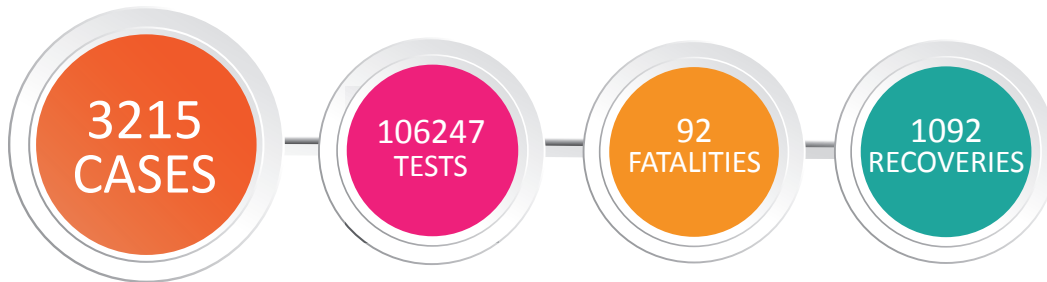

OVERVIEW

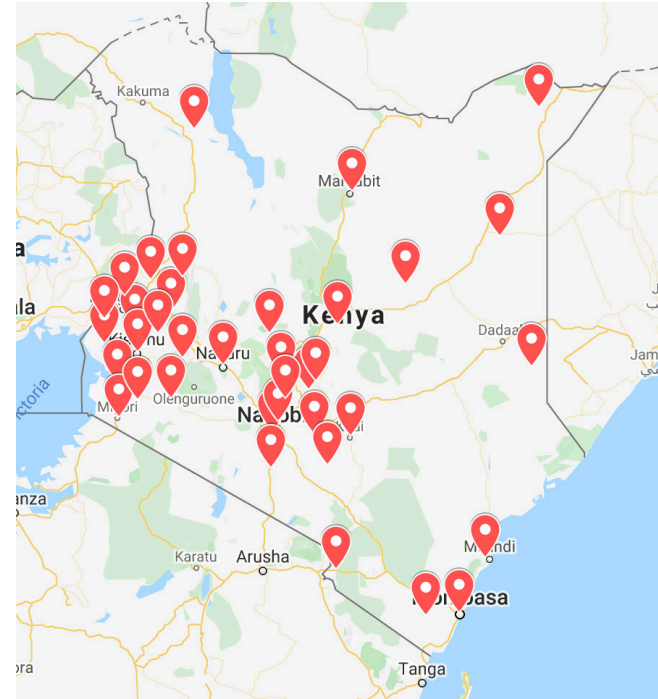
Since the start of June, the number of confirmed COVID-19 cases have been on a worrying trend with 167 new infections, the highest ever tally, registered on Sunday. Likewise, the number of recoveries from this disease has been slightly increasing, indicating that there is hope in the fight against coronavirus.

Whereas the Government continues to do its best to help curb the spread of coronavirus, criminals have taken advantage of this situation to carry out heinous acts on unsuspecting Kenyans. Our security sources indicate increased concerns across the Country on motor vehicle theft, mobile money theft, and livestock theft syndicates.

COVID-19 AND SECURITY UPDATES OF THE WEEK IN NAIROBI

- The Ministry of Health on Thursday confirmed 121 individuals tested positive for COVID-19 against 92 recoveries and 3 deaths
- The Nairobi Metropolitan Service on Wednesday announced plans to set up 490 beds across Nairobi hospitals for COVID-19 patients
- Two suspects were on Wednesday arrested following complaints that they were robbing people after posing as stranded motorists along the Southern Bypass
- Activists in Nairobi County on Tuesday hold peaceful protests against alleged police killings. In attendance were families of victims from Mathare, Huruma and Dandora
- 17 people were on Saturday night arrested after they were found drinking inside a club in Utawala
- Three thugs were on Saturday afternoon arrested at Gateway Mall trying to break into a vehicle of an unsuspecting motorist whom they had tracked from an ATM

