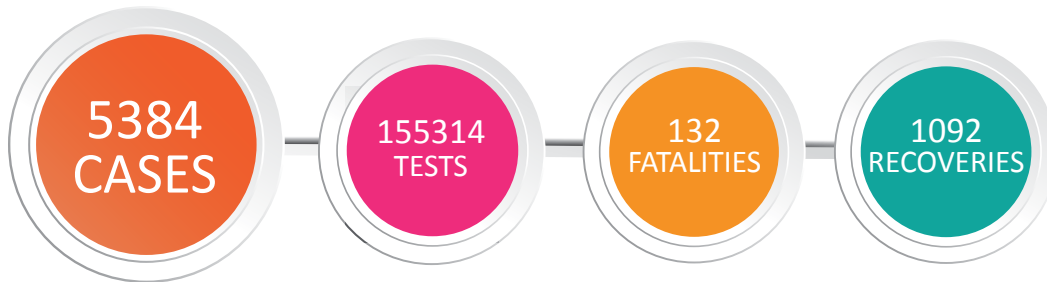

OVERVIEW

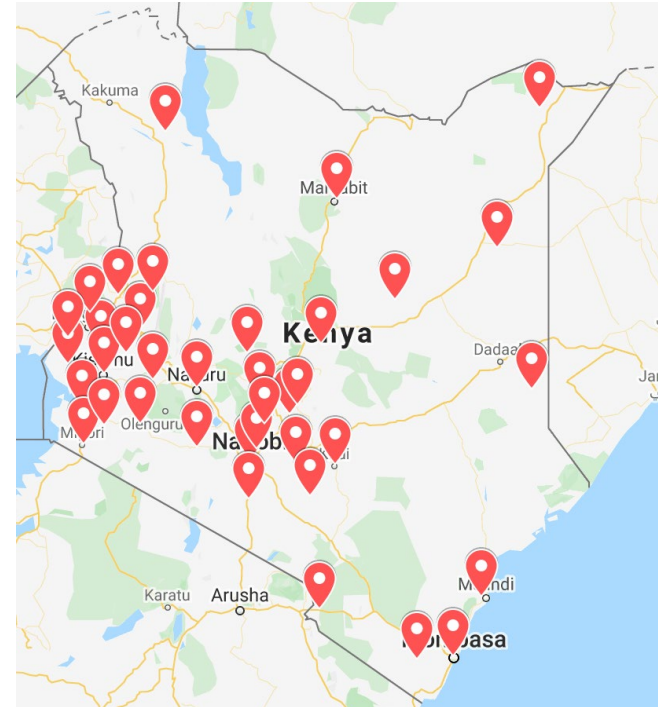
Over the past three weeks, the Country has been recording high figures of new COVID-19 infections ever since the first confirmed case on 13th March 2020. The number of recoveries and fatalities from COVID-19 have also gone up with the national tally standing at 5384 confirmed cases against 1857 recoveries and 132 deaths.

Whereas the above trends may be worrying, the National and County Governments continue to put in place several initiatives that will help contain further spread of coronavirus in the Country. With high expectations on further measures set for the first week of July 2020, the decision on reopening the Country's economy lies in the level of preparedness across the Counties in response to coronavirus infections.

COVID-19 AND SECURITY UPDATES OF THE WEEK IN NAIROBI

- The Ministry of Health on Thursday confirmed 178 individuals tested positive for COVID-19 against 34 recoveries and 2 deaths
- Property worth millions of shillings was on Thursday morning destroyed after a fire broke out at Gikomba market
- A middle aged man was on Thursday morning accosted by two armed thugs along Rose Avenue in Kilimani
- Residents of Umoja in Nairobi on Thursday arrested a suspected burglar breaking into one of their houses. Recovered from the burglar were several house keys and tools
- A jogger exercising outdoors at Nairobi's Arboretum area was on Thursday morning attacked and robbed
- A woman was on Wednesday attacked by a thug on a motorbike while walking on the Shanzu road in Nairobi
- DCI detectives in Parklands on Tuesday arrested five suspects and recovered stolen items following a series of house break-ins in the area
- A suspected thief was on Monday arrested and two stolen bicycles recovered from him at Brookside Drive Junction
- Three police officers at Kamukunji Police Station in Nairobi were on Saturday reported to have tested positive for COVID-19

