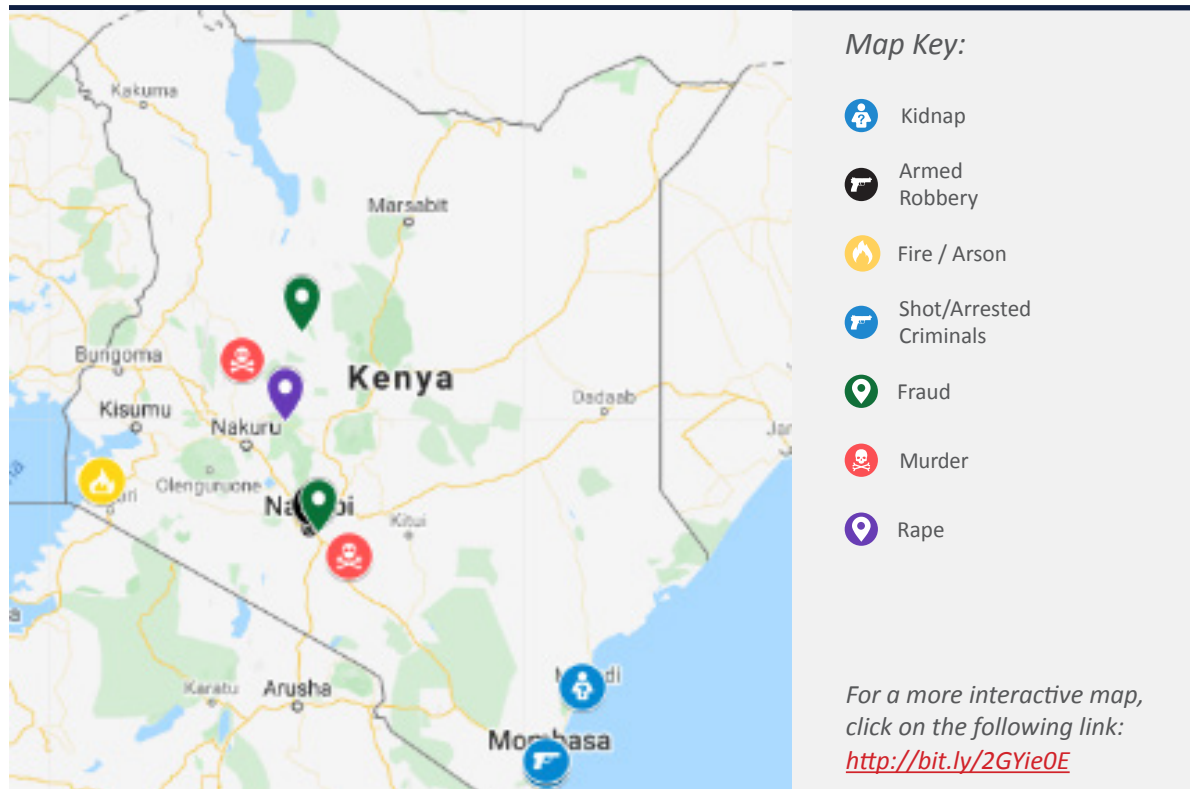


OVERVIEW

AN AERIAL VIEW OF SECURITY INCIDENTS IN KENYA

The start of February 2020 noted a significant decline in the criminal activities recorded across the counties in the Country. Our security sources indicate there were no notable reports of school fires, unlike the start of the previous month that saw the loss of property worth millions of shillings in five schools due to fire outbreaks.

Other than the above, there were increased concerns of individuals impersonating police officers and harassing both residents and students in Buru Buru, Athi River, and at Kabete National Polytechnic.

