OVERVIEW

The overall statistics for COVID-19 disease in the Country has been on a worrying trend in July as compared to the past four months. As of 21st July 2020, the number of confirmed COVID-19 infections in Kenya stood at 14168 against 6258 recoveries and 250 deaths. The Government through the Ministry of Health continues to urge the public to adhere to the set guidelines of curbing the spread of the virus, and some of the preventive measures such as working remotely from home and avoiding unnecessary travels to Upcountry regions. Other than the above, there was a slight decline in the general crime trends across the Country following increased night patrols by police and other security agencies.

COVID-19 AND SECURITY UPDATES OF THE WEEK IN **NAIROBI**

- The Ministry of Health on Tuesday confirmed 397 individuals tested positive for COVID-19 against 642 recoveries and 12 deaths
- Property worth millions of shillings was on Tuesday night destroyed after a fire gutted at least five motor vehicle garages in Dagoretti Corner
- Three young men are accused to have on Sunday night killed their two friends after disputing over a bet at a gambling centre in Kayole
- Two godowns were on Saturday morning razed down after a fire broke out at Atlantis Business Park
- Detectives are holding three persons in connection to the mysterious death of a young lady whose body was on Saturday found in a flower bed at Santonia Court in Kilimani
- A lady was shot dead by thugs who were robbing unsuspecting residents on Friday evening at Buruburu shopping center
- DCI officers on Friday arrested a police imposter who had been harassing Asian businessmen in Nairobi County. The suspect was arrested in Parklands in possession of assorted items including bhang, military regalia, and fake community policing ID
- Hundreds of youth from Kazi Mtaani Programme on Wednesday blocked the Mombasa Road in Nairobi County while protesting delayed payments

KEY SECURITY INCIDENTS AND COVID-19 UPDATES ACROSS KENYA

- Hundreds of protestors on Tuesday stormed Kibos Sugar Factory in Kisumu County to protest the death of three people who were allegedly killed in a road accident by the firm's car
- Two men were on Tuesday evening arrested with six pieces of elephant tusks with an estimated worth of Ksh. 1.4 million in Kutus, Kirinyaga County
- A 9-year-old girl was on Monday killed and her body buried in a shallow grave at Ihigaini village in Nginda Maragua, Murang'a County
- A 34-year-old man is nursing injuries in Ndaragwa, Nyandarua County after he was on Sunday assaulted by a police officer at an eatery
- A school boy was on Saturday shot dead and two other seriously injured at Marti area of Samburu County during a cattle raid incident
- A man on a game drive with his children was on Saturday allegedly harassed by armed private rangers in Laikipia County
- Police on Friday arrested a prison warden who allegedly raped a female patient at a COVID-19 quarantine facility in Busia County

- A University student was on Thursday arrested in Nyeri County over links to robberies and drug peddling. Police arrested the said suspect in one of his hideouts at Karia Dam outside Nyeri town
- Two assistant chiefs and a police officer are alleged to have on Wednesday defiled a 16-year-old girl in Kangema, Murang'a County

There have been at least two cases of foiled attacks by suspected Al-Shabaab militants reported along the Kenya-Somalia border with Counties of Mandera and Garissa been the most affected. In all the reported cases, our police were able to repulse the alleged militants and are on high alert for any future invasion.

Online fraudulent activities are still imminent during this pandemic period. Alleged criminals have taken advantage to target and trick unsuspecting victims into sharing the personal identification details that aid in identity theft among other vices. We advise the public should be on high alert while engaging on social media platforms and avoid sharing their identification details with unauthorized persons or business entities.
