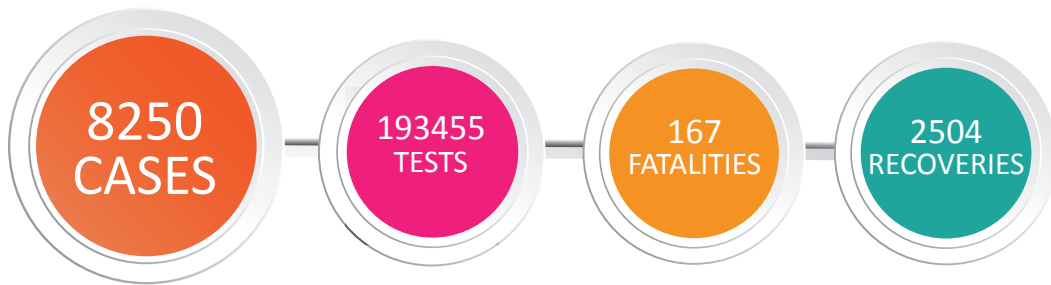

# OVERVIEW

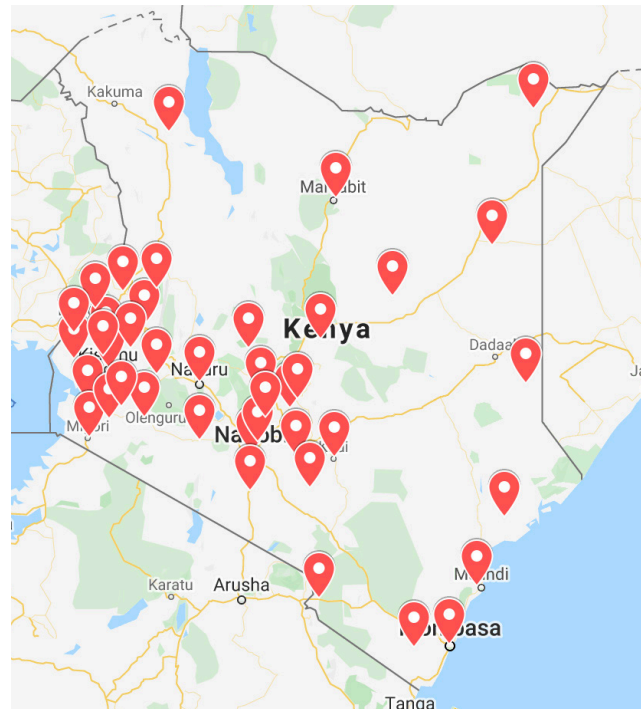
President Uhuru Kenyatta on Monday announced a phased reopening of the Country after four months of restrictions put in place to curb the spread of coronavirus. In his address to the nation, the President lifted the cessation of movement into and out of the Nairobi Metropolitan Area, Mombasa County, and Mandera County as of 4:00 am on Tuesday, 7th July 2020.

The President also ordered the resumption of international air travel into and out of the Kenya territory and domestic flights from August 1st and July 15th respectively. However, the nationwide dusk-to-dawn curfew that was currently in force between the hours of 9pm and 4am was extended by a further 30 days. The relaxation of the above restrictions come at a time when the coronavirus infections in the Country are soaring. As of 7 July 2020, the number of confirmed COVID-19 infections in Kenya stood at 8250 against 2504 recoveries and 167 deaths. The Ministry of Health has advised the public to exercise extreme caution and fidelity to the correct usage of face-masks, hand washing and sanitization, physical and social distancing, and have concern for the elderly and immune-depressed persons.

# COVID-19 AND SECURITY UPDATES OF THE WEEK IN NAIROBI

- The Ministry of Health on Tuesday confirmed 183 individuals tested positive for COVID-19 against 90 recoveries and 3 deaths
- Police on Tuesday arrested several protestors and dispersed others during the Saba Saba demos in Nairobi's City Centre, Kayole, and Mathare
- Three of the most popular restaurants around the United States International University (USIU) – Africa in Nairobi were on Monday night set ablaze by unknown persons
- The Management of Kenya Broadcasting Corporation on Monday reported that two of their staff tested positive for COVID-19
- DCI detectives on Sunday arrested three suspects following increased reports of fraudulence involving a fake fish supplements business within Roysambu in Kasarani Constituency
- Stolen shoes manufactured by Bata Shoes Company worth Ksh. 1.5 million were on Saturday recovered from a rental house within Obama Estate in Kayole
- Sarova Stanley hotel on Saturday temporarily closed its Thorn Tree Café after two employees tested positive for coronavirus
- Two thug armed with a knife and a gun on Friday robbed an M-Pesa agent of an estimated Ksh. 50,000 and some phones at Komarock
- Suspected thugs were on Wednesday shot dead in Nairobi's Ngong road area following a shootout with police officers

