In this week under reference, there were raised concerns regarding insecurity in some parts of the Country. Our security sources indicate that Nairobi residents had raised concerns over increased muggings cases along Enterprise Road. They blame the soaring crime on the illegal structures built-up that harbour gangs ready to pounce on pedestrians while walking home at night. .

Similar to the above case scenario, residents of Chepkanga on the outskirts of Eldoret town in Uasin Gishu County staged protests against the upsurge of burglary and robbery cases in their area. For instance, houses and commercial premises within Chepkanga trading centre were on Friday night broken into by unknown people who made away with cash and other valuables.





HIGHLIGHTS OF THE WEEK NAIROBI


The notable incidents recorded in Nairobi included the following:

- Three men are accused to have on Tuesday stolen electronic and construction materials from a company that installs street lights and guard rails along Outer Ring Road.
- Police on Thursday arrested a University Lecturer after a decomposing body of her son was found wrapped in a blanket in their house in South B.
- A fire incident was on Friday reported at an informal settlement adjacent to Southlands Estate in Langata.
- A police officer was on Saturday robbed of his gun near Nairobi's Globe Cinema.
- Detectives from the Directorate of Criminal Investigations on Saturday busted an electronics theft syndicate after they recovered 262 mobile phones, computers, and other accessories following a raid at two shops along Mfangano and Ronald Ngala Streets.
- Suspected thieves on Monday mugged pedestrians along Enterprise Road, Nairobi.







Fire cases were most prevalent in houses in informal settlements thereby increasing the number of incidents reported in Residential Areas


A total of 21 incidents were recorded in the Rest of the Country.



Educational Institutions seemed to be a bit vulnerable to burglaries cases during this examination period.


AN AERIAL VIEW OF SECURITY INCIDENTS IN NAIROBI & KENYA

BELOW ARE SOME OF THE KEY SECURITY INCIDENTS




- Four suspects were on Tuesday night arrested by detectives after their attempt to steal from a Local Bank ATM at Ruiru in Kiambu County was foiled.
- Police are hunting a five-man gang that on Tuesday night allegedly defiled five KCPE candidates returning home from a night vigil at AIC in Naroosura, Narok County.
- Over Ksh.102 million in fake Euro currency was on Wednesday morning impounded at a house in Githurai Kimbo, Kiambu County.
- Armed thugs on Wednesday raided the home of a local businessman in Trans Nzoia County and made away with a Beretta pistol and other valuables.
- Two people were on Thursday arrested for allegedly stealing 16 laptops from a Primary School in Rarieda, Siaya County.
- Detectives in Embu County launched a manhunt for a

- suspect who on Thursday defiled an elderly woman after he broke into her house at Ngwere village in Kibugu location.
- One person was on Friday shot dead as residents of Moyale town in Marsabit County engaged police in running battles as they protested the stringent One-Stop-Border-Point.
- A man who on Saturday killed his friend after a quarrel was later lynched at Atebwo village in Bomet County.
- A 35-year-old man is accused to have on Saturday defiled his daughter in Ndhiwa, Homa Bay County.
- A 60-year-old woman and her 35-year-old daughter in-law were on Sunday shot dead by unknown assailants at their home in Katani, Machakos County.
- Police in Narok County are looking for at least 31 suspects after a fight broke out on Sunday between two clans over the Nkararo-Enooretet

border in Transmara West.

- Police in Mombasa County are investigating an incident in which an eight-year-old girl's hands were on Monday burnt by her aunt and her grandmother for allegedly stealing Ksh.1,500.
- A 32-year-old man is on the run after he on Monday evening allegedly murdered his three-year-old son following a domestic wrangle with his wife at the home in Nyadhi village, Siaya County.
