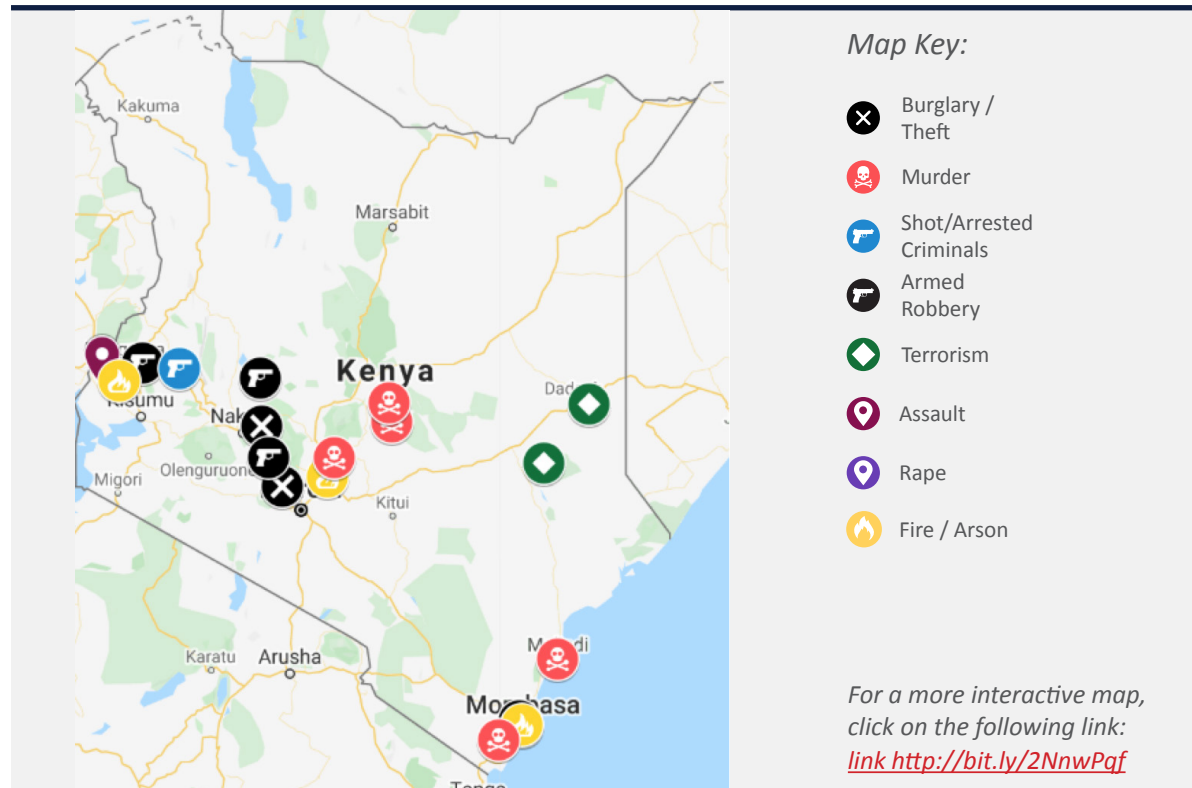


# OVERVIEW

## AN AERIAL VIEW OF SECURITY INCIDENTS IN KENYA

In the category of crime incidents under review, cases of violent demonstrations were on a slight rise with our security sources reporting such cases in Nairobi and Mombasa Counties. In Nairobi County, agitated residents of Mwiki engaged police in running battles as they protested the bad state of their road while a demonstration against the SGR cargo haulage directive in Mombasa County turned chaotic.

Other than the above, there were growing concerns over the increasing number of elderly people dying in mysterious fires in Maragua area of Murang'a County. The latest incident was of an 85-year-old woman who was burnt beyond recognition after a fire broke out at her house.

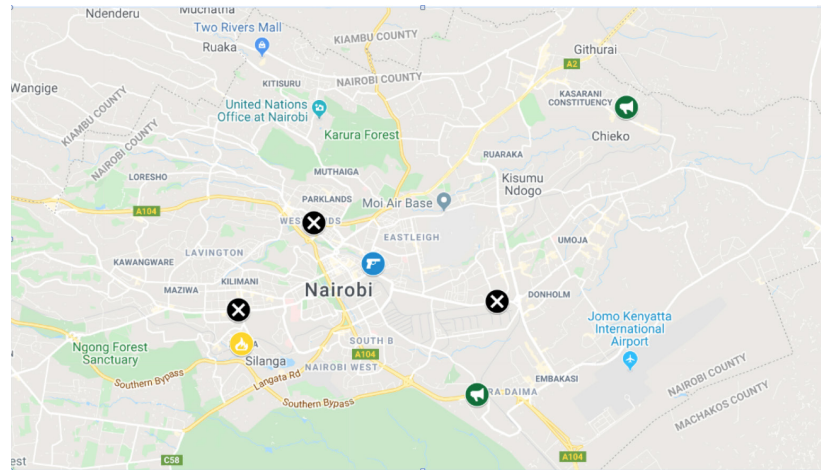


# HIGHLIGHTS OF THE WEEK NAIROBI

The notable incidents recorded in Nairobi included the following:

