

WEEKLY CRIME REPORT 8th October - 14th October '19

OVERVIEW

There was a slight upsurge of criminal activities during the second week of October contrary to a more peaceful similar period witnessed last year. Of particular concern in the week under reference is the rise of burglary and fire cases recorded in Nairobi City and other major towns in the Country. Our security sources indicate that increased house break-ins attributed to the rise in burglaries while electric faults were the main reasons behind the spike of fire outbreaks.

In another notable incident, the continuous unrest witnessed in the public universities saw Pwani University become the fourth institution in the Country to be closed indefinitely following massive property destruction.



HIGHLIGHTS OF THE WEEK NAIROBI

The notable incidents recorded in Nairobi included the following:


- Twenty two families were on Tuesday left homeless after a fire destroyed their 15 houses in Korogocho slums in Nairobi.
- Suspected armed criminals on a boda on Tuesday attacked and injured two young men walking down the Windy Ridge road in Karen, Nairobi.
- A couple is accused to have on Wednesday stolen household items worth Ksh.127,000 and cash worth Ksh.20,000 at an Apartment in Kilimani area, Nairobi.
- A man with other alleged Nairobi County officials on Thursday assaulted a resident of Kibera 42 in Nairobi County.
- Burglars on Sunday night broke into a residential house along Ngao road in Nairobi County and made away with valuables.
- Three people on Monday night died and four others were seriously injured in a fire incident at a residential house in Kariobangi South, Nairobi.




There was a slight increase of break-ins recorded in Nairobi




Residential areas recorded an increased number of incidents with burglaries and fire been the two key incidents.

ANALYSIS OF CRIME INCIDENTS IN KENYA




A total of 24 incidents were recorded in the Rest of the Country




Like Nairobi region, residential areas also recorded increased number of crime-related activities in Rest of the Country.

BELOW ARE SOME OF THE KEY SECURITY INCIDENTS




- Suspected thieves on Tuesday stole vehicle parts from five lorries parked at Daraja Mbili police post in Kisumu County.
- Three carjackers were on Tuesday arrested at a shopping mall in Nyali, Mombasa County.
- Three men are accused to have on Wednesday defiled a 13-year-old girl in Narok North sub-county, Narok County.
- Police on Thursday night shot dead a suspect involved in a chief's death following a shootout at a residential estate in Nyeri town, Nyeri County.
- Thugs on Thursday night broke into an apartment in Kitisuru area of Kiambu County and made away with electronics.
- A class eight pupil was on Friday night stabbed to death by unknown people on his way to a funeral in Malaya village, Busia County.
- Moi University main campus in Uasin Gishu County was on Friday closed indefinitely after

students rioted demanding slash on supplementary exams fees and hiring of more lecturers.

- Two bandits on Saturday shot dead a man and made away with 50kgs of gum at Kola Katune area in Ngomeni, Kitui County.
- At least 10 General Service Unit officers were killed on Saturday after their vehicle ran over an improvised explosive device (IED) on the Degoh road in Garissa County.
- Thieves on Sunday night raided ACK Diocese of Nyahururu in Nyandarua County and stole the day's offering and electronics.
- Property of unknown value was on Sunday lost as a dawn fire razed down a bar and vehicles at Kathageri area of Embu County.
- A couple was on Monday night clobbered to death by robbers who raided their home in Kandakame village of Kithimu sub-location, Embu County.

 A form one student was on Monday night defiled and murdered in Subukia, Nakuru County.
