COVID-19 UPDATE 17th April - 22nd April 2020

OVERVIEW

The increased COVID-19 awareness from the Government, the public and private sector has noted significant achievements towards the fight against this pandemic in the Country. In this week under reference, the Government did set aside a special isolation and treatment facility for healthcare workers as the Country adopted the mantra of test-isolate-treat and trace in the fight against coronavirus. It also cautioned individuals defying the set directives in the fight against coronavirus and unscrupulous persons selling recycled face masks to unsuspecting Kenyans.

Other than the above, there was a slight decline in the general crime trend but increased cases of gender-based violence across the Country. Our security sources take note of two spouse murders reported in Embu and Homa Bay Counties.

COVID-19 AND SECURITY UPDATES OF THE WEEK IN NAIROBI

- The Cabinet Secretary of Health on Wednesday confirmed 7 new positive cases and 9 recoveries from COVID-19 in the Country
- Unknown people were on Tuesday evening caught on video scaling the wall of the Kenyan Medical Training College quarantine centre on Mbagathi road, Nairobi County
- More than 200 people were on Monday arrested in Nairobi County for failing to adhere to the curfew directives set by the Government
- 39 women were on Monday arrested at their friend's wedding ceremony at Nasra Estate in Komarock, Nairobi County
- At least three personal cars were on Sunday broke into by unknown persons at a residential court in Parklands, Nairobi
- Suspected burglars on Sunday broke into a car parked at a mall around parked Parklands area, Nairobi
- Police officers on Thursday arrested two suspected thieves on the Nairobi's Kimathi street

KEY SECURITY INCIDENTS AND COVID-19 UPDATES ACROSS KENYA

- The Cabinet Secretary for Interior on Wednesday declared cessation of movement in Mandera County following increased cases of COVID-19 in the area
- 57 people were on Wednesday forced to quarantine at Meru KMTC after they were arrested for defying rules on containing coronavirus
- A person impersonating a police officer was on Tuesday night arrested terrorising residents of Kisauni in Mombasa County
- Markets and shops were on Tuesday closed at Kiambu's Ruaka area after it recorded 4 cases of coronavirus
- Residents of Kiplombe village in Uasin Gishu County on Monday found a headless body of a suspected criminal dumped in a ditch
- Fifteen people were on Monday arrested in Meru town for violating directives put in place to curb COVID-19
- DCI detectives on Sunday apprehend seven suspects of burglary at Shauri Village in Embu County. The arrest was made in response to the increased cases of burglary and shop breakings within Embu town during the curfew hours

- An Embu woman on Sunday hacked his husband to death after he beat her up for failing to cook dinner on time
- A 36-year-old suspect is accused to have on Sunday killed his wife at Kodaa Village in Ndhiwa, Homa Bay County
- Two security officers were among 15 people arrested on Saturday at a drinking den in Kiwandani, Kilifi County
- Seventeen people including three members of the Nyeri County assembly, were on Friday arrested for defying the ban on social gathering
- Five thugs were on Friday arrested by police at Lolwe area, Kisumu County
- A ward representative and 11 other people were on Thursday arrested for failing to observe social distancing directives in Voi, Taita Taveta County



WEEKLY CRIME REPORT

SECURITY THREATS

There continued to be security challenges brought about the enforcement of the daily curfew across the Country among them business invasions and civil disobedience.

CRIME

Unlike the previous weeks, this reporting period recorded a slight decline in the general crime trend. We can attribute this decline to the fact that security agencies across the Country are on high alert, with instructions to be on the lookout for suspicious characters. Despite this notable decline, traders in some parts of the Country have ran into losses after their shops were broken into during the curfew hours.

CIVIL DISOBEDIENCE

Our security sources have noted increased cases of individual disobedience to the set directives against COVID-19 since the declaration of the curfew hours in the Country. In this reporting week, police officers were able to arrest at least 500 persons who defied the social gathering directives following raids at residential premises, social joints, and religious centres.