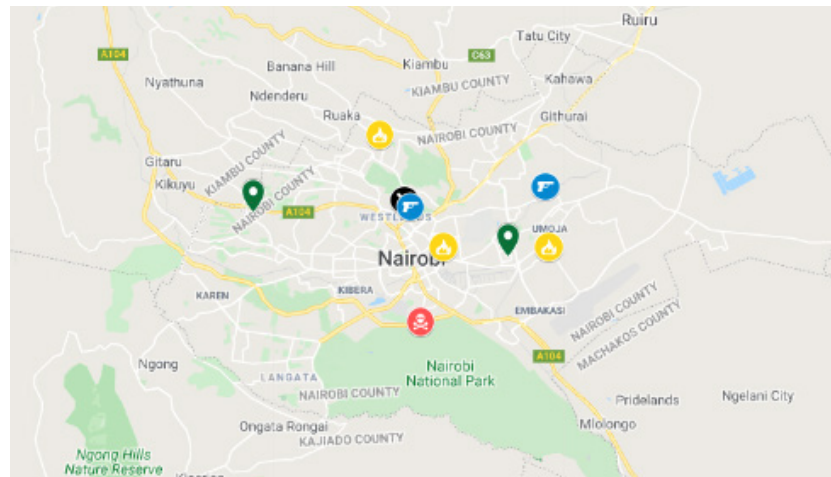


HIGHLIGHTS OF THE WEEK NAIROBI

Unlike the previous week, Nairobi recorded a slightly increase in the number of incidents as compared to other counties. The most notable incidents were as follows:

- A rogue motorist on Tuesday evening ran over a traffic police officer on the Southern Bypass in Nairobi.
- Detectives on Tuesday arrested a 23-year-old man for impersonating a police officer and harassing a student at Kabete National Polytechnic in Nairobi.
- Four armed thugs were on Wednesday arrested by police following a tip off from the public in Dandora, Nairobi.
- One person was arrested following a Thursday bomb scare at Doctor's Park in Parklands, Nairobi.
- Property worth millions of shillings was on Saturday morning destroyed after a fire razed down a section of Gikomba market in Nairobi.
- A fire on Sunday broke out a residential house at Jacaranda Estate in Nairobi County.
- Police acting on a tip off from the public on Monday arrested a police impersonator who had been harassing residents of Nairobi's Buru Buru.

