


WEEKLY SECURITY & SAFETY REPORT



COVID-19 UPDATE


23rd April - 29th April 2020

OVERVIEW

The Ministry of Health had at the start of the month, predicted a possible rise of COVID-19 positive cases in the Country to 10,000. However, at the time of writing this report, the number stands at 384 against 129 recoveries and 15 fatalities. The Government continues to set directives to help curb the spread of coronavirus in the Country with the latest action been the extension period of the containment and curfew order for an additional 21 days.

Other than the above, it is notable that a majority of Countries across Africa seem to be suppressing the infection curve, but further guidelines and directives towards individuals' health and safety will be key, amidst this pandemic. COVID-19 has and will continue to affect our way of life and various industry sectors, prompting the need to adjust now, post the pandemic era, and should there be an instance of re-infection.

COVID-19 AND SECURITY UPDATES OF THE WEEK IN NAIROBI

- The total number of confirmed COVID-19 cases in the Country as of Wednesday rose to 384 after 10 more people tested positive.
- Police have launched investigations into the mysterious death of a man who on Wednesday burnt beyond recognition inside his car in Nairobi's Buru Buru estate.
- A lady was on Tuesday accosted by two thieves on a motorbike in Parklands,
 Nairobi County.
- A suspected thief was on Sunday arrested while attempting to rob a resident of Grevillea Grove in Nairobi County.
- A matatu ferrying passengers from Ruiru to Roysambu was on Sunday attacked by robbers who drugged the passengers and stole their belongings.
- Three armed thugs on a motorbike on Saturday robbed a resident of Kyuna estate along the Kyuna Crescent in Nairobi.
- The President of Kenya on Saturday extended the nationwide dusk to dawn curfew for another 21 days to help curb the spread of Coronavirus.
- Two suspected thieves were on Friday caught stealing vehicle spare parts on the Dar es Salaam road near Enterprise Road Post Office, Nairobi.

KEY SECURITY INCIDENTS AND COVID-19 UPDATES ACROSS KENYA

- 17 relatives of a COVID-19 patient who passed away in Siaya were on Wednesday released from forced quarantine after they tested negative.
- Two robbery with violence suspects who on 22nd April 2020 shot a dead a 4th Year University student during a robbery incident at Phadam Hospital in Umoja II were on Wednesday fatally injured following a shootout with detectives at Kona area along the Eastern Bypass.
- The Kenyan Government on Tuesday banned movement into and out of Kakuma and Dadaab refugee camps to help curb the spread of coronavirus.
- Police in Nyeri County on Tuesday launched a manhunt for two people who escaped from a mandatory quarantine facility.
- A woman and her son were on Monday stabbed to death and their bodies burnt by unknown assailants at Karagoini village in Ndaragwa, Nyandarua County.
- A man was on Monday morning shot dead after clashing with forest guards in Shamiloli village in Kakamega County.

- Police in Kwale County on Sunday shot dead an alleged terror suspect at Ngerenya area in South Coast a day after he escaped police dragnet in Mombasa.
- A middle-aged woman from Migadini in Mombasa County is seeking
 justice after she was on Sunday allegedly brutalised by five police officer
 while heading home a few minutes past 7 pm.
- 8 people including a court clerk were on Saturday arrested after police found them drinking at a local bar in Likoni, Mombasa County.
- Three MCAs were among seven people arrested in Kisii County on Saturday for flouting the social gathering directive against coronavirus.
- Police in Mombasa County on Thursday gunned down two robbery suspects after a chase from Makupa area where they had stolen from a shop.
- A couple was on Thursday caught on CCTV cameras assaulting a supermarket guard over a face mask at Chuka town in Tharaka Nithi County.



SECURITY THREATS

There was an overall rise of security-related incidents recorded in the Country towards the end of April 2020 as compared to a similar period last year. Offenders continue to take advantage of the loopholes arising from the COVID-19 situation in the Country to carry out their heinous acts.

CRIME

There have been reports of re-emergence of "boda-boda" thieves in Nairobi County and its environs targeting unsuspecting pedestrians. In this week under reference, three cases were reported in Parklands, Grevillea Grove and Kyuna Estate. Other than Nairobi, other Counties have also witnessed increase cases of various crimes during the curfew hours. For instance, there has been a spate of killings targeting women and children in Nyandarua and Laikipia Counties.

CIVIL UNREST

The extension of the containment and curfew order for an additional 21 days may lead to possible unrest among some members of the public. It is so since a given number of individuals will not be able to fend for themselves and their families under the given directives.


