


# OVERVIEW

## AN AERIAL VIEW OF SECURITY INCIDENTS IN KENYA

Our security sources recorded a slight upsurge of crime-related incidents reported across the Country. Incidents of mysterious kidnappings and murders continue to make highlights in the country. In the week under reference, the kidnapping of a Chinese national in Nairobi prompted the Directorate of Criminal Investigations (DCI) to track down and neutralize the perpetrators of the atrocious crime. The number of killings have been on the rise as well with cases reported in different parts of the county; Kakamega, Kisumu and Kiambu just to name a few.

In addition to the above, there's been a slight increase in fire & arson related incidents that saw the destruction of property and loss of life in Nairobi as well as Northern and Western regions of Kenya






# HIGHLIGHTS OF THE WEEK NAIROBI

The key crime-related incidents reported in Nairobi included:


- Traders on Tuesday engaged police in running battles outside GPO in the Nairobi City Centre following a protest by Prisons suppliers over nonpayment amid tendering scandal.
- DCI detectives and police officers based at Kamukunji on Wednesday arrested the leader of a notorious gang that had been operating within the Central Business District.
- Security agents neutralized four suspects among them an AP officer and rescued a Chinese national whom they had kidnapped on Thursday at the China Centre along Ngong Road, Nairobi County.
- A Toyota Land cruiser vehicle was on Thursday allegedly stolen from a residential house at Hillcrest close in Karen, Nairobi County.
- Students lost a majority of their belongings after a fire broke out in a dormitory at Lenana School, Nairobi.



## KEY SECURITY INCIDENTS FROM AROUND KENYA

- Bandits on Tuesday invaded ranches in Laikipia County and killed two rangers and a herdsman.
- A 35-year-old man on Tuesday hacked another to death after the two quarreled outside West Gate Bar in Nyando area of Kisumu County.
- Police on Tuesday arrested two people who were found with GSU uniforms at their residential house at Heshima Estate in Bahati Sub-County, Nakuru County.
- Unknown people are suspected to have on Tuesday night killed a 95-yearold woman at her house in Iyala village, Kakamega County.
- A 96-year-old woman was on Tuesday night allegedly murdered at her house in Rubere village of Laikipia County.
- Suspected members of Wakali Kwanza gang on Wednesday night attacked residents of Kisauni and Mishomoroni in Mombasa County.
- Residents of Changamwe in Mombasa County on Wednesday disarmed and arrested a suspect accused of stealing Sh160,000 from a mobile money shop.
- A prison warder attached to the Malindi GK Prison is accused to have on Wednesday murdered his girlfriend at Muchatha area of Kiambu County.

- Police in Kisii have launched a manhunt for a man who on Wednesday reportedly defiled a five-month old baby in Tambachi, Marani.
- A 42-year-old man on Thursday killed his wife of over 20 years and later hanged himself at their home in Bondeni village, Kajiado County.
- Two brothers were on Friday burnt to death when their house caught fire in Difathas vilage, Kirinyaga County.
- An M-Pesa agent was on Saturday allegedly conned of Ksh. 120,000.00 at an M-Pesa shop she was operating in Mwingi, Kitui County.
- A 29-year-old man was on Saturday arrested after he allegedly defiled a 14-year-old niece at Rapogi market in Central Kanyamkago, Migori County.
- Over 300 residents in Narasha, Isiolo County, have been left homeless after their houses were on Saturday torched by suspected arsonists from Laikipia.
- A 24-year-old woman on Saturday allegedly scalded her stepson at their home in Kamukunji estate in Turbo, Uasin Gishu County.
- At least 20 patrons on Sunday escaped unhurt after a fire erupted at Tengecha Lodging in Kericho town, Kericho County.



# KEY SECURITY INCIDENTS FROM AROUND KENYA

- Police officers on Sunday shot dead a suspected gangster in a botched robbery attempt in Voi, Taita Taveta County
- A form four school girl was on Sunday found dead at their Mwanyani home in Kitumbutu, Machakos County. The body of the deceased had visible injuries in which police suspected she might have been beaten to death.
- A machete-wielding gang on Sunday night attacked a night guard injuring him seriously before stealing money and goods worth about Ksh26,000 at Kathwana fuelling station in Tharaka Nithi County.
- Two suspected robbers were on Monday shot dead by police near Allaxis Hotel on the Migori-Rongo Road in Migori County.
- A boy aged four years was on Monday night burnt to death after a jilted widow inheritor burnt their house in Rongo, Migori County.
- Police officers on Monday arrested a man found vandalizing street lights at OI Kalou town in Nyandarua County.
- A class 6 pupil in Bungoma County is nursing serious injuries after she was on Monday set on fire by her father for stealing Ksh. 20



#### SCENE OF INCIDENTS ANALYSIS IN RELATION TO INCIDENTS








There was a slight increase in the crime related incidents reported in Residential areas as opposed to Public places


