

WEEKLY SECURITY & SAFETY REPORT



22nd May - 28th May 2020

OVERVIEW

The 147 number of new infections reported on Thursday was the highest daily increase recorded since the virus's first case on March 13. The national tally of confirmed Covid-19 positive cases now stands at 1745 against 438 recoveries and 62 deaths.

As noted by the Cabinet Secretary of Health, the rate of the Covid-19 infections in the Country may continue to rise as the Government rollout mass testing in targeted areas and the public's noncompliance to the set directives and guidelines.

Other than the above, there has been a growing concern of crime trends and gender-based violence across the Country. For instance, Nairobi has seen a rise of thieves on motorbikes targeting unsuspecting pedestrians while up-country regions continues to record increased cases of family-related violence.

COVID-19 AND SECURITY UPDATES OF THE WEEK IN **NAIROBI**

- The Cabinet Secretary of Health on Friday confirmed 127 individuals tested positive for COVID-19 taking the national tally to 1745 cases
- Members of gang that had been robbing pedestrians along Museum Hill,
 Arboretum, Uhuru park and City park were on Wednesday arrested and taken to
 Central Police Station
- A Toyota Fielder vehicle was on Wednesday reported stolen while parked around Donholm area
- A middle-aged man in Kahawa West was on Wednesday brutalized and left for dead after he returned home late during the curfew hours
- Police on Monday arrested two people suspected to be members of a thug group that had been terrorising motorists and pedestrians along Waiyaki Way
- Two men were on Sunday morning robbed by armed thugs on a motorbike in Langata
- A woman was on Saturday attacked and her phone stolen by a man on a motorbike while walking along Peponi road
- A suspected thief on a motorbike on Friday snatched a mobile phone from an elderly man along the General Mathenge Drive

KEY SECURITY INCIDENTS AND COVID-19 UPDATES ACROSS KENYA

- A 20-year-old man on Wednesday night reportedly beheaded his uncle under unclear circumstance at Mrughua area in Taita Taveta County
- Two suspects were on Wednesday night arrested in Narok County for what security officials term as incitement
- Twelve people on Tuesday reportedly escaped from a quarantine centre in Migori County
- Six people were on Tuesday killed in ongoing ethnic clashes in Olposimoru in Narok County
- Police in Nyamira County have launched a hunt for a man who on Monday allegedly burnt down his house and killed his mother in the process at Magwero village
- A 32-year-old man is suspected to have on Sunday stabbed his brother to death after an argument at Kairingo village in Tharaka Nithi County
- Property worth millions of shillings was on Sunday destroyed after a fire broke out at Ngurubani town in Kirinyaga County

- Two suspected phone snatchers were on Saturday lynched by angry residents of Pioneer Estate in Eldoret, Uasin Gishu County
- Some Lamu residents on Saturday flouted the COVID-19 rules to shop for Idd-UI-Fitr
- Three suspected members of a criminal gang were on Friday shot dead by police at Mishomoroni area in Kisauni, Mombasa County




SECURITY THREATS

CRIME

Like the past two months, the final week of May has seen a rise in crime trends across the Country. In Nairobi, there have been reports of thieves operating on motorbikes with Westlands Sub-County been the worst hit region. In other parts of the Country, thieves continue to take advantage of the dusk-to-dawn curfew order to break into shops and go-downs.

CIVIL UNREST

The Country continues to remain calm amidst the cessation of movement and adherence to the dusk-to-dawn curfew order. However, there exists uncertainty should the Government decides to extend the two orders come 6th June 2020.