- A legislator on Tuesday allegedly lost important documents and valuables after suspected burglars broke into his vehicle parked at a parking lot in Parklands.
- More than 10 families were on Thursday rendered homeless after a fire razed down their houses at Kambi Muru in Kibera.
- Detectives based in Nairobi County on Thursday arrested three suspects in Kamukunji in possession of stolen vehicle parts.
- Seven members of a notorious criminal gang on Saturday broke into and stole Ksh. 900,000.00 from a parked car at a car yard along Ngong Road.
- Detectives from the Directorate of Criminal Investigations on Sunday arrested three suspects and recovered over 500 stolen mobile phones from a shop within Moroto area along Jogoo Road.
- Transport in Mwiki, Karasani was on Monday paralyzed as agitated residents engaged police in running battles as they protested the bad state of their road.

## AN AERIAL VIEW OF SECURITY INCIDENTS IN NAIROBI



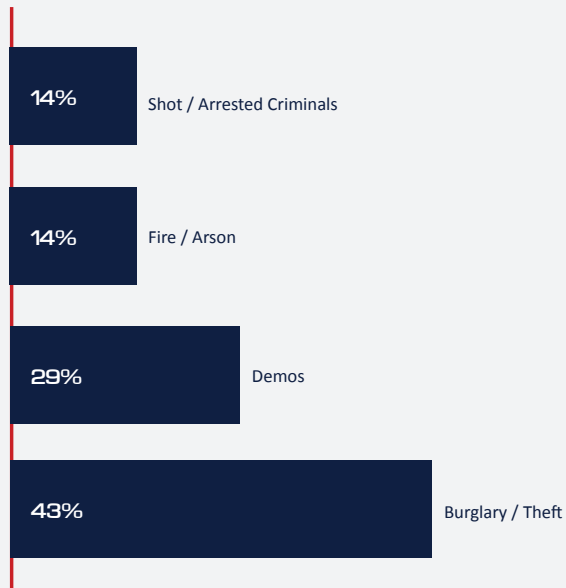

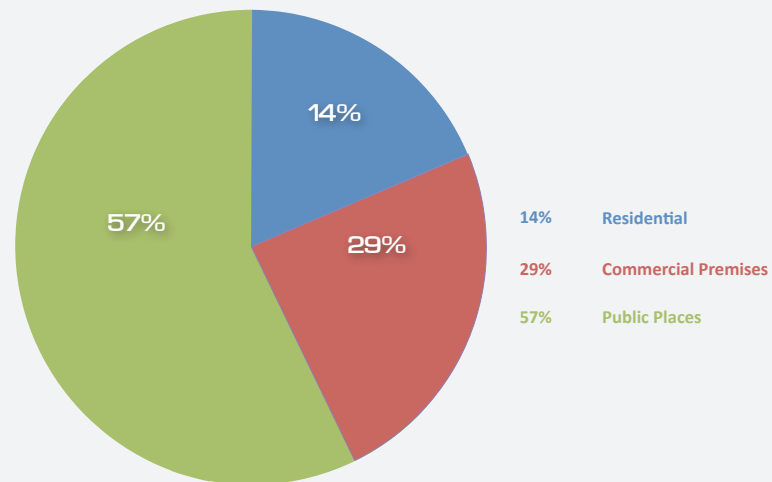

## KEY SECURITY INCIDENTS FROM AROUND KENYA

- Property worth millions of shillings was on Tuesday destroyed when a fire gutted a fabric shop in Saba Saba, Mombasa County.
- A businessman running an Mpesa shop and a mini supermarket opposite Masinde Muliro campus in Bungoma County was on Tuesday robbed by armed thugs.
- Four suspected robbers travelling in a saloon car were on Wednesday gunned down by police officers at Eldoret West on the Eldoret-Webuye highway in Uasin Gichu County.
- Police have launched investigations into a murder incident in which two people suspected to be a boda-boda rider and his passenger were on Wednesday found dead on Golden Beach in Malindi, Kilifi County.
- A 72-year-old man was on Thursday allegedly killed during a fight at a funeral of a Kisumu-based boda-boda operator at Ndenga sub-location in Ugenya, Siaya County.
- Three armed robbers on Thursday night stole over Ksh. 800,000.00 in cash and five smartphones from a business lady at Ngarua in Laikipia County.
- A police officer on Friday night allegedly shot dead a civilian at Kunati Police Station in Meru County following a disagreement over beer.
- An 84-year-old man was on Friday beheaded by unknown attackers at his home in Burani village, Kwale County.
- Two churches at Passenga township in Nyandarua County were on Saturday night broken into and electronics stolen.
- A suspected thief on Sunday broke into a house and stole household items in Mai Mahiu area of Naivasha, Nakuru County.
- Suspected Al-Shabaab militants on Monday killed three teachers at Kamuthe area of Garissa County.
- Four people were on Monday arrested and others injured when police dispersed demonstrators protesting against the SGR cargo haulage directive in Mombasa County.