IDENTIFIED COVID-19 HOT-SPOTS IN NAIROBI



KEY SECURITY INCIDENTS AND COVID-19 UPDATES ACROSS KENYA

- 8 officers on Thursday night narrowly escaped death and property of unknown value destroyed after suspected arsonists torched houses at Mirera Police Post in Naivasha, Nakuru County in protest of alleged harassment by police
- A boda-boda operator was on Thursday morning robbed of his motorbike, murdered and his body dumped in a maize plantation near Highway Academy in Witeithie estate, Kiambu County
- Three police officers were on Wednesday arrested by DCI detectives following circulation of a video depicting a woman being whipped and dragged on a motorbike in Kuresoi South, Nakuru County
- Residents of Karii and Kandundu in Murang'a County on Wednesday decried on the rise of crime in the area during enforcement of the dusk-to-dawn curfew. Criminals have taken advantage to break into homes and steal their livestock
- Three traffic officers were on Tuesday night arrested following accusations of rampant bribery in Juja area of Kiambu County
- A man on Monday hacked his 4-year-old daughter to death over a failed sleeping arrangement at Nyakwerema village in Nyamira County
- A police officer was on Monday killed under unclear circumstances at Tchundwa village in Lamu County
- Suspects assailants on Monday shot dead a businessman outside Keringet hotel in Bungoma County
- Two fraudsters were on Sunday arrested and shoes worth 7 million confiscated by detectives at Keroka in Nyamira County
- Detectives from the Directorate of Criminal Investigations on Friday arrested three suspects ferrying explosive materials near Maili Tisa market on the Namanga – Nairobi Highway, Kajiado County

CRIME

The extension of the dusk-to-dawn curfew will continue to have an impact on the crime trends in the Country. Like the past three months, the start of June has seen a rise in new crime trends – car theft syndicate, mobile money theft syndicate and livestock theft syndicate.

The police have advised the public to be cautious in their daily activities and report any suspecting individual or activity. Motorists should be wary when packing their vehicles in shopping malls or any other social joint.

CIVIL UNREST






There is a growing animosity between the public and police on alleged police brutality while enforcing the curfew order. Our security sources foresee more protests against this vice in forthcoming weeks, but a majority will be peaceful.

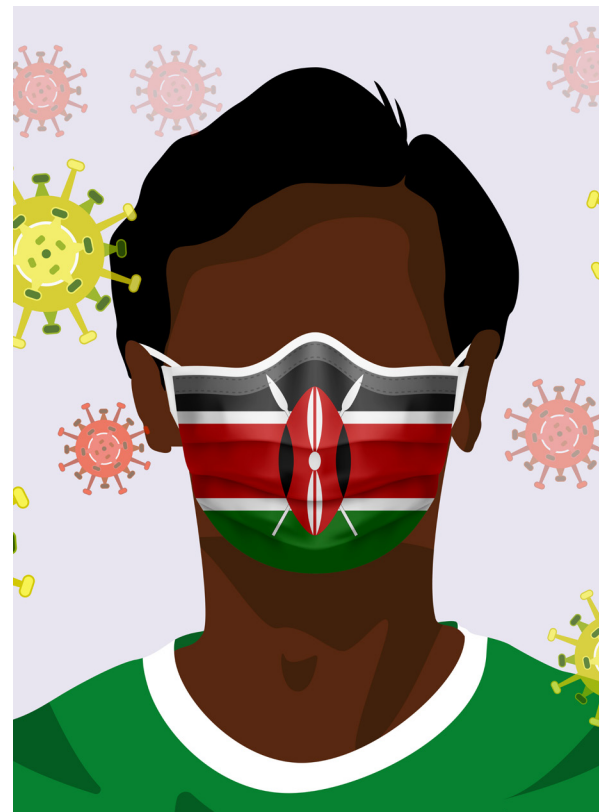
