

OVERVIEW

The Ministry of Health on Thursday announced the highest COVID-19 infection numbers, as 213 individuals tested positive for the disease. However, it is crucial to mention that this spike results from increased testing, and the numbers may continue to rise. In addition to the infection numbers, the number of fatalities was also high as 10 patients succumbed to coronavirus.

The above trends have had Kenyans worried not only on the spread of coronavirus but also crime trends amid COVID-19 restrictions. A majority do believe that crime would intensify if the Government further extended the cessation of movement and dusk-to-dawn curfew orders.

COVID-19 AND SECURITY UPDATES OF THE WEEK IN **NAIROBI**

- The Ministry of Health on Thursday confirmed 213 individuals tested positive for COVID-19 against 106 recoveries and 10 deaths
- A nine-year-old boy was on Wednesday burnt to death and property worth thousands of shillings destroyed after a fire broke out at Mukuru Kayaba informal settlement
- A minor was on Wednesday morning arrested after he snatched a phone from a pedestrian in Kahawa West
- Suspected burglars on Monday broke into shops during the curfew hours in Tassia, Embakasi
- Four people working at State House in Nairobi were on Monday reported to have tested positive for COVID-19
- Over 9.8 million worth of Bata shoes defrauded in the fake E-gift vouchers within Nairobi were on Sunday recovered in Keroka
- Three pedestrians were on Saturday evening accosted by thugs on a motorbike around Kileleshwa Tebere Crescent
- Police in Nairobi have launched investigations to establish the cause of death of a man whose decomposing body was on Saturday found inside a rented a house at Ngumba Estate in the wake of COVID-19 pandemic
- Police officers dressed in civilian clothes on Friday arrested two armed robbers who had been terrorising joggers in Kileleshwa and Muthangari areas
- At least five suspects of brutal muggings within Lavington, Kilimani, and Nairobi CBD were on Friday arrested by police

KEY SECURITY INCIDENTS AND COVID-19 UPDATES ACROSS KENYA

- Several police officer and health officials in Mombasa County were on Thursday reported to have tested positive for COVID-19 after interacting with inmates
- A 23-year-old man who was on Thursday caught stealing maize from a farm at Mugumo-ini village in Murang'a County was forced to eat the raw maize as a punishment
- DCI detectives on Wednesday arrested three suspects and recovered five stolen motor vehicles in different parts of Trans Nzoia County following numerous reports of stolen motor vehicles across the South Rift Region
- Police in Makindu, Makueni County are hunting for a 35-year-old man who on Wednesday night allegedly killed his father with a poisoned arrow and set his body ablaze together with several houses before escaping following a land dispute
- 10 people were on Tuesday arrested and a brewery closed at Majimbo estate in Embu County for manufacturing beer unfit for human consumption
- A Kenya Defence Forces (KDF) officer was on Tuesday arrested on suspicion of murdering his wife in Nakuru County

- A 65 year old man was on Monday night hacked to death by a gang of three in Mwingi town, Kitui County
- Police on Sunday arrested suspects and impounded 25300 litres of expired cooking oil in Changamwe, Mombasa County
- A three-year-old girl was on Sunday defiled and killed by her mother's boyfriend at Kabisonge village in the outskirts of Bomet town
- Four herders were on Saturday killed in a renewed ethnic clashes in Kokuto, Marsabit County
- Suspected Al Shabaab militants on Saturday killed a police reservist at Lafey area in Mandera County
- Property of unknown value was on Friday destroyed after a fire broke out at a commercial premises near the Voi SGR in Taita Taveta County
- A 33-year-old man was on Friday evening arrested for allegedly killing his wife and son in Matungulu, Machakos County

CRIME

Our security sources show that there has been a rise of criminals disguising themselves in fake security uniforms to get access to residential and commercial premises. We advise the public to be on the lookout of such individuals and always ask for identification proof. Feel free to contact your private security provider or the police should you notice something suspicious.

Over the past two weeks, police have noted a rise in crimes targeting joggers in various parts of the Nairobi City. In this regard, they have advised Kenyans who prefer to exercise outdoors to be on the lookout of suspicious routes lest they fall victim to pickpockets and armed robbers.

CIVIL UNREST

The Country continues to remain calm with no major report of riots or any other form of civil unrest given the COVID-19 situation. However, there exists uncertainty on how people may react should the Government further extend the COVID-19 restrictions.
