## **OVERVIEW**

The first week of December 2019 noted a decrease in the number of criminal activities based on our security sources. Of particular interest in the week under reference were the intensified police patrols and increased public co-operation that saw several incidents averted.

Other than the above, the continuous heavy rains experienced in the country have led to the increased number of casualties ranging from landslides to extreme cases of displacement of persons and deaths. The public is advised to be on the lookout and move to safer grounds as the heavy downpours are expected to continue throughout December. Motorists are also cautioned to take extreme caution before attempting to cross streams or rivers which have burst their banks for their own security. We have already lost many innocent lives through such wrong misjudgements in the recent past.




## HIGHLIGHTS OF THE WEEK NAIROBI


The notable incidents recorded in Nairobi included the following:

- A police vehicle was on Tuesday reported stolen from the Shauri Moyo police lines and later recovered in Mwingi, Kitui County.
- Several vehicles on Wednesday burnt after a transformer blew up at Daystar University, Nairobi Campus.
- A police constable of Railways Police station and three other civilians-all suspects of robbery with violence-were on Thursday arrested having robbed a man of Ksh. 20,000 within Upper Hill after a false arrest and forcing him to withdraw all his savings at an ATM booth.
- Suspected armed robbers on Thursday shot and injured a police officer following a robbery incident at a shop in Nairobi.
- A man is accused to have on Sunday assaulted a police officer as he resisted arrest at the Tsavo-Accra Road junction in Nairobi.
- Detectives from the Directorate of Criminal Investigations acting on a tip off on Monday arrested a foreigner with fake US dollars at a house in Pangani.




In this reporting week, fire cases were of major concern affecting residential premise.


## AN AERIAL VIEW OF SECURITY INCIDENTS IN NAIROBI & KENYA

## BELOW ARE SOME OF THE KEY SECURITY INCIDENTS



- A 25-year-old woman was on Tuesday found dead at their family house in Landless area, Kiambu County.
- Detectives on Wednesday arrested four people and impounded three vehicles that were transporting coffee without a permit in Mathira area, Nyeri County.
- A primary school teacher from Kibingoti village in Kirinyaga County was on Wednesday left counting losses after she set her house on fire while attempting to burn a snake that had entered the house.
- Police in Busia are investigating the murder of a 60-year-old woman who was on Thursday found dead in her house at Bukhalalire village in Butula Sub-County.
- At least 11 people on Friday died after a bus they were travelling in was ambushed by suspected Al Shabaab militants in Wajir County.

- Four suspects believed to be members of the Wakili Kwanza gang were on Friday arrested by DCI detectives at Kizingo, Mombasa County.
- More than 20 vehicles were on Saturday destroyed and their occupants assaulted following attacks by a gang of youth in the outskirts of Nakuru town, Nakuru County.
- A Form Two student is accused to have on Sunday stabbed her 29-year-old boyfriend to death over cheating claims at Boito area in Konoin, Bomet County.
- A 74-year-old man was on Sunday hacked to death by unknown assailants at his home in Funyula, Busia County.
- Two young men both suspects of robbery with violence were on Monday night arrested by detectives and a pistol loaded with five rounds of ammunition recovered from them following a robbery incident in Kikuyu, Kiambu County.

 A 23-year-old man is accused to have on Monday stabbed his 15-year-old cousin to death at Sinderma village in Gem, Siaya County.
