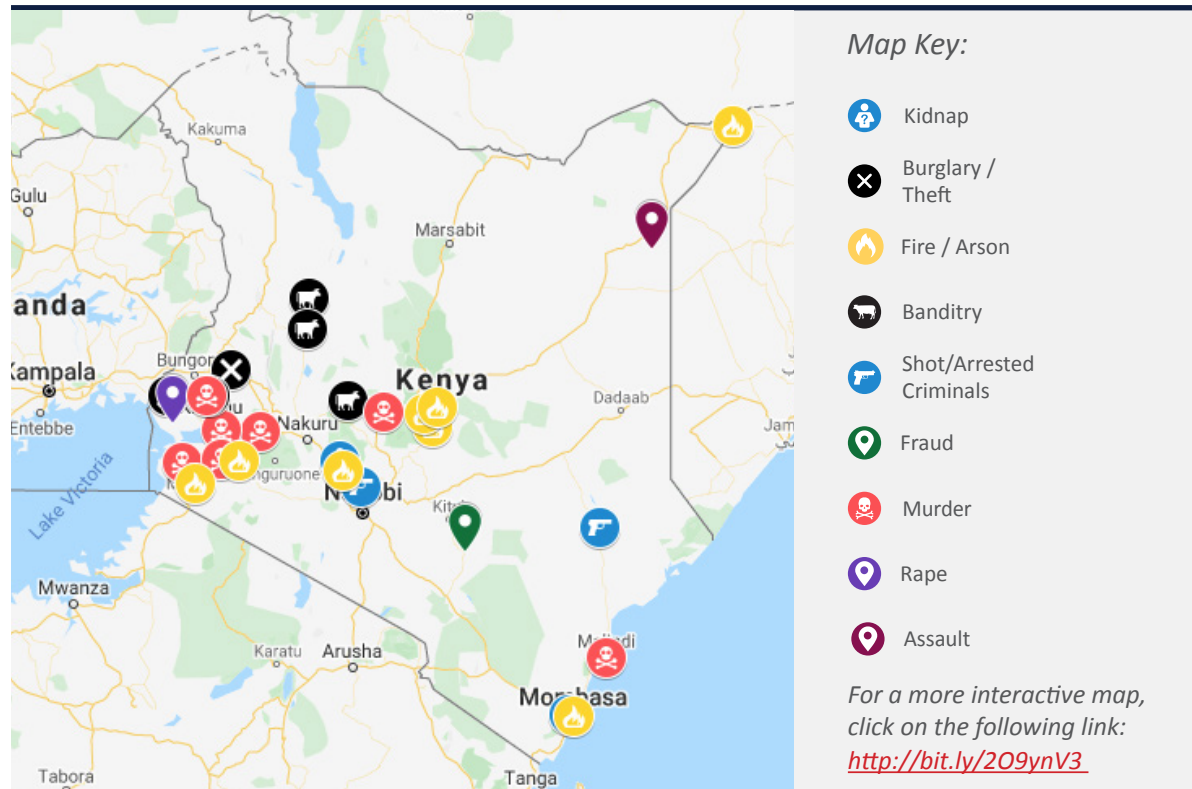


OVERVIEW

AN AERIAL VIEW OF SECURITY INCIDENTS IN KENYA

This week's assurance given by the Government to combat contrabands and smuggling businesses in the North Eastern part of the Country will be a vital step towards the war on terror related activities. As the month ends, our security sources have so far noted a considerable decline in the terror-related incidents. We can attribute this decline to the fact that security agencies across the country are on high alert, with instructions to be on the lookout for suspicious characters in social entities and key government premises.

Other than the above, cases of fire incidents continued to be of great concern for a consecutive week with a particular focus on schools. For instance, the burning of a dormitory at Moi Girls School in Mandera for a second time in two weeks prompted the arrests of two teachers who were on duty and two police reservists who were guarding the schools for questioning.