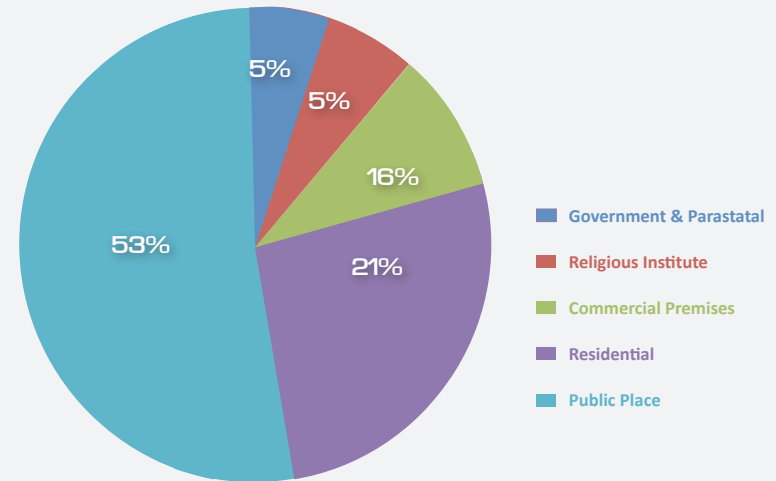

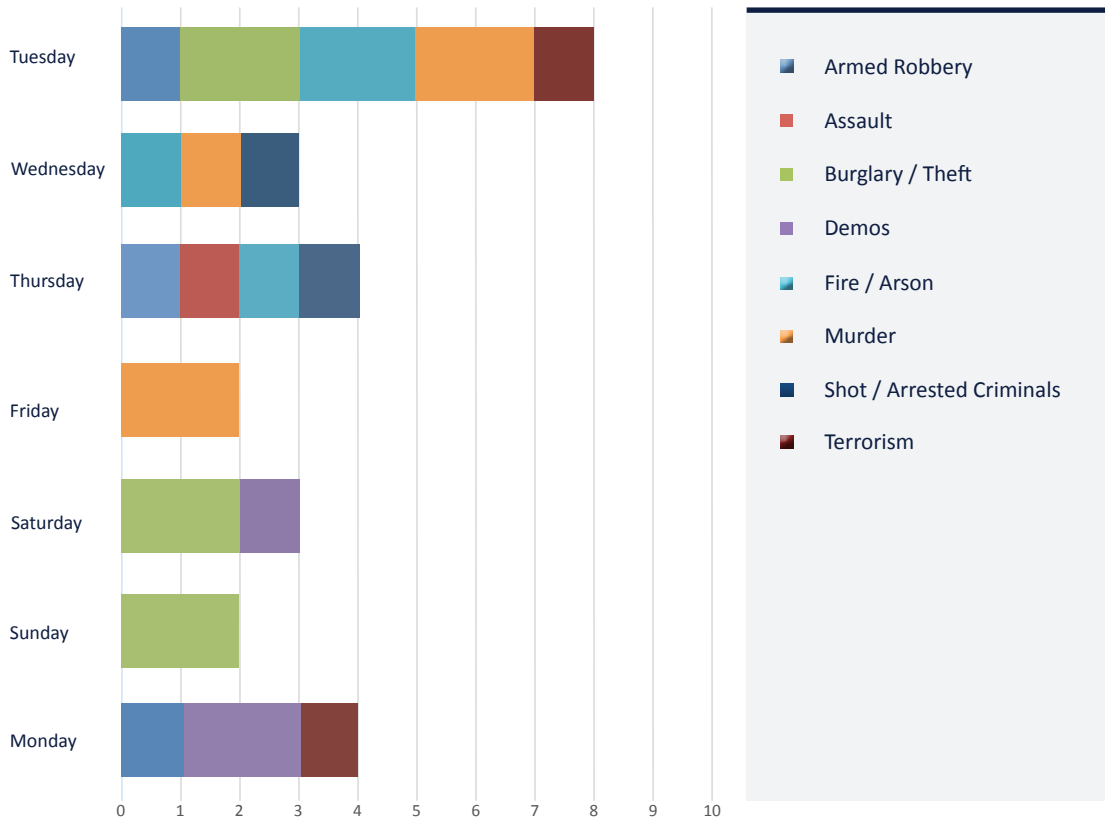
