

OVERVIEW

In the past three days, the confirmed cases of positive coronavirus in the Country have been on record high as compared to the previous weeks. The numbers are set to increase following the rollout of mass testing in targeted areas in Nairobi (Kawangware & Eastleigh) and Mombasa (Old Town) Counties. In outlining additional measures to help curb the spread of coronavirus in the Country, the Government on Wednesday announced a cessation order barring the movement into and out of Eastleigh and Old Town for 15 days. All public places in these two areas were also ordered to shut down for the containment period

COVID-19 AND SECURITY UPDATES OF THE WEEK IN **NAIROBI**

- The Health CS on Wednesday confirmed 47 individuals tested positive for coronavirus taking the national tally to 582
- Over 40 individuals were on Tuesday afternoon arrested drinking in a pub at Bee Centre area of Umoja Estate
- Thugs on Monday morning attacked and killed a radio journalist while walking home in Makina area near Kibera Law Courts
- A woman on Sunday stabbed her two children to death and later attempted to take her on life after arguing with her mother in Kayole
- A middle-aged man from Nairobi's Mathare 4A area was on Sunday night allegedly beaten to death by police officers for being found outside during curfew hours





KEY SECURITY INCIDENTS AND COVID-19 UPDATES ACROSS KENYA

- Movement into and out of Mombasa's Old Town was on Wednesday banned to help curb the spread of coronavirus
- A Toyota vehicle was on Wednesday reported stolen from Kiganjo Corner
 3 area in Thika, Kiambu County
- Police on Tuesday arrested the main suspect responsible for the gruesome murder of a mother and her son in Nyandarua County
- A man was on Monday night allegedly assaulted by police officers and robbed of his belongings while taking his sick mother to the hospital in Kibwezi, Mombasa County
- A man on Monday stabbed two people, including an NIS officer, to death as they tried to rescue his wife from being beaten by him in Kabiyet, Nandi County
- A police officer was on Sunday night killed and his firearm stolen as he enforced curfew in Rabai, Kilifi County
- A man who escaped quarantine facility in Tanzania was on Sunday arrested and isolated at Taveta Sub-County hospital

- Suspected motorcycle thugs were on Saturday arrested by the public in Thika Town, Kiambu County
- A 30 year old man was on Saturday arrested for defiling a grade one epileptic pupil in Homa Bay County
- An AK-47 rifle and over Ksh. 359,000.00 were on Friday recovered by a
 joint team of DCI detectives and police following a violent robbery at
 Kisumu Ndogo in Mumias, Kakamega County
- Four suspects at Yatta area in Machakos County were on Friday arrested for allegedly beating a relative to death after returning home drunk and demanded food
- Kilifi Governor on Thursday declared the County coronavirus-free after last six patients who had tested positive were cured and discharged



SECURITY THREATS

The dusk to dawn curfew being enforced across the Country and continuous heavy downpours has seen an upsurge of gangrelated activities and gender-based violence.

CRIME

There have been reports of criminals disguising as rapid response team tracking down COVID-19 patients' contacts in the night. In some instances, they have managed to trick security guards manning residential premises and ended up robbing unsuspecting tenants of their valuables.

Gender-based violence has reportedly been on the rise in most cases resulting in severe instances of death. Statistics show that every week there are at least five cases of gender-related violence reported across the Country.

CIVIL UNREST

The containment order in Eastleigh and Old Town may see similar measures extended to other parts of the Country should the number of COVID-19 infections keep rising. There exist uncertainty on how the public may react should the Government decide to increase the containment period in the two areas or contain other areas in the Country.








