

WEEKLY CRIME REPORT

24th September - 30th September '19

OVERVIEW

The final week of September 2019 recorded a slight increase in cases of fire across the country as compared to the past four weeks. Our security sources further indicate that foul play and electricity fault were the two main reasons behind this spike. Of particular concern were the arson reports at Kibuline Secondary School in Meru County and at Kibuye market in Kisumu County a week after a similar incident at Jua Kali area.

In addition to the above, there is a need to note that the average number of incidents reported in the entire month was 30, a decline of 30% over a similar period last year.




HIGHLIGHTS OF THE WEEK NAIROBI


The key crime-related incidents reported in Nairobi included:

- Police officers on Wednesday night seized fake one million US dollars and 147 gold bars following a raid at a night club in Kilimani, Nairobi.
- A 37-year-old man is suspected to have on Thursday defiled a 15-year-old school girl in Kangemi estate, Nairobi.
- Two people were on Saturday killed and another was injured after suspected gangsters shot at two vehicles on the Nairobi's Southern Bypass.
- Property of unknown value was on Saturday destroyed after a fire incident occurrence at Mathare 3C area in Nairobi.
- Police officers on Sunday gunned down four armed thugs who had robbed residents at White Castle area along Juja Road, Nairobi.
- A gang of four armed men on Monday morning raided three houses along General Mathenge Road and made away with goods of unknown value.

ANALYSIS OF CRIME INCIDENTS IN NAIROBI





Of particular concern during this period were invasions of homes, attributing to increasing robbery-related cases.

ANALYSIS OF CRIME INCIDENTS IN KENYA






Similar to the Nairobi region, Residential areas were also the most crime-prone scene of incidents in Rest of the Country.


AN AERIAL VIEW OF SECURITY INCIDENTS IN NAIROBI & KENYA

BELOW ARE SOME OF THE KEY SECURITY INCIDENTS




- A dormitory housing 116 students was on Tuesday razed down by a fire at Kibuline Secondary School in Tigania West, Meru County.
- A 28-year-old man was on Tuesday night killed as he attempted to rescue a 13-year-old girl from defilers at Kasuku area in Ol Joro Orok, Nyandarua County.
- Traders at Kibuye market in Kisumu County were on Wednesday left counting losses after a fire razed down some parts of the region's largest open air market.
- Two people on Tuesday night sustained burnt injuries after a fire razed down residential houses in Gakoromone, Meru County.
- A suspected robber was on Thursday shot dead by police officers after he resisted orders to surrender at Borarabu area in Ngombeni, Kwale County.
- Police in Ol Kalou, Nyandarua County, are investigating the bizarre Thursday night killing of a couple at their house in Rurii village.

- A high school teacher was on Friday seriously injured by a student who had been summoned over indiscipline at Kapkenyeloi Secondary School in Nandi County.
- Suspected Ethiopian militants on Saturday allegedly raided homes at North Horr in Marsabit County and made away with livestock.
- A suspected carjacker was on Sunday gunned down by police following a shootout at Karati area in Naivasha, Nakuru County.
- Armed bandits on Sunday ambushed and gunned down a businessman in Endau area of Kitui County.
- A female University student was on Monday night brutally murdered at their home in Moi's bridge, Uasin Gishu County.
- Ten teachers at Kapsoit
 Secondary School in Ainamoi,
 Kericho County, were on
 Monday rendered homeless
 after a fierce fire gutted down
 a section of the staff quarters

at the institution.
