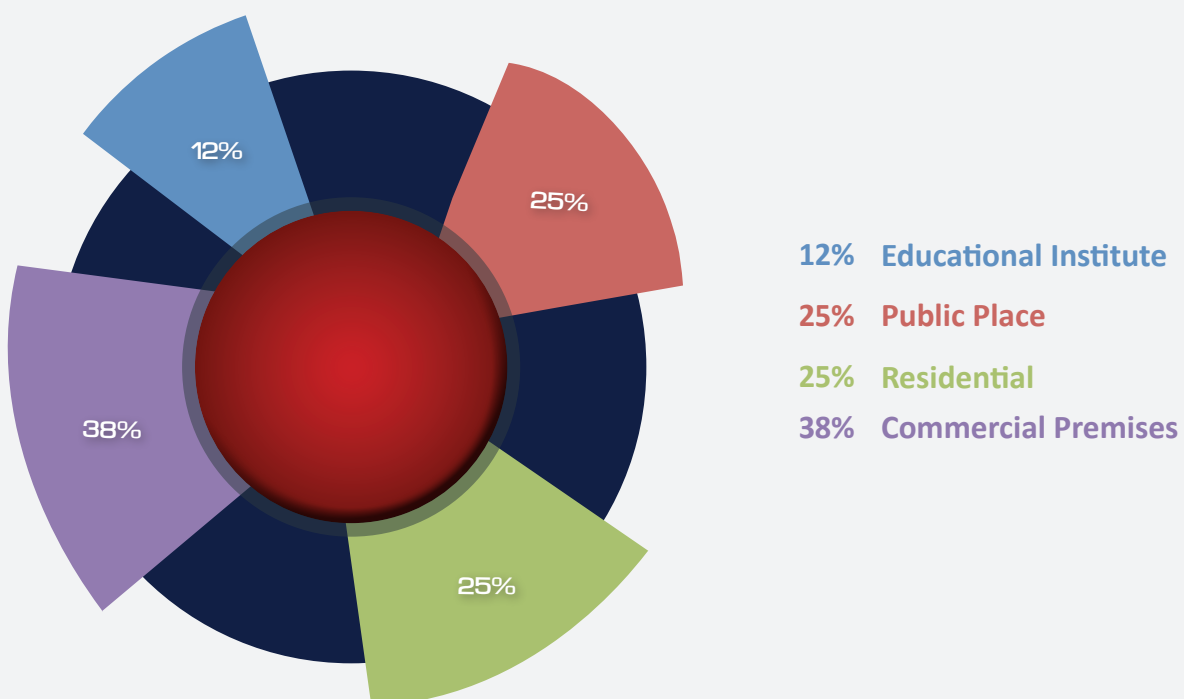

Robbery-related incidents seemed to be on the rise on this first week of October.

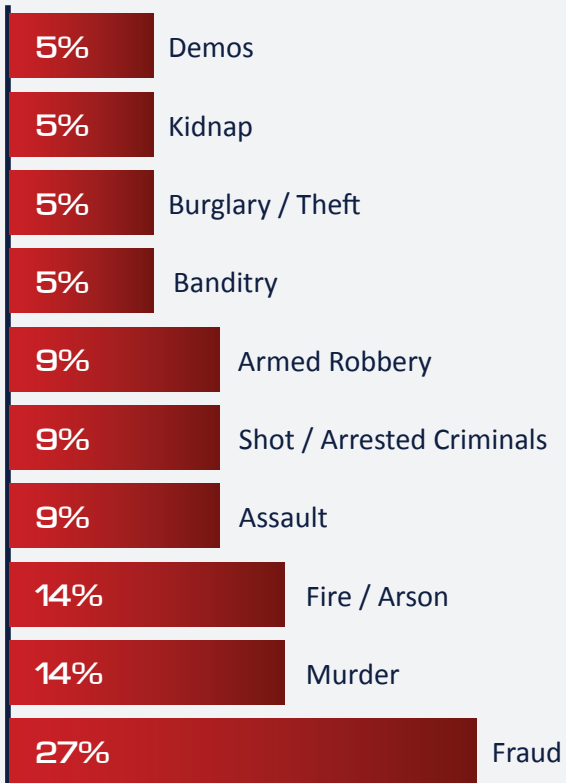
SCENE OF INCIDENTS ANALYSIS IN RELATION TO INCIDENTS