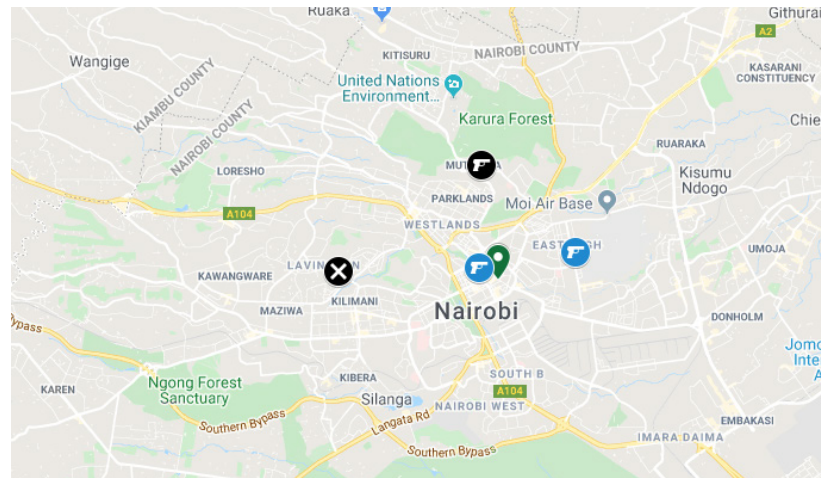


HIGHLIGHTS OF THE WEEK NAIROBI





Nairobi had a sharp decline in the number of general incidents reported. Of the few that were recorded, the most notable incidents were as follows:

- The Anti-Terror Police Unit on Tuesday arrested 43 people among them, 38 students of two colleges in Eastleigh area of Nairobi on suspicion that they were being trained as terrorists.
- A team of security officers acting on a tip off about a phone syndicate on Friday raided an electronic shop located at Pwani Guest House building along Kamae road in Nairobi and confiscated goods worth Ksh. 6.5 million.
- Directorate of Criminal Investigations detectives and police officers based at Kamukunji in Nairobi County on Saturday pursued and arrested three criminal suspects along Kirinyaga road.
- Detectives based at Kilimani in Nairobi County on Sunday arrested four suspected burglars following reports of increased cases of criminals operating on boda bodas within Kilimani and Kileleshwa areas within Nairobi County.
- A gang of suspected thieves on Monday night poisoned two guard dogs at a private residence in Muthaiga before stealing electronic goods, jewellery and cash.

AN AERIAL VIEW OF SECURITY INCIDENTS IN NAIROBI



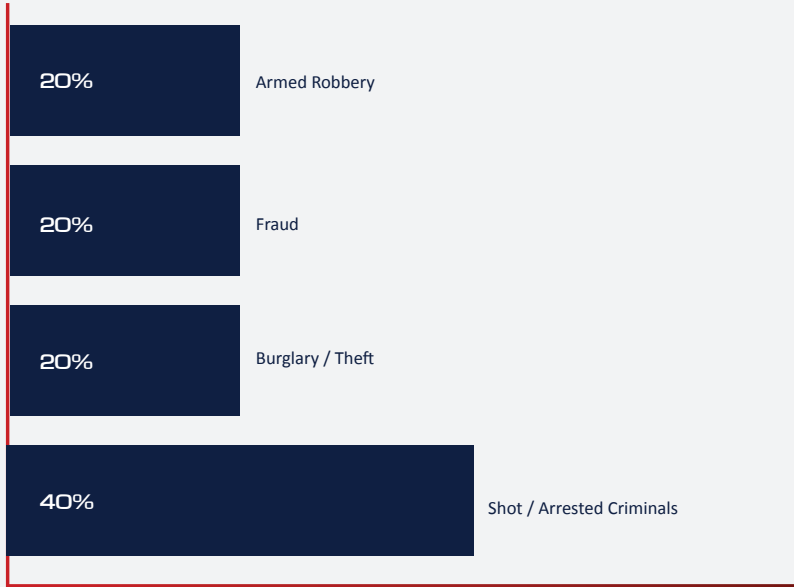
Map Key:

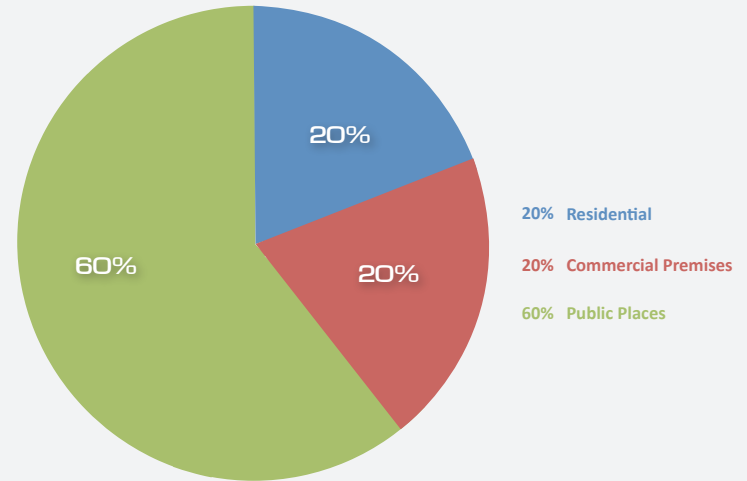

Continuous police interventions helped minimize cases of robbery-related incidents as per the above chart