AN AERIAL VIEW OF SECURITY INCIDENTS IN NAIROBI



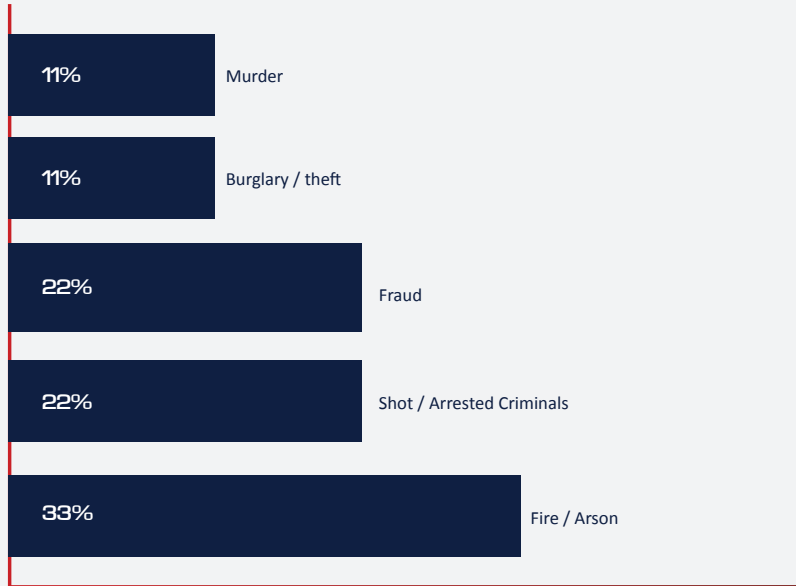

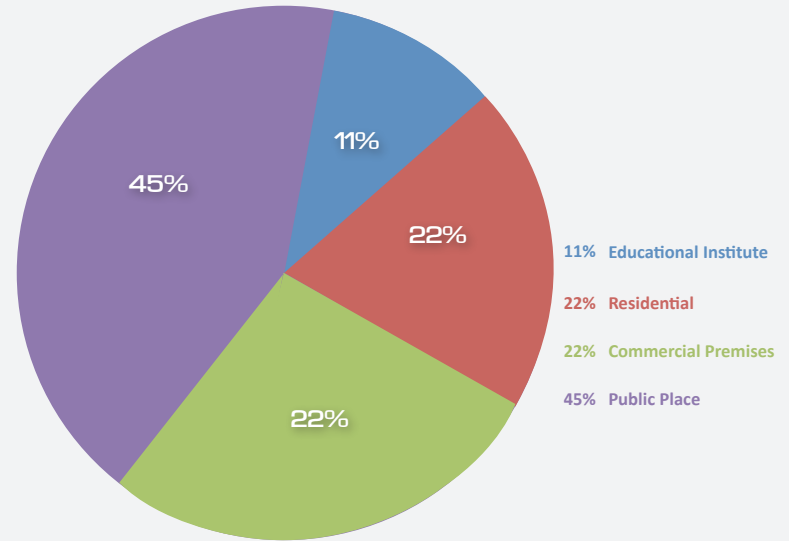

There was a slight increase in fraudulent activities involving individuals impersonating security officers

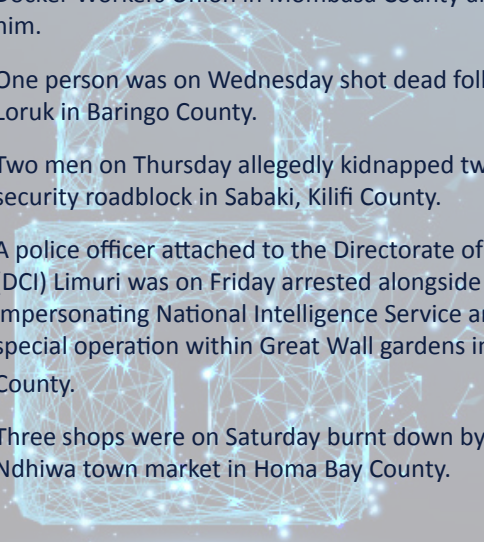
SCENE OF INCIDENTS ANALYSIS IN RELATION TO INCIDENTS

KEY SECURITY INCIDENTS FROM AROUND KENYA

- A 37-year-old man is alleged to have on Tuesday killed his mother and niece over a meal at Malindi village in Kalama, Machakos County.
- A multi-agency team on Tuesday arrested one suspect after they intercepted a vehicle transporting sandalwood weighing about one tonne along Suguta-Rumuruti road in Samburu County.
- Suspected armed robbers on Wednesday shot dead an account at the Docker Workers Union in Mombasa County and stole Sh1.5 million from him.
- One person was on Wednesday shot dead following inter-clan clashes at Loruk in Baringo County.
- Two men on Thursday allegedly kidnapped two police officers manning a security roadblock in Sabaki, Kilifi County.
- A police officer attached to the Directorate of Criminal Investigations (DCI) Limuri was on Friday arrested alongside two other suspects for impersonating National Intelligence Service and Interpol Officer on special operation within Great Wall gardens in Athi River, Machakos County.
- Three shops were on Saturday burnt down by suspected arsonists at Ndhiwa town market in Homa Bay County.
- Two suspected thugs were on Monday early morning killed following an attempted robbery in Likoni, Mombasa County.