Of particular concern during this week was the Parklands area that recorded a slight increase of crime incidents

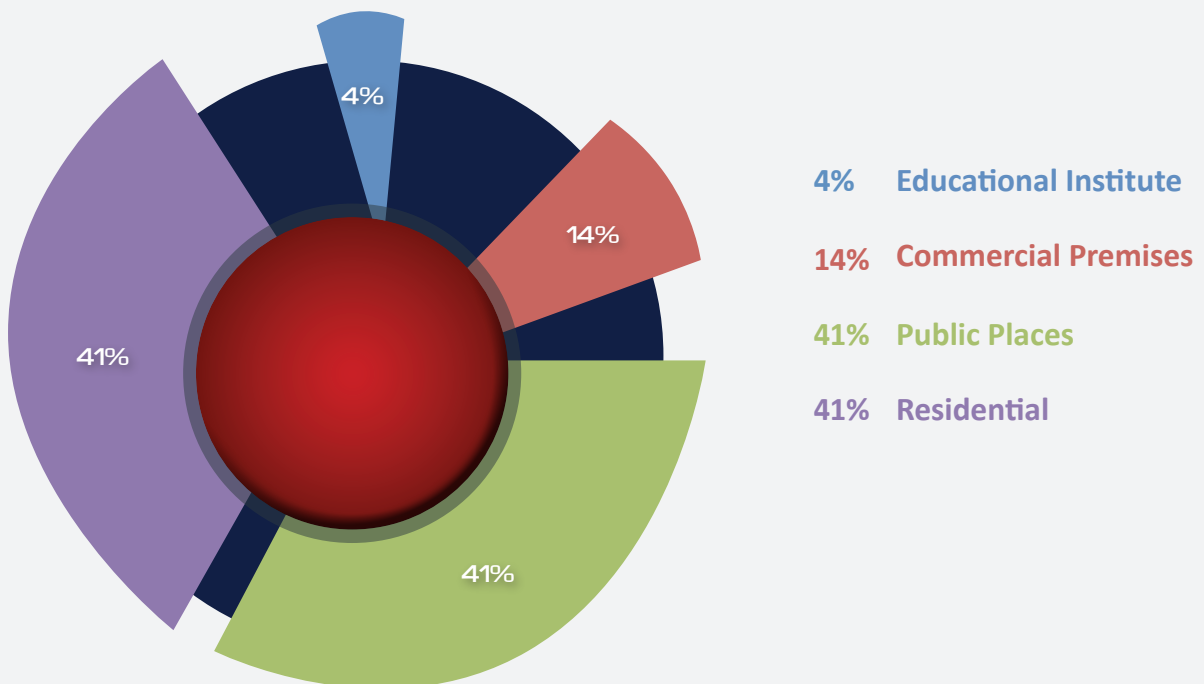

A total of 22 incidents were recorded in the Rest of the Country.

