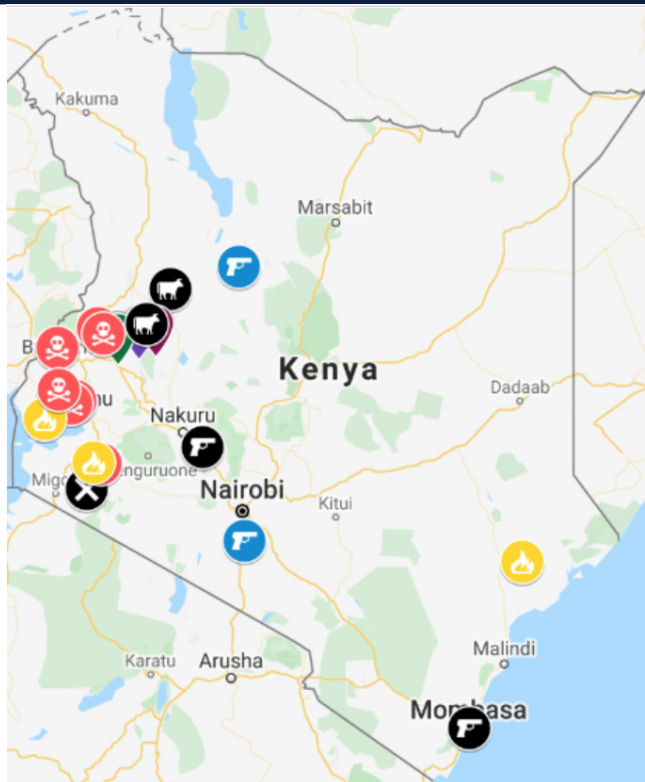


OVERVIEW

AN AERIAL VIEW OF SECURITY INCIDENTS IN KENYA

Towards the end of February 2020, our security sources recorded a slight upsurge of crime-related incidents reported across the Country. Similar to the previous issue, incidents of mysterious murders continued to be of key concern in this week under reference with the Western part of the Country recording increased number of killings. These ranged from the brutal murder of a businessman and his family in Vihiga County to the strangling of a Swiss missionary at her house in Milimani Estate of Trans Nzoia County.

In addition to the above, increased cases of bandit attacks in the Northern Rift Valley region have attracted the attention of the local leaders and the concerned security agencies. The Government has reassured the affected residents of protection and safety with a promise of restoring the state of normalcy.

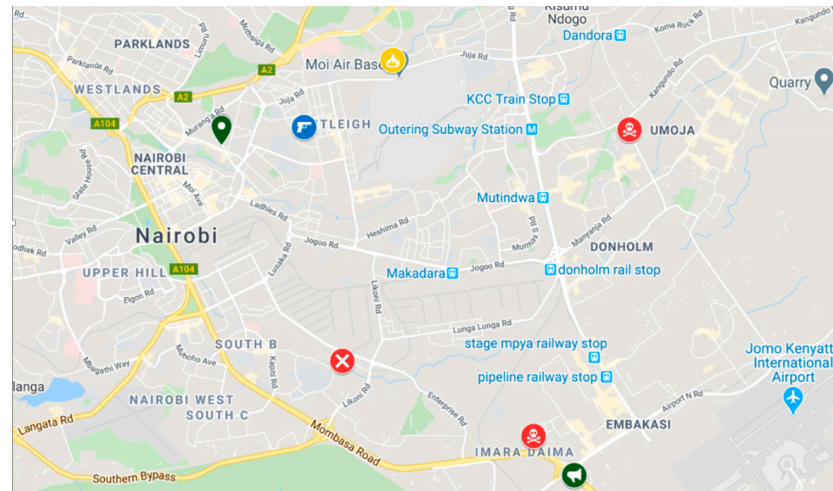

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE WEEK NAIROBI







The key crime-related incidents reported in Nairobi included:

- Six people are accused to have on Tuesday vandalized a World Bank funded project at Mukuru-Kayaba slum in Starehe, Nairobi County.
- A boda boda rider was on Tuesday shot dead by an Administration Police Officer after a scuffle ensued at Mama Lucy Kibaki Hospital in Nairobi County.
- A police officer linked to a fraud case was on Thursday found dead at his rental house in Imara Daima's Villa Franca Estate, Nairobi County.
- DCI detectives on Friday morning raided an office at Ngara in Nairobi County and busted two hackers actively on the NTSA database and TIMS systems. Items recovered during the raid were fake number plates and over 1 million cash in local and foreign currencies.
- Five people on Saturday sustained minor injuries after a fire erupted at a commercial building in Mathare, Nairobi County.
- Two women were on Sunday evening arrested over claims of human trafficking at Ushirika estate in Nairobi County
- Boda boda riders on Monday blocked the Mombasa Road at City Cabanas area as they protested over alleged mistreatment by security agencies.

