OVERVIEW

The Ministry of Health on Thursday confirmed 124 individuals tested positive for coronavirus bringing the total national tally to 2340 against 592 recoveries and 78 deaths. Elgeyo Marakwet became the 36th County to record a case as Nairobi and Mombasa Counties lead in the total number of infections at 1182, and 655 respectively.

As the above number keeps rising and given the bed capacity of our hospitals, the Government plans to roll out a home-based and community-care base that will see over 80% of asymptomatic patients treated from their homes.


AN AERIAL VIEW OF COVID-19 HOTSPOTS IN KENYA

COVID-19 AND SECURITY UPDATES OF THE WEEK IN NAIROBI

- The Cabinet Secretary of Health on Thursday confirmed 124 individuals tested positive for COVID-19 against 39 recoveries and 4 deaths
- A 70-year-old man was on Wednesday found dead inside his burnt house at Tena Estate in Umoja
- A few protestors on Tuesday morning demonstrated outside the US embassy in Nairobi over the killing of an African-American man by a police officer in Minneapolis
- Police officers are accused to have on Monday night allegedly shot dead a homeless man during the curfew hours at Bondeni area of Mathare
- A woman was on Sunday murdered and her remains chopped into tiny pieces and later put in a sack at Umoja II
- Safaricom PLC on Sunday closed its Thika Road Mall shop after one staff tested positive for coronavirus
- Suspected armed robbers on Saturday night attacked security guards in Kitisuru before proceeding to break into homes in the area
- Two thieves were on Friday shot dead by police officers in a botched robbery attempt in a shop in Eastleigh
- Members of the public on Friday caught and lynched two thugs on a motorbike after they tried to steal a phone from a pedestrian in Kabiria area

KEY SECURITY INCIDENTS AND COVID-19 UPDATES ACROSS KENYA

- Police in Kisumu County on Wednesday arrested a 33-year-old man for allegedly killing his brother at Kagak village in Nyakach Sub-County
- Three staff at Mombasa Kenya Power offices were on Wednesday confirmed to have tested positive for COVID-19 disease
- A former police officer is accused to have on Tuesday night burnt down his family house at Witu area in Lamu County
- Thieves on Tuesday night defied the curfew order and stole 15 bulls from a farmer in Athi River, Machakos County
- An 18 year old boy was on Monday murdered and his body dumped inside his room at Kinungi trading centre in Naivasha, Nakuru County
- A DCI officer is accused to have on Sunday raped a suspect at his office in Embu County
- Two personation suspects were on Sunday morning arrested in Kisii
 County by DCI detectives following multiple cases of online fraud on
 COVID-19 stipends

- Four poachers who took advantage of the COVID-19 situation in the Country were on Saturday arrested in Voi following a raid by KWS and Voi Police officers along the Nairobi-Mombasa Highway, Taita Taveta County
- Police officers in Kwale County on Friday night shot and killed a man and his three kids on suspicion that he was a suspected Al Shabaab militant
- 36 fitness enthusiasts among them nine minors were on Friday arrested for flouting the COVID-19 safety guidelines at Milimani area of Kisumu County

A majority are looking forward to the President's address with the dusk-to-dawn curfew and cessation of movement orders ending on 6th June 2020. The crime trends for the past three months have correlated with these two orders as offenders took advantage of the COVID-19 situation to carry out their heinous acts.

The public is hereby advised to be on the lookout for suspicious individuals imposing themselves as Rapid Response Team tracking COVID-19 patients' contacts and ease from displaying their mobile phones while walking.

At least 15 people have been killed and 31 others injured by police officers since Kenya heightened security measures to curb the spread of coronavirus. The instances of reported police brutality have and will continue to spark protests among members of the public.