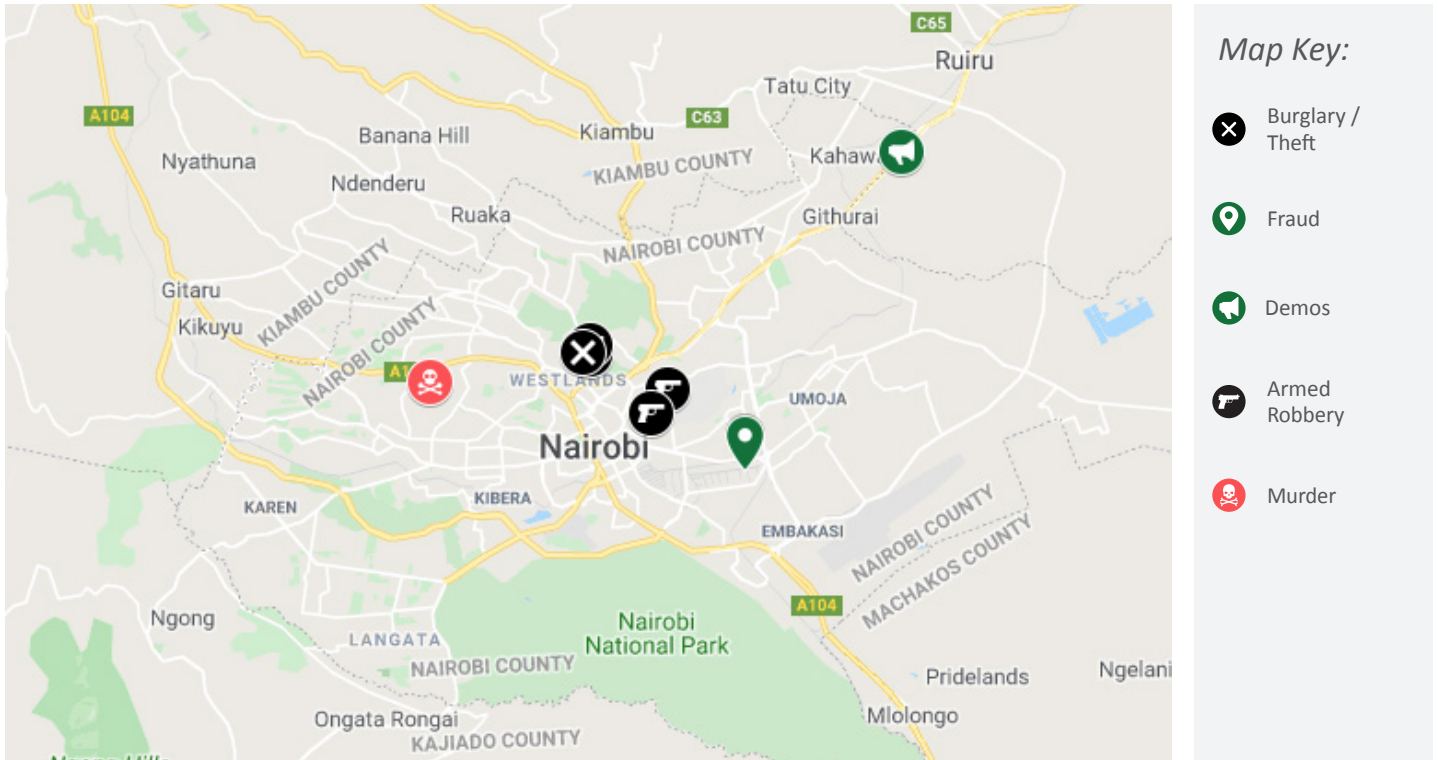
SCENE OF INCIDENTS ANALYSIS IN RELATION TO INCIDENTS



There was a notable increase of fire cases reported in residential areas as compared to the first week of the previous month.