AN AERIAL VIEW OF SECURITY INCIDENTS IN NAIROBI



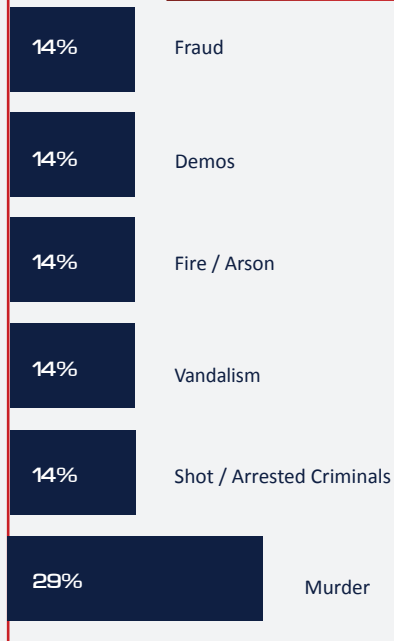

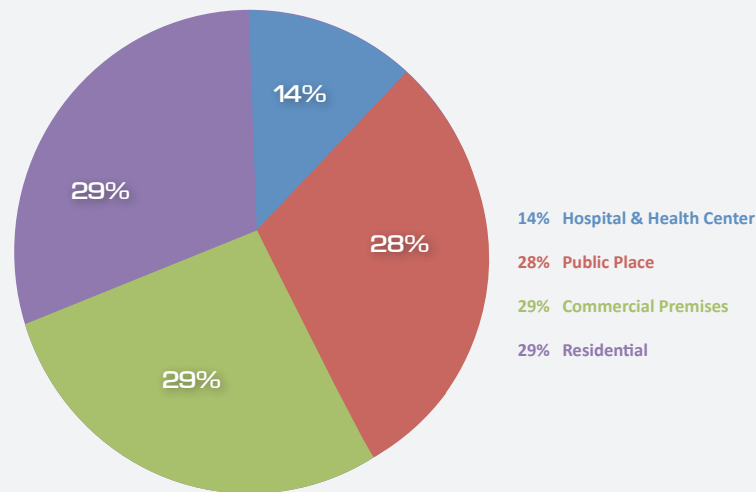

Similar to the previous week, incidents reported in public places continued to decrease

KEY SECURITY INCIDENTS FROM AROUND KENYA

- A prison warder was arrested after he on Tuesday allegedly defiled a Form Three student at his rental house in Tambach trading centre, Elgeyo Marakwet County.
- A man suspected to be behind the illegal supply of bullets to bandits was on Wednesday shot dead by police in Baragoi, Samburu County.
- A 74-year-old woman, a Swiss Missionary, was on Wednesday found strangled to death at her house in Milimani Estate, Trans Nzoia County.
- Seven suspected robbers were on Thursday shot dead by Special Crime Prevention Unit officers after a dramatic chase from Nairobi to Isinya, Kajiado County.
- An elderly couple was on Thursday night killed by five armed assailants who raided their home at Kikai village in Sirisia, Bungoma County.
- Four armed gunmen are suspected to have on Friday stormed an M-Pesa outlet in Kisauni area in Mombasa County and held employees hostage before escaping with unknown amount of cash.
- A gang of seven youths on Friday night allegedly hacked to death a Vihiga businessman, his wife and two children after their attempt to steal chicken from their Busamu home failed.
- 39 heads of cattle were on Saturday morning stolen by twelve armed men who raided Chesetan area in Marakwet East, Elgeyo Marakwet County.
- Police on Sunday arrested three suspects and recovered stolen goods worth millions of shillings stolen from Kilgoris town in Narok County
- Five houses belonging to National Police Reservists were on Sunday night torched by suspected Al Shabaab militants in Korisa village, Garissa County.
- A middle aged woman is alleged to have on Monday night killed her husband and set his body on fire at their house in Ibokolo village, Kakamega County.
- Three semi-permanent houses belonging to a family in Nyamira County were on Monday set a blaze by unknown people.