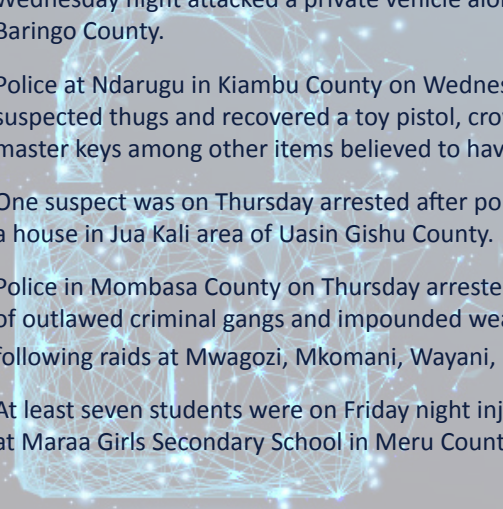
SCENE OF INCIDENTS ANALYSIS IN RELATION TO INCIDENTS



There was a notable decline in the number of incidents reported against their corresponding scene of events in the last week of January as compared to the past three

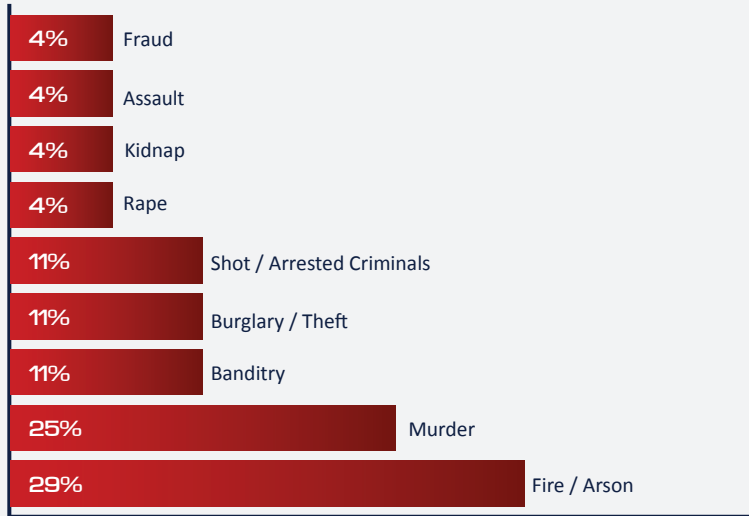
KEY SECURITY INCIDENTS FROM AROUND KENYA

- Thugs on Tuesday night broke into Bukhakhala Primary School in Busia County and stole a projector, books, and other computer accessories from the school.
- Detectives based at Mutomo Sub-County of Kitui County on Tuesday arrested a fraudster who had been impersonating as a DCI detective based in Kilifi County.
- Two people are nursing gunshot wounds after suspected bandits on Wednesday night attacked a private vehicle along Learata-Wamba road in Baringo County.
- Police at Ndarugu in Kiambu County on Wednesday morning shot dead 3 suspected thugs and recovered a toy pistol, crow bars, metal cutter, and master keys among other items believed to have been stolen.
- One suspect was on Thursday arrested after police seized stolen items at a house in Jua Kali area of Uasin Gishu County.
- Police in Mombasa County on Thursday arrested 12 suspected members of outlawed criminal gangs and impounded weapons from them following raids at Mwagozi, Mkomani, Wayani, Kwahola, and Nuru areas.
- At least seven students were on Friday night injured after a fire erupted at Maraa Girls Secondary School in Meru County.
- Two people were on Friday morning reported injured after suspected Al-Shabaab militants ambushed a passenger bus at Khorof Kharar in Wajir County.
- Police have mounted a search for a gang that on Saturday morning hacked to death a 60-year-old woman and escaped without stealing anything at Nyariginu village, Laikipia County.
- Property of unknown value was on Saturday destroyed after a fire razed down part of Kongowea wholesale market in Mombasa County.
- Burglars on Sunday allegedly broke into Daisy Special Primary School in Kakamega County and stole valuables.
- An elderly woman was on Sunday morning killed in a suspected brutal killing 50 metres from her house in Bundo in Bogichora, Nyamira County.
- Police are looking for a youthful woman suspected to have on Monday killed her 78-year-old German lover in a hotel room in Malindi, Kilifi County.
- A police officer and two other people were on Monday shot dead and 14 others injured by Pokot bandits in Kapedo on the border of Baringo and Turkana Counties.