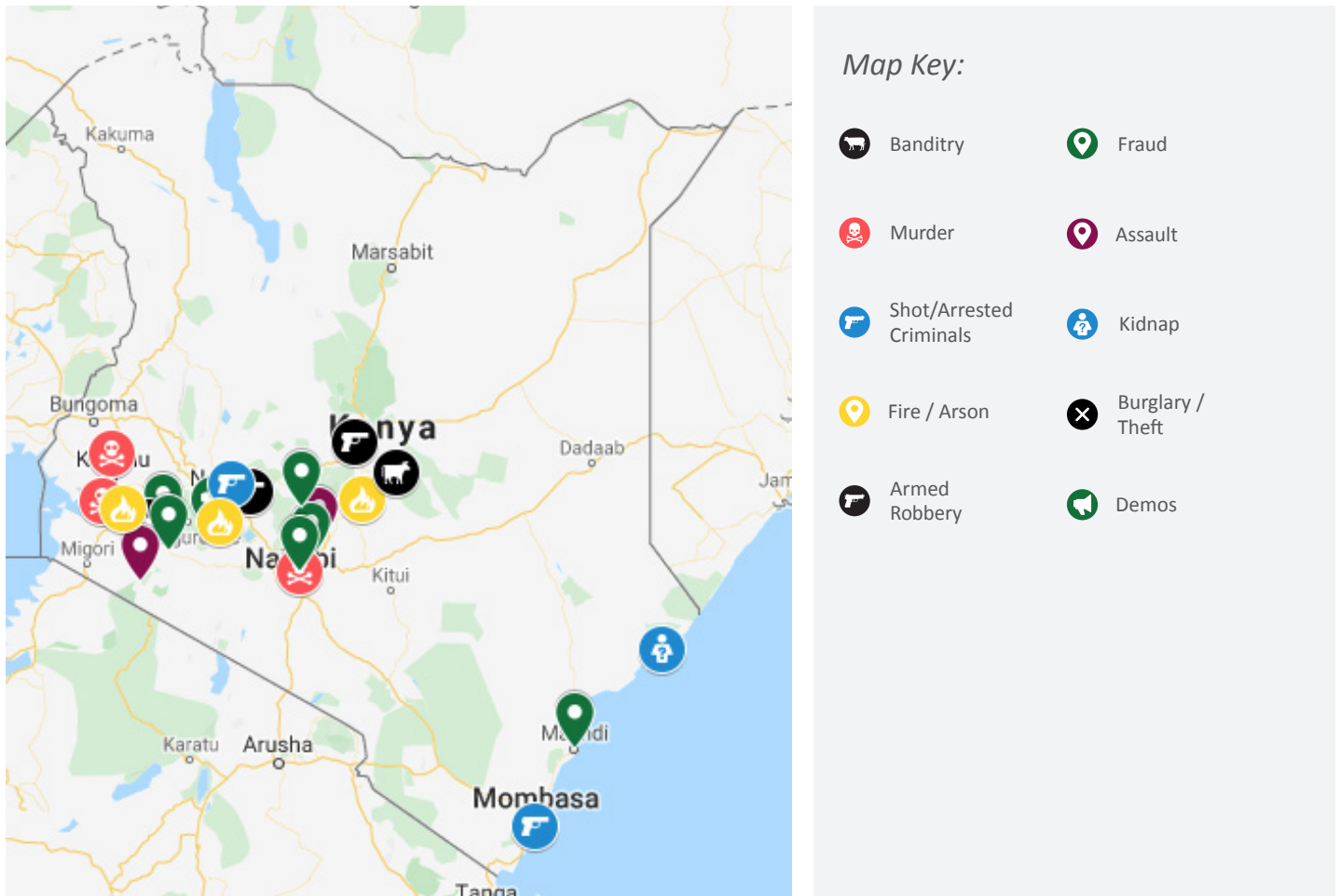
AN AERIAL VIEW OF SECURITY INCIDENTS IN NAIROBI & KENYA

