


# **OVERVIEW**

#### AN AFRIAL VIEW OF SECURITY INCIDENTS IN KENYA

The beginning week of January 2020 depicted an increasing concern in terror-related incidents reported in Lamu and Wajir Counties. Our security sources take note of two raids at Nyongoro and Manda Naval base in Lamu County where the Kenya Defence Forces managed to save more than 60 passengers and gunned down five assailants at the respective places.

Despite the above growing fears of insecurity, the Kenyan Government continues to reassure her citizens and foreigners of safety in both air and road travel with various security agencies being on high alert to avert any security breach in the Country.






# HIGHLIGHTS OF THE WEEK NAIROBI

The key crime-related incidents reported in Nairobi included:

- Three fraud suspects were on Friday arrested within Nairobi town after they defrauded a man Ksh. 410,000.00 while pretending to be in a position to help him get recruited as Kenya Defence Officer.
- One suspect was on Saturday arrested and 243 stolen Television Sets recovered following an operation by detectives from DCI at a residential house in Buru Buru Phase 4.
- A man is accused to have on Saturday sneaked into Kabete Police Station in Nairobi and stole a key exhibit from a vehicle parked in the police car vard.
- Security officers on Sunday evening arrested a Somali-Canadian man photographing the Kenya Air Force Moi Air Base in Eastleigh.
- A suspected burglar on Monday afternoon broke into a car parked at the Galleria Mall and made away with valuables including a laptop and other crucial documents.

Fire / Arson



# KEY SECURITY INCIDENTS FROM AROUND KENYA


- A trader in Bomet County was on Tuesday robbed of Ksh. 33,000.00 by a gang of three armed with swords at Kapkwen trading centre in Nyangores ward.
- Three people were on Tuesday afternoon killed and several others injured following a banditry attack at Baragoi in Samburu County.
- Police in Machakos County are holding four suspects in connection with the killing of a 25-year-old woman who was on Wednesday found dead in a lodge in Machakos town.
- A police officer is alleged to have on Wednesday defiled a 16-year-old girl who was detained at Kombewa Police Station in Seme, Kisumu County.
- A 39-year-old man is alleged to have on Thursday hacked his wife to death following a domestic scuffle at their home in Acheo village of Kogelo, Siaya County.
- Three people were on Thursday killed and three others seriously injured when suspected Al-Shabaab militants attacked a bus headed to Lamu from Mombasa County at Nyongoro area.
- Police in Elgeyo Marakwet County have launched a manhunt for a middle-aged man who on Friday murdered his brother at Kipchumwa area over a cow.

- Five suspected members of a gang were on Saturday evening arrested after dramatically engaging police in running battles over three hours at Kipkaren Estate in Eldoret, Uasin Gishu County.
- Police in Siaya County are pursuing thugs who on Saturday shot and wounded a senior officer after they raided his home in Hawinga.
- At least 5 armed Al-Shabaab militants were on Sunday shot dead after they raided Manda Naval Base in Lamu County.
- A pastor on Sunday stabbed his wife to death before killing himself at Ground for God Ministries Church at Nguu Tatu area of Kisauni, Mombasa County.
- A primary schoolteacher of Ndooni Primary School in Kitui County was on Monday evening slashed to death and her body torched by unknown assailants.
- Traders at Kong'elai trading centre in Kapenguria, West Pokot County were on Monday left counting losses after property worth millions of shillings was razed down by a fire.