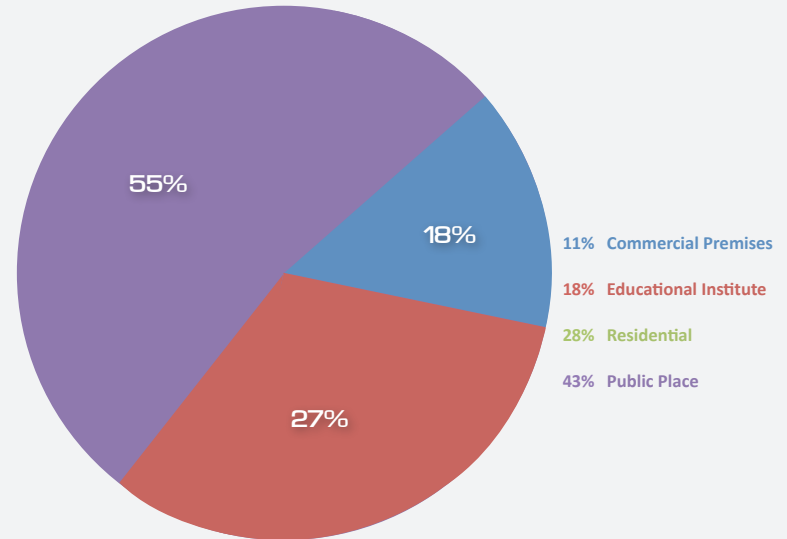

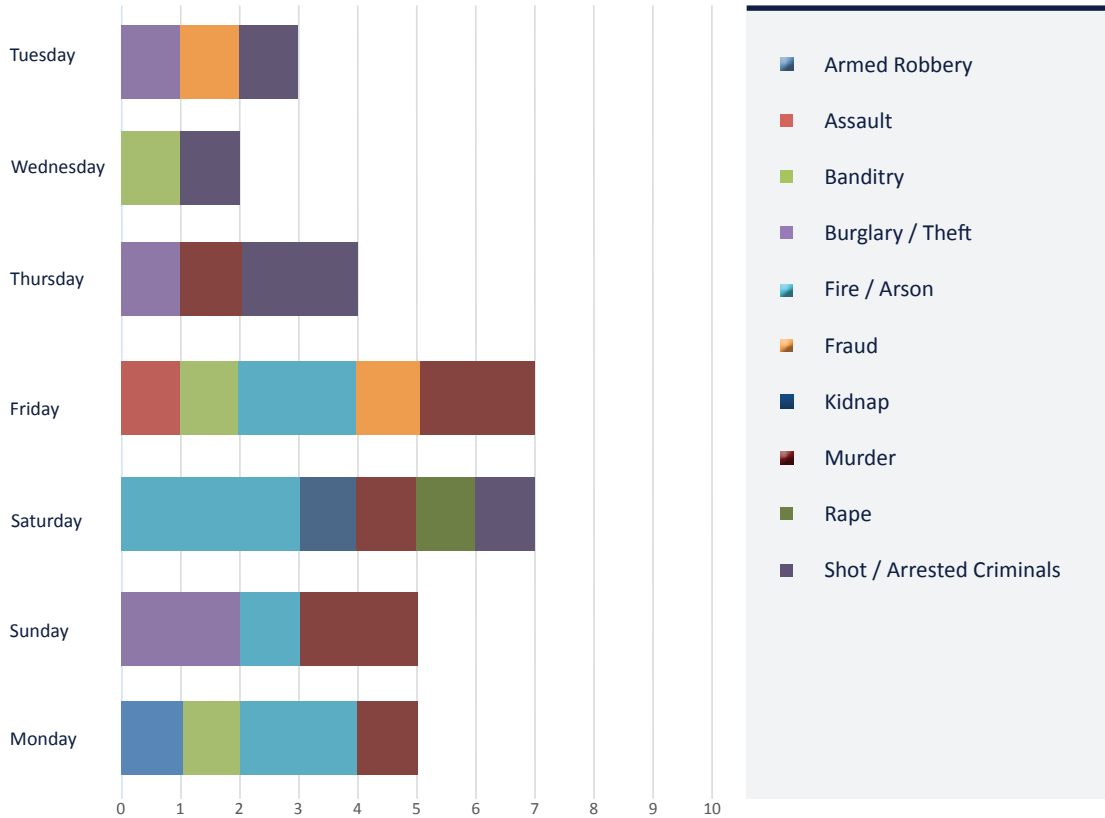

SCENE OF INCIDENTS ANALYSIS IN RELATION TO INCIDENTS



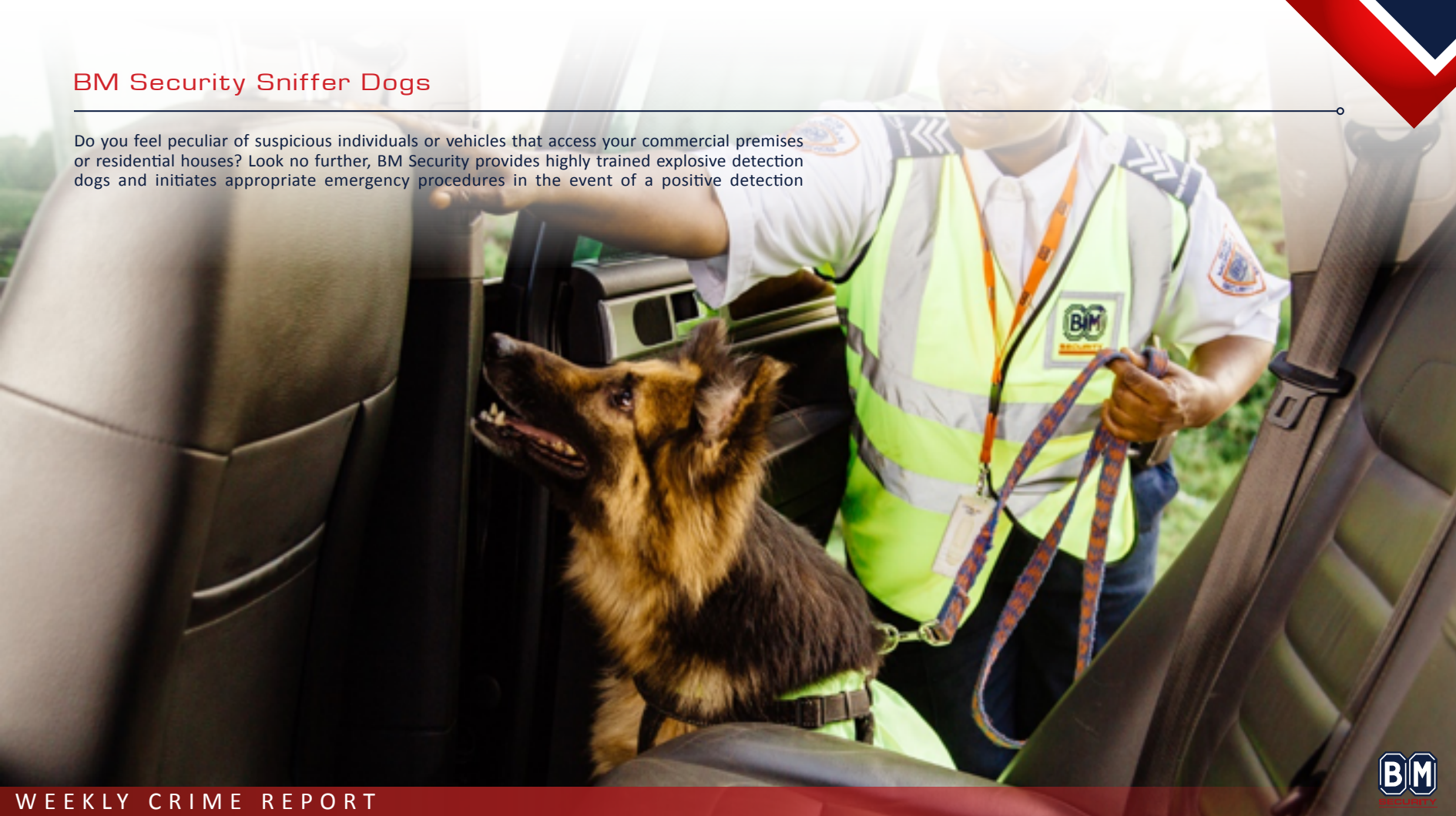
There was a notable decline in the number of incidents reported in Rest of the Country in this reporting week as compared to the past three weeks
