OVERVIEW

Police across the Country have rolled out different strategies to deal with insecurity that is likely to be high during the festive season. Our security sources in the week under reference indicate that there has been intensified police patrols on a 24 hours basis with key arrests of criminals made in Nairobi and Mombasa Counties.

Other than the above, the public is advised to be extra vigilant, as the festive season is known for notorious criminal activities such as muggings, drunk driving, and the formation of criminal gangs.




HIGHLIGHTS OF THE WEEK NAIROBI


The notable incidents recorded in Nairobi included the following:

- Three armed robbers disguising as passengers on Tuesday robbed a matatu tout of Ksh. 5000 at gunpoint in Dandora.
- A 23-year-old man is accused to have on Thursday night robbed two women of their valuables in Mathare.
- One person was on Friday arrested and an assortment of contraband goods confiscated in Donholm area following an intelligence-led operation by DCI detectives based in Parklands.
- Five armed thugs on Saturday evening carried out a robbery incident at a house in 1st Parklands Avenue.
- Several people sustained injuries after a fire broke out at Laini Saba area in Kibera informal settlement destroying residential premises.
- Police on Monday night shot dead two armed thugs at Kayole Junction area in Nairobi County after they stole a Toyota Allion car from the neighbouring Kiambu County.




There was a slight upsurge of robbery-related activities with criminals taking advantage of the rains.




There was a notable reduction in the criminal activities reported in the corresponding scene of incidents









AN AERIAL VIEW OF SECURITY INCIDENTS IN NAIROBI & KENYA

BELOW ARE SOME OF THE KEY SECURITY INCIDENTS




- Armed robbers on Tuesday injured a 76-year-old year night security guard and made away with property after they broke into Imara Supermarket in Vihiga County
- Two wanted criminals believed to have been terrorising residents in Likoni, Mombasa County, were on Tuesday arrested by DCI detectives following a tip-off from members of public.
- A chief and his assistant were on Wednesday killed in cold blood by unknown assailants inside their offices in Mbwajumwali village, Lamu County.
- Police in Bungoma County on Wednesday arrested a man suspected to be behind a series of robberies and burglaries in Webuye town. The 43-year-old suspect was arrested with a toy pistol and military regalia at his house in Milimani area on the outskirts of Webuye town.

- A woman is accused to have on Thursday stabbed her husband to death at Gorofa estate in Pipeline, Nakuru County.
- A 33-year-old man on Saturday stabbed himself to death at Rodi Kopany market in Homa Bay County after he allegedly failed to kill his ex-girlfriend.
- Police in Isiolo County are holding a man suspected of killing his friend in Kulamawe area, on the outskirts of Isiolo town on Saturday.
- A 30-year-old woman and her 11-year-old daughter were on Sunday found stabbed to death inside their house at Landless area in Thika, Kiambu County.
- Three suspects forensically linked to a series of reported cases of robberies with violence, rape, and defilement cases in Kakamega County were on Sunday arrested and an assortment of stolen items recovered from them following a raid by DCI detectives.

 Police in Uasin Gishu County on Monday arrested a man in Eldoret for having Ksh.
 45.8 million in fake dollars and pounds and making new Kenyan currency.
