OVERVIEW

The continuous heavy downpours experienced in major parts of the Country have seen criminals take advantage of the situation to hijack motorists, rob passengers, homes, and business premises. The public is advised to exercise the necessary caution as our security sources report of a couple that was on Saturday carjacked and robbed in Kinangop, Nyandarua County.

Other than the above, there were growing concerns regarding the emergence of criminal gangs in Kisauni, Mombasa County and areas around Kijabe Mission Centre in Nakuru County. The police have so far taken the necessary measures and intensified patrols in the mentioned areas.





HIGHLIGHTS OF THE WEEK NAIROBI

The notable incidents recorded in Nairobi included the following:

- Two armed thugs on Tuesday night shot and injured a shopkeeper and a customer after they raided a shop in Kasarani, Nairobi.
- A group of protesters allegedly allied to a local legislator on Tuesday disrupted the traffic flow along Nairobi's Valley Road, forcing motorists to seek alternative routes.
- An editor of a local newspaper was on Wednesday night robbed at a gun point after he withdrew cash from an ATM within the Nairobi's CBD.
- Five armed robbers on Wednesday night raided a house along the 150 Runda Drive in Nairobi and made away with valuables.
- Suspected gunmen on Friday morning made away with guns after they shot dead two police officers while on patrol near the Saika Kayole Bridge in Nairobi.




A total of 23 incidents were recorded in the Rest of the Country



There was a slight increase of incidents reported in the corresponding scene of incidents in Rest of the Country as compared to the past two weeks


AN AERIAL VIEW OF SECURITY INCIDENTS IN NAIROBI & KENYA

BELOW ARE SOME OF THE KEY SECURITY INCIDENTS




- 10 people among them two police officers were on Tuesday night killed after they were ambushed by suspected bandits in Jaldesa area of Marsabit County.
- A man is accused to have on Tuesday murdered his wife at Mundeku village in Kakamega County.
- Two suspected gangsters were on Wednesday shot dead and a third one injured after a violent robbery at Kabare village in Kirinyaga County.
- Police in Homa Bay County on Wednesday arrested two suspects and recovered a homemade pistol following a tip-off from concerned residents of Kendu Bay town.
- Police on Thursday arrested
 13 youths with machetes
 and bloodstained knives in
 Bombululu, Mombasa County.
- An assistant chief is nursing injuries after he was on Thursday attacked by a suspected illicit alcohol brewer at Metipsoo area in Elgeyo Marakwet County.

- A 53-year-old woman was on Friday raped, killed and her body dumped in a thicket at Matutu forest in Subukia, Nakuru County.
- A man was arrested after he on Saturday carjacked and robbed a couple before defiling their 14-year-old daughter at Flyover Market in Kinangop, Nyandarua County.
- Property of unknown value was on Saturday morning destroyed after fire razed down a dormitory at Musingu Boys High School in Kakamega County.
- Two women were on Sunday arrested in possession of fake currency notes worth Ksh.
 504,000 at a local hotel in Mumias, Kakamega County.
- A 28-year-old man was on Sunday arrested for allegedly defiling a 14-year-old girl in Mikinduri area of Meru County.
- Three family members died on Monday night when a fire broke out in their house in Kathamba village, Tharaka Nithi County.

A lecturer at the Mwingi Kenya Medical Training College was on Monday found brutally murdered inside her car in Mwingi town, Kitui County.