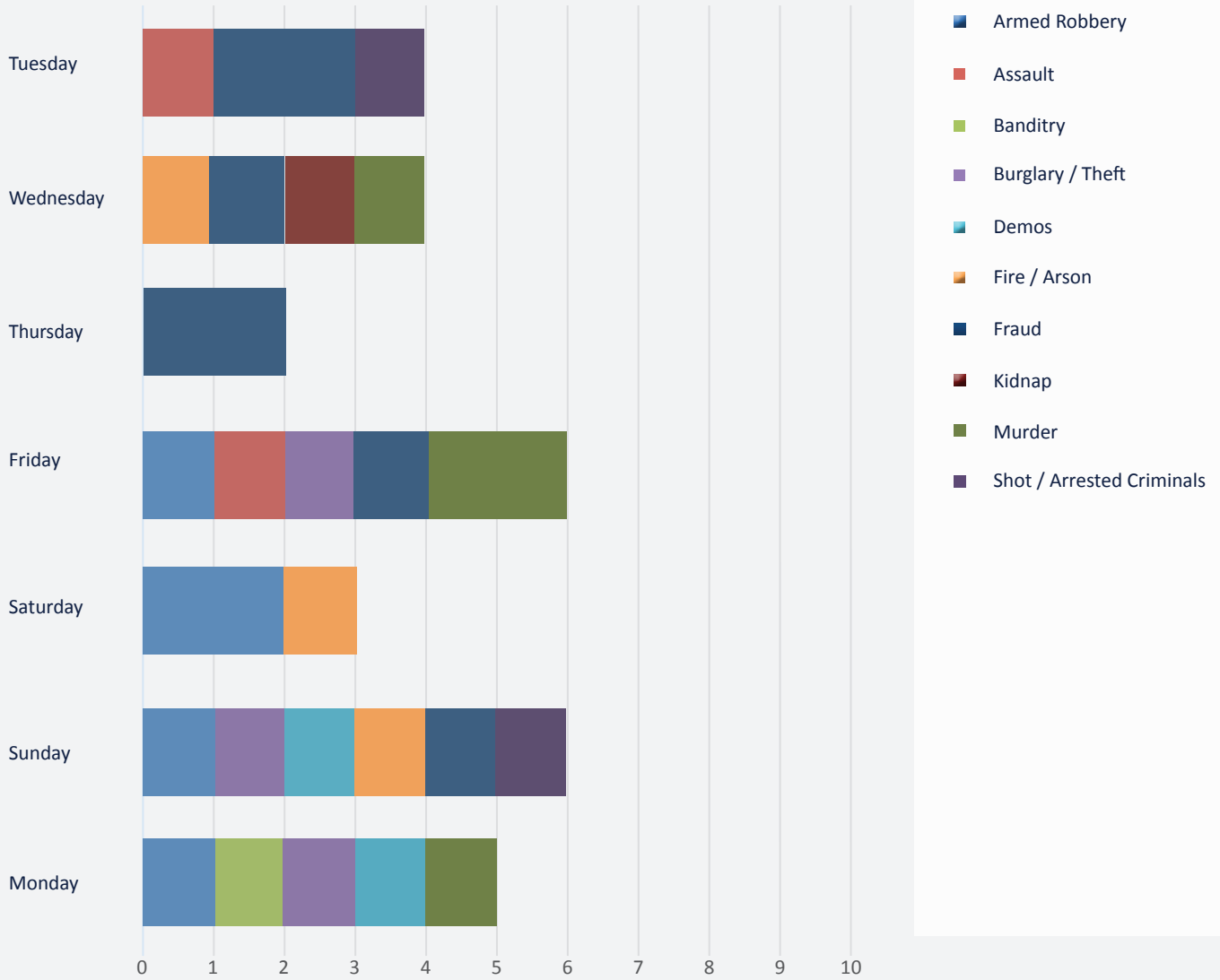

BELOW ARE SOME OF THE KEY SECURITY INCIDENTS



- Recce Squad and Anti-terror police on Tuesday gunned down two suspected terrorists in Likoni, Mombasa County.
- Three theft suspects who siphoned over Ksh.970,000 from a local bank account of a 67-year-old woman were on Tuesday arrested by detectives in Thika West area, Kiambu County.
- An 11-year-old girl was on Wednesday burnt to death and her father injured after their house caught fire in Chuka town, Tharaka Nithi County.
- A police officer based in Kizingintini Police Station in Lamu County was on Wednesday allegedly kidnapped by unknown people.
- Anti-graft detectives based in Kilifi County on Thursday arrested a Malindi Sub-Chief for receiving a Ksh.150,000 bribe.
- A Kenya Forest Service ranger was on Friday shot and injured with an arrow while on patrol in the company of other security officers in Kass area of Narok County.
- Police are investigating an incident in which a woman was on Friday found dead at her Membley house in Ruiru, Kiambu County.
- Two children died on Saturday morning when a fire burnt down their house at Kadongo area in Homa Bay County.
- A 14-seater matatu heading to Nairobi from Nyahururu town was on Saturday night hijacked and passengers robbed of their belongings.
- Police are hunting for five gangsters who on Sunday night stole over Ksh.1 million from a fuel station in Isiolo County.
- Five suspected fraudsters were on Sunday night arrested by detectives and over 40,000 SIM cards, several mobile phones, three laptops, and lists of names with ID numbers confiscated in two separate apartments in Juja town and Gwa Kairu both in Kiambu County.
- Police on Monday arrested seven suspects and recovered eight stolen vehicles in Litein, Kericho County.
