

COVID-19 UPDATE

16th April 2020

OVERVIEW

The statistics of the persons confirmed to test positive for coronavirus in the Country have drastically increased to 225 cases since the first confirmed case back in 12th March 2020. Despite this notable increase, the Government continues to set out several directives and guidelines to help curb the spread of Coronavirus in the County with the major one been the cessation order by President Uhuru Kenyatta on 6th April 2020. The President ordered a 21-day containment of all movement by road, rail, or air in and out of the Nairobi Metropolitan area from 7 pm 6th April 2020, and from 7 pm 8th April 2020 in Mombasa, Kilifi, and Kwale Counties.

Given the COVID-19 situation in the Country, criminal activities have slightly increased in the past four weeks, with offenders taking advantage of the fights against this pandemic to carry out heinous acts. It is also worth noting that gender-based violence and sexual offenses have spiked with three times more cases been reported as compared to the Pre-COVID era. COVID-19 Statistics in Kenya

COVID-19 AND SECURITY UPDATES IN NAIROBI

Wednesday, 15 April 2020

- The Cabinet Secretary of Health on Wednesday confirmed 9 new positive cases and 1 fatality of COVID-19 in the Country
- DCI detectives on Wednesday arrested a police constable in relation to the murder of a youth in Kibera in 2018

Tuesday, 14 April 2020

■ A total of 8 persons were on Tuesday confirmed to have tested positive for coronavirus taking the national tally to 216 with 41 recoveries and 9 deaths

Monday, 13 April 2020

- Eleven individuals were on Monday confirmed to have tested positive for coronavirus
- A 45-year-old online fraudster was on Monday arrested at his house in Highridge following public outcry

Sunday, 12 April 2020

- Six people were on Sunday confirmed to have tested positive for coronavirus
- A suspected gangster was on Sunday lynched and two of his accomplices arrested at Mukuru Kaiyaba slum in Nairobi

Saturday, 11 April 2020

 Some residents at Nyayo Estate in Nairobi who were holding a birthday combined with Easter Party were on Saturday arrested and placed under 14 day mandatory quarantine

Friday, 10 April 2020

- Five people were on Friday confirmed to have tested positive for coronavirus.
- Over Ksh. 10 million worth of mobile phones were on Friday stolen while on transit from African Cargo at JKIA to Rolling Cargo Ltd warehouse in Eastleigh

Thursday, 9 April 2020


- Five people were on Thursday confirmed to have tested positive for coronavirus.
- Police on Thursday arrested Siaya priest after he was discharged from Kenyatta National Hospital for knowingly spreading COVID-19.

Tuesday, 7 April 2020

- The Cabinet Secretary of Health on Tuesday confirmed that 14 individuals tested positive for COVID-19.
- Three patients were on Tuesday released from the isolation wards after they recovered from the COVID-19 disease.
- All golf clubs and clubhouses were on Tuesday ordered to closed immediately to stop the spread of COVID-19.

COVID-19 AND SECURITY UPDATES AROUND KENYA

Below are some of the key COVID-19 related incidents:

Wednesday, 15 April 2020

Police in Murang'a County on Wednesday arrested 54 farm workers who were travelling together in one lorry heading to work.

Tuesday, 14 April 2020

A suspected gunman was on Tuesday subdued by police after he raided the Kitui County Textile Centre to demand for the safety masks.

Monday, 13 April 2020

- An Assistant chief and his expectant wife were on Monday midnight assaulted in Marani area of Kisii County by members of a gang disguising as police officers.
- Four suspected Al-Shabaab militants were on Monday killed following a gun battle with Police Reservists in Wajir County on the Kenya-Somali border.

Sunday, 12 April 2020

- At least 76 people were on Sunday arrested in Kiambu County for violating the set curfew hours by drinking in bars.
- A police officer was on Sunday evening killed by a motorist a few minutes to curfew at the Salgaa roadblock along the Nakuru-Eldoret highway.

Saturday, 11 April 2020

 Police have launched a hunt for a court clerk suspected to have on Saturday night hacked her husband to death at Getuya village in Kirinyaga County.

 One person was killed and several sustained injuries after a ruthless gang stormed a drinking den on Saturday night in Kajiado County.

Friday, 10 April 2020

- Police on Friday arrested a Mandera bus driver over transporting 61 people from Nairobi.
- Nine police officers were on Friday quarantined in Mwatate after returning from Kiganjo College where a colleague reportedly tested positive.

Thursday, 9 April 2020

- One person was on Thursday killed following the inter-clan clashes in Transmara.
- The Governor of Mandera County on Thursday ordered for the County's lockdown after over 30 people were quarantined.
- A woman who had escaped from a quarantine centre in Bungoma County was on Thursday arrested at her home.

Wednesday, 8 April 2020

Police in Kisumu are hunting down two brothers suspected to have on Wednesday killed their father's lover in Dunga Estate.

Tuesday, 7 April 2020

- The County Government of Mandera County on Tuesday confirmed two individuals tested positive for COVID-19.
- The Cabinet Secretaries of Interior and Health Ministries on Tuesday night made an impromptu visit to Rironi roadblock to inspect operations.

SECURITY THREATS

The continuous directives and guidelines set by the Government in efforts to stop the spread of coronavirus in the Country have seen a rise in home invasions, among other security challenges.

CRIME

Police have advised the public to be on the lookout of individuals masquerading as part of multi-agency teams coordinating activities of the coronavirus pandemic fight in the country. This follows reports of home invasions in Runda, Lavington, and Ruaka by thugs disguising as members of these multi-agency teams. Further to the above, "masked" criminals have found a way to conceal their identity from CCTV camera, thereby facilitating theft incidents in commercial premises like malls.

CIVIL UNREST

Unlike the previous weeks, there was a significant drop in protests in the Country with a majority of the public adhering to the dawn-to-dusk curfew order. However, there exists a possibility of unrest due to the latest cessation order of movement in and out of the Nairobi Metropolitan area, Mombasa, Kilifi, and Kwale Counties.


