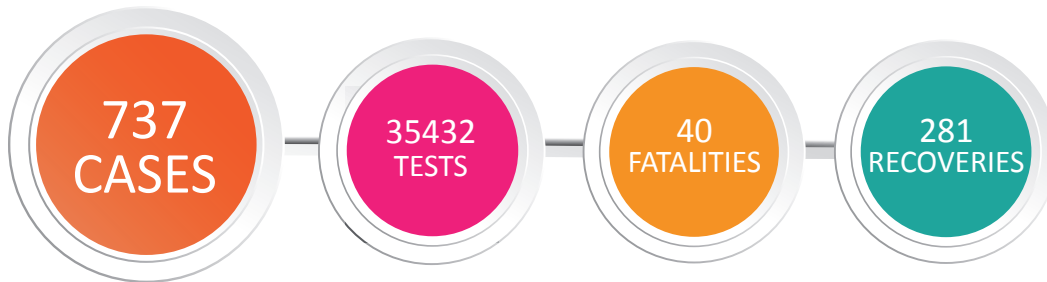

OVERVIEW

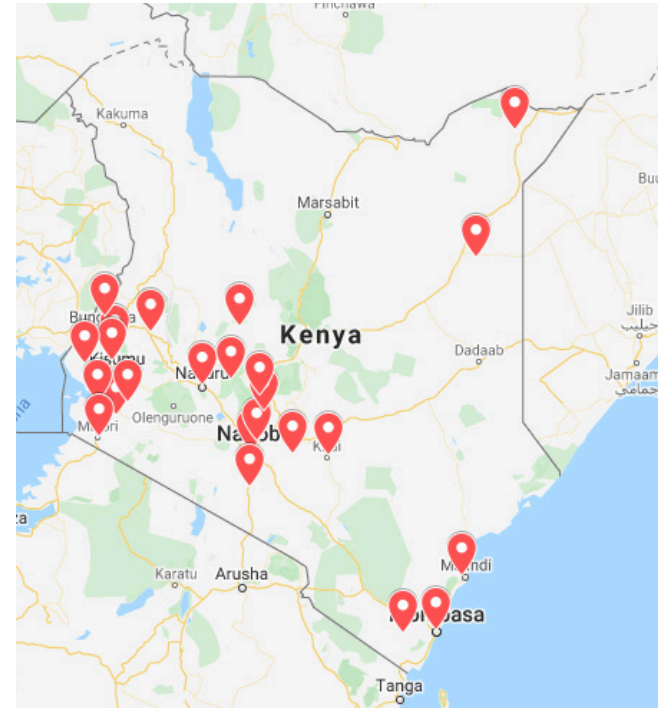
The Ministry of Health on Sunday 10th May 2020 announced a record high of 32 persons treated from COVID-19 and discharged from hospital. With 281 recoveries reported since the first confirmed positive case back on 13th March 2020, it is evident that proper management is key to overcoming the disease in the Country.

In efforts to increase the recovery rate and further flatten the infection curve, the Government continues to put in place the necessary measures to curb the spread of coronavirus throughout the Country. The recent measures include the rollout of mass testing in target areas (and individuals like cross-border truck drivers) and cessation of movement in areas perceived to be COVID-19 hotspot. The Government also confirmed that it would foot bills of suspected persons quarantined for COVID-19, a move that will likely see more people avail themselves for testing.

COVID-19 AND SECURITY UPDATES OF THE WEEK IN NAIROBI

- The CAS of Health on Wednesday confirmed 22 individuals tested positive for coronavirus taking the national tally to 737
- DCI detectives on Wednesday gunned down four suspected gangsters in Komarock along Kangundo Road
- Four suspects including a 14-year-old boy were on Monday arrested in connection with the murder of a radio presenter at Makina area in Kibera
- A 29-year-old woman on Sunday allegedly stabbed her 33-year-old boyfriend to death following an argument at their house in Umoja
- Two inmates at Industrial Area Remand Prison on Saturday tested positive for COVID-19
- Residents of Kariobangi in Nairobi County on Friday morning engaged police in running battles on the Outer Ring Road
- A man was on Thursday morning robbed while jogging along Koitobos Road in Karen by three armed thugs in a vehicle
- The State on Wednesday banned movement into and out of Eastleigh in Nairobi County and Old Town in Mombasa County
- A 61-year-old man was on Wednesday robbed at gunpoint while walking along Tedy Drive near St. Augustine Lavington