KEY SECURITY INCIDENTS AND COVID-19 UPDATES ACROSS KENYA

- Two people were on Thursday killed and nine others left injured in chaotic protests at Lessos in Nandi County after a police officer allegedly shot dead a cobbler for not wearing a face mask
- Nine suspects of car breaking and theft in Mombasa County were on Thursday morning arrested by DCI detectives following a stealth operation at Furaha Apartments in Nyalı
- Police on Wednesday arrested 64 people who allegedly tried to bribe security officers at Blue Post roadblock in Thika, Kiambu County
- A suspected thief was on Wednesday stole an estimated Ksh. 120,000 from an M-Pesa shop at Nyamache town centre in Kisii County
- Police in Kirinyaga County are looking for a man who on Tuesday allegedly killed his girlfriend and buried her in his compound at Kieni village
- Two minors were on Monday allegedly shot dead following inter-clan clashes in Marsabit County
- Police in Trans Nzoia County on Sunday gunned down a suspected cattle thief and recovered a dairy cow that had been stolen
- Police on Sunday morning arrested a couple in Rongo town, Migori County for abducting a two month old baby in Ndiwa
- A woman was on Saturday allegedly killed by her partner at Kyang'ombe area of Kitengela town, Kajiado County
- 38 teenagers were on Saturday arrested in Kisii County for flouting COVID-19 containment rules
- Five suspects were on Friday arrested in Bungoma County following the murder of a prominent businessman
- A police officer was on Friday shot dead by unknown gunmen in Weradhe area of Garissa County

SECURITY THREATS

CRIME

This reporting week has seen an increased number of home invasions and shop break-ins recorded in various parts of the Country. For instance, residents of Nyamache, Kisii County have decried of a gang of robbers who have been terrorising them for weeks. In Nairobi, DCI detectives were able to arrest five suspects behind a series of home break-ins in Parklands as residents of Umoja managed to corner and lynch a notorious burglar in the area. In Mombasa, DCI detectives were also able to arrested nine suspect behind a series of car breaking and theft.

The above trends are likely to increase as the impact of COVID-19 on the Country's economy persists. Consequently, the loss of jobs during this pandemic is a key contributing factor that has and will push people to alternative means of income to counter the high cost of living.

CIVIL UNREST

Unlike the previous week, our security sources this week recorded chaotic protests in Nandi and Mombasa Counties. In Mombasa, residents barricaded the road leading to the port in protest of alleged discrimination of relief food distribution as residents of Lessos in Nandi County engaged police in running battles after a police officer allegedly killed a cobbler for not wearing a face mask.

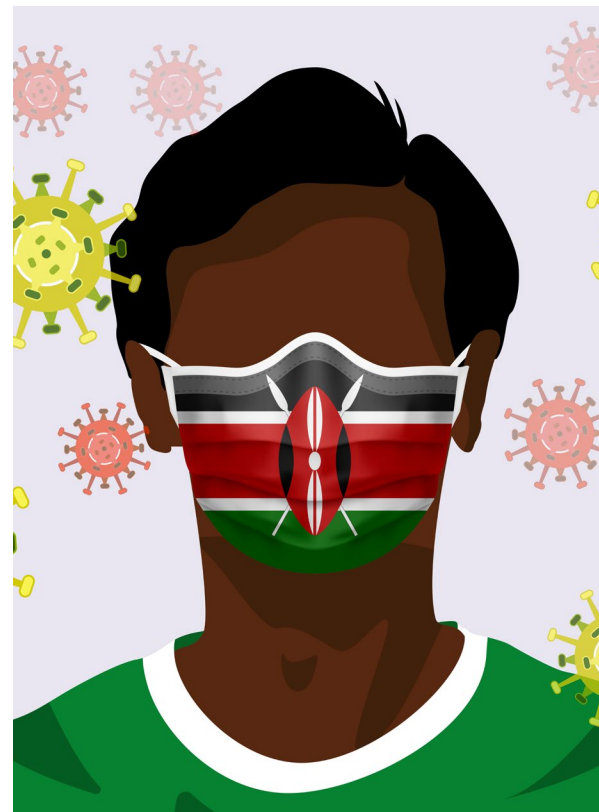