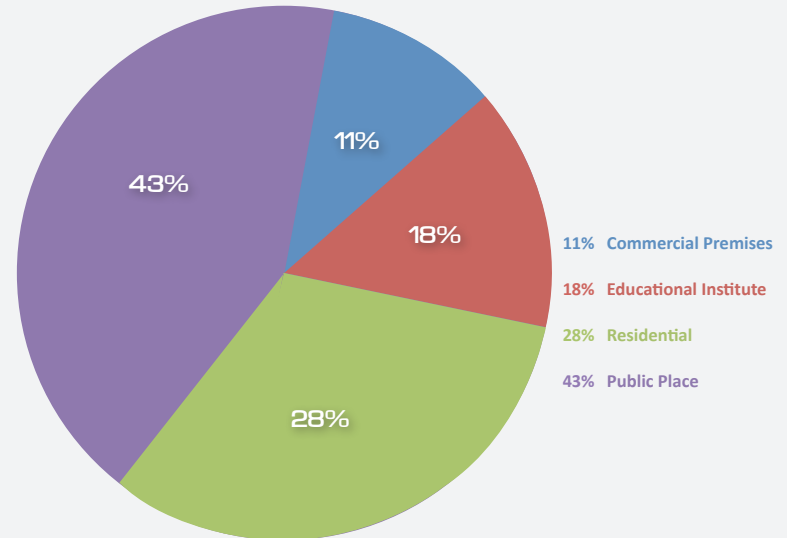

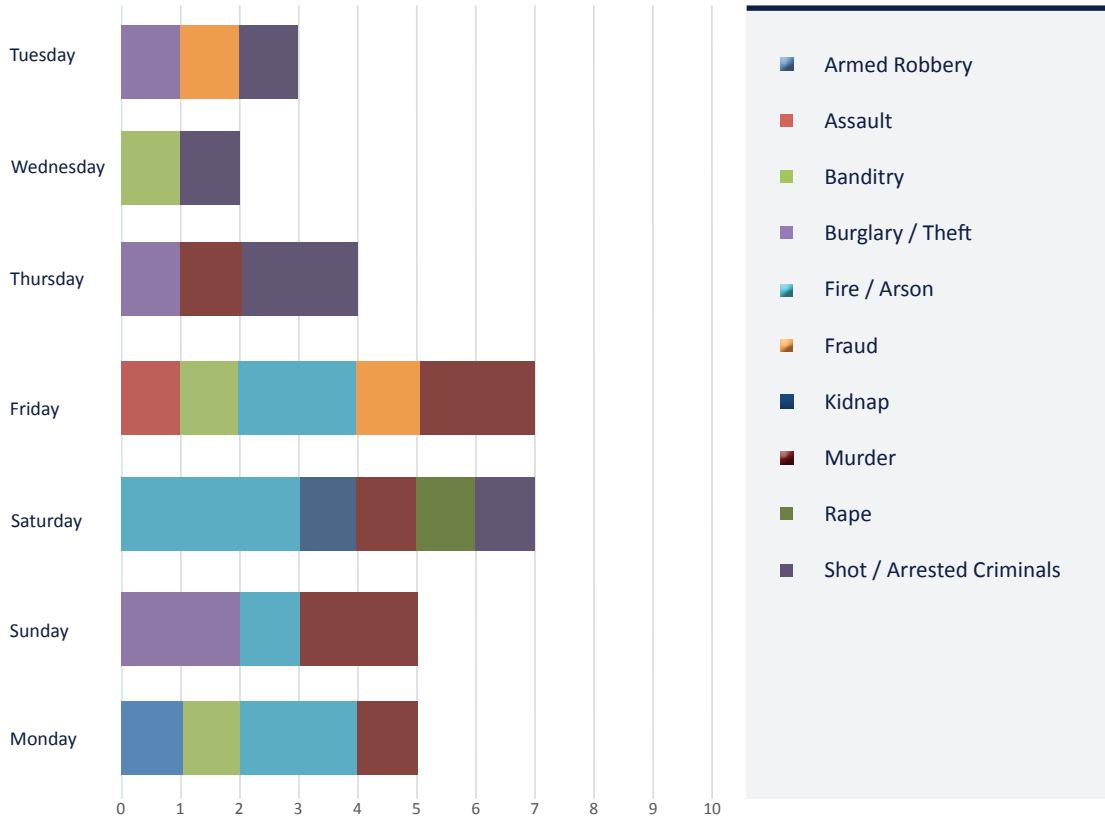
