


OVERVIEW

AN AFRIAL VIEW OF SECURITY INCIDENTS IN KENYA

Our security sources recorded a slight upsurge of crime-related incidents across the Country save for Nairobi county. Our sources indicate that vandalism cases have been on the rise in the beginning of the month of March compared to the other months. Arson incidents continue to cause havoc damaging property and rendering individuals homeless in the country.

Incidents of road signage vandalism and destruction of guardrails prompted police officers acting on a tip off to arrest and charge six criminals on Outer ring road, Nairobi. In addition to the above, there's been a slight increase in demonstrations and destruction of property by angry students protesting and engaging police in running battles, with cases being reported in Nairobi, Homabay, Nakuru and Meru among others.






HIGHLIGHTS OF THE WEEK NAIROBI

The key crime-related incidents reported in Nairobi included:

- Police officers in Nairobi on Thursday shot dead suspected gangsters as they rescued women traders from being mugged while on their way to Wakulima Market.
- DCI detectives working jointly with the NPS officers on Friday night shot dead an armed robber as they rescued a motorist cornered by five armed robbers at a potholed stretch along Race Course Road in Nairobi County.
- Police working on a tip off on Sunday arrested five suspects destroying guard rails along Outer Ring road, Nairobi County.
- A Toyota Vitz vehicle was on Monday reported stolen within Ruai area of Nairobi County by alleged members of motor vehicle theft syndicate.
- Property of unknown value was on Monday destroyed at the University of Nairobi in as students protested over the death of their colleague.





KEY SECURITY INCIDENTS FROM AROUND KENYA

- Alawyer was on Tuesday night robbed of his car and phone after he was attacked by suspected thugs in Kakamega County.
- Police are hunting for a man who on Tuesday allegedly attacked four chiefs and an assistant county commissioner during a crackdown on illicit liquor at Muniu area of Molo, Nakuru County.
- A huge fire on Tuesday burnt down over 60 houses at Lochor Ekaal village in the outskirts of Lokichoggio town in Turkana County.
- A 26-year-old man on Tuesday hacked his mother to death following a quarrel at their home in Konoin village, Bomet County.
- Police in Embu County are pursuing a farmhand accused of raping and brutally murdering his employer's wife on Wednesday at Njigo village in Mbeere South Sub-County.
- The Sang'alo Institute of Science and Technology in Bungoma County was closed indefinitely after students on Wednesday engaged police in running battles as they protested against what?
- Nyaikuro Primary School of Nyamira County was on Wednesday broken into by thieves who stole a projector, a laptop and Ksh. 20,000.00.

- A woman was on Wednesday arrested for allegedly assaulting an underage girl she had employed as a house help at her home in Pipeline Estate, Nakuru County.
- Two robbers were on Wednesday shot dead by Police at Ebuyangu area of Vihiga County during an attempt to offload goods from a moving truck.
- A 36-year-old suspect was on Thursday arrested for sexually assaulting a mentally ill man at Konoin area of Bomet County.
- Suspected thieves on ^ broke into Ogango Primary School in Nyamira County and stole two laptops, assorted textbooks and exercise books all valued at Ksh. 250,000.00.
- A security guard at Uriri Vocational Training Centre in Migori County was on Saturday attacked by students after he allegedly attacked and injured three students following a disagreement over security lights.
- A 30-year-old woman was on Saturday night killed by her 24-year-old boyfriend at Korongei village in Bomet County.
- DCI detectives on Saturday arrested nine robbery with violence suspects believed to have been terrorizing the residents of Kuresoi in Nakuru County.




KEY SECURITY INCIDENTS FROM AROUND KENYA


- Mawego Technical Training Institute in Homa Bay County was on Sunday closed indefinitely after students went on the rampage over lack of entertainment.
- Students of Rift Valley Institute of Science and Technology in Nakuru County on Sunday went on the rampage as they disagreed over election results for student union leadership.
- A policeman is being held in custody for allegedly killing a 62 year old man at Kabras Police Station on Sunday in Kakamega county.
- A 50-year-old woman was on Sunday found strangled to death and her body dumped outside her home at Kapterik village in Elgeyo Marakwet County.
- Buildings at Makutano in Meru County were on Monday morning set ablaze by rioting students of Meru Polytechnic protesting the killing of their colleague on Sunday night.
- Over twenty street urchins were jailed on Monday after admitting to harassing shoppers and motorists in Nakuru town.






There was a slight increase in the crime related incidents reported in government parastatals as opposed to Public places