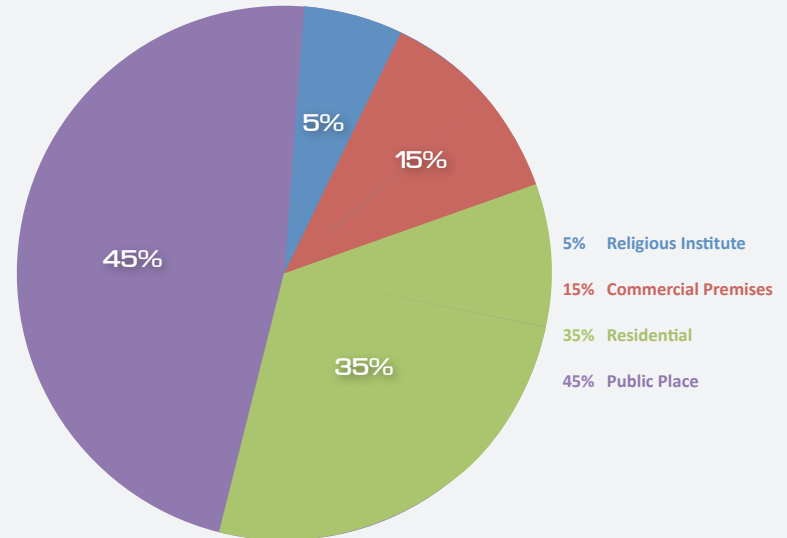

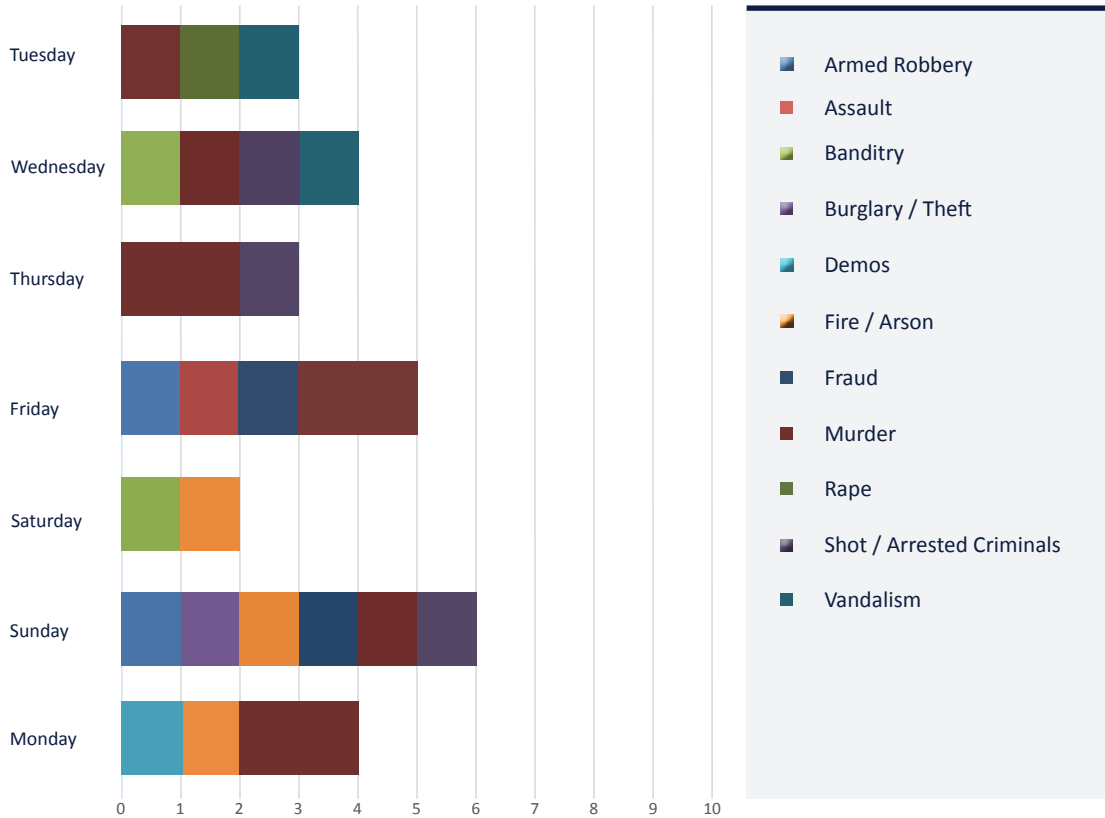