COVID-19 HOTSPOT COUNTIES:



KEY SECURITY INCIDENTS AND COVID-19 UPDATES ACROSS KENYA

- 16 family members quarantined in Bomet County after their kin battling diabetes tested positive for COVID-19 after dying at Longisa Hospital
- Police in Migori County hunt for 7 people who escaped from isolation facility on Tuesday night after 3 at the centre tested positive for COVID-19
- 8 people who went to Tanzania illegally to attend a burial were on Tuesday isolated in Homa Bay County amid concerns over clandestine movement on the porous border
- Suspected burglars on Sunday broke into shops in Molo town of Nakuru County and made away with valuables
- Transport along Nakuru-Kericho highway was on Sunday morning paralyzed as residents engaged police in street battles while protesting the death of a middle-aged man
- A 27-year-old pregnant woman was on Saturday stabbed to death by her husband in Mutituni area, Machakos County
- A 31-year-old man from Rongai in Nakuru County on Saturday allegedly killed his friend following suspicion he was having an affair with his wife
- A suspected robber was on Friday caught and killed by a mob after he and his accomplice allegedly tried to rob a 19-year-old boda boda rider in Matuu, Machakos County
- A woman and her six-month old baby on Thursday died in a mysterious fire in Mwariki Estate, Nakuru County
- Over 30 Kenyans were on Thursday arrested at Taveta-Holili border on their way from Tanzania
- 23 teachers forced into quarantine at Lodwar hospital after they were arrested during e-learning training in Turkana County

SECURITY THREATS

The dusk to dawn curfew being enforced across the Country and continuous heavy downpours has seen an upsurge of gang-related activities and gender-based violence.

CRIME

There have been reports of criminals disguising as rapid response team tracking down COVID-19 patients' contacts in the night. In some instances, they have managed to trick security guards manning residential premises and ended up robbing unsuspecting tenants of their valuables.

Gender-based violence has reportedly been on the rise in most cases resulting in severe instances of death. Statistics show that every week there are at least five cases of gender-related violence reported across the Country.

CIVIL UNREST

The containment order in Eastleigh and Old Town may see similar measures extended to other parts of the Country should the number of COVID-19 infections keep rising. In this regard, there exists uncertainty on how the public may react should the Government decide to increase the containment period in these two areas or further contain other areas across the Country.

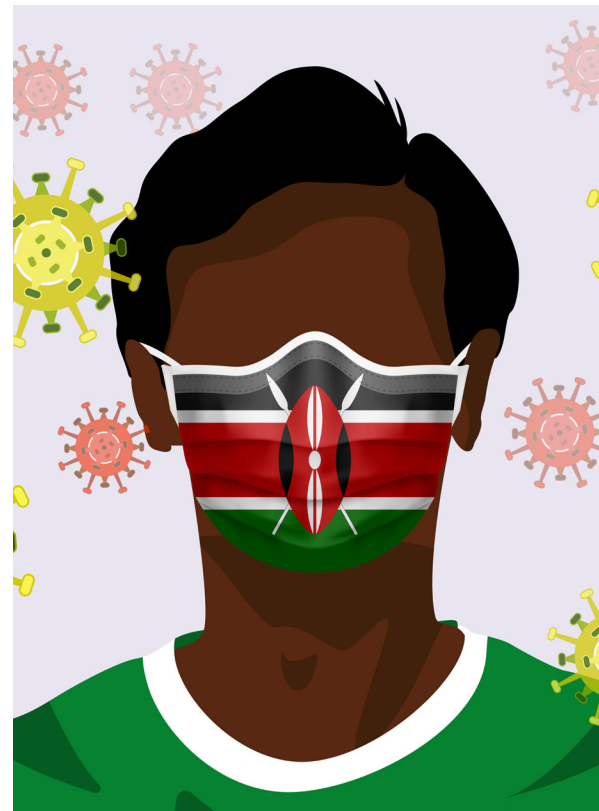