## KEY SECURITY INCIDENTS AND COVID-19 UPDATES ACROSS KENYA

- Four suspects were on Monday morning hacked to death by residents of Mithuthi-ini village in Kirinyaga County after they were allegedly found stealing livestock
- A man was on Sunday night shot twice in the head by his wife, who is a police officer, during a domestic quarrel at Dago area in Nyalenda, Kisumu County
- A police officer on Sunday shot and killed a trader over a face mask at Rioma market in Kisii County
- DCI detectives acting on intelligence on Sunday arrested a 23 year old suspect in Siaya County and recovered a G3 rifle with 13 rounds of ammunition that were stolen from Umala Police Post in late 2019
- A group of youths on Saturday dawn killed a herder and injured five others after they raided a ranch Mikululo area in Makueni County in the ongoing ethnic clash along the Makueni and Kajiado County border
- Police in Trans Nzoia County on Saturday arrested a car theft syndicate mastermind in Kitake and recovered 7 stolen vehicles and 17 fake logbooks
- Five robbery with violence suspects on Friday night robbed a family of cash and household items and in the process raped the woman of the house after assaulting her husband at Rumwe village in Njoro, Nakuru County
- A thief caught stealing car parts was on Friday night shot dead by police officers on patrol at Mwioko area of Kiambu County. Items recovered by police after the shootout included a homemade gun and several stolen car parts
- A suspected thug was on Thursday night shot dead by police at Hillcrest area near St. Francis Catholic church in Mwioko, Kiambu County
- More than 80 school going children aged 10 and 20 years were on Thursday nabbed at Burumba A Estate in Busia County while merrymaking and drinking liquor
- The body of a trader was on Wednesday found dumped by the road side in Embu County two days after he reported receiving death threats and complaining that his life was in danger

## SECURITY THREATS

Like the previous four months that recorded new security threats, the start of July has seen a rise in child kidnapping and online business fraud as the new threats.

### CHILD KIDNAPPING

There has been an increasingly worrying trend of child kidnapping reported in Nairobi and other periphery Counties across the Country. So far, the affected areas include Athi River, Kitengela, Rongai, Westlands, and Ruaka. Notably, the kidnapers usually target children aged 4 to 10 years after luring them with some gifts into their motor vehicles. However, it is not known where assailants take the children since in a majority of the reported cases they fail to contact the parents for ransom. Police have advised parents to avoid sending young children to shops alone or leave them unattended and be on the lookout for unregistered motor vehicles while walking around in the neighbourhood.

### ONLINE BUSINESS FRAUD

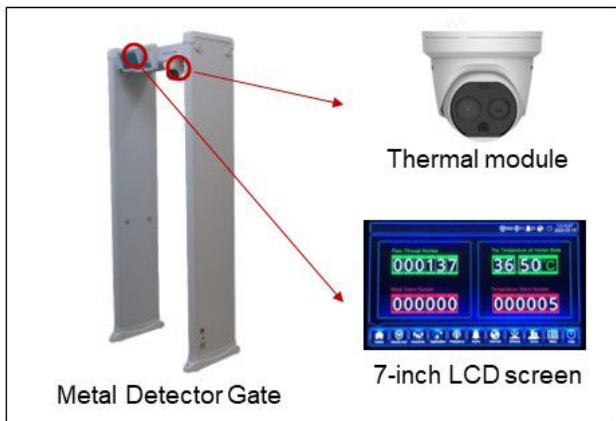
The Directorate of Criminal Investigations has cautioned members of the public to be careful whenever engaging in any online business transactions with individuals, agencies and companies whose physical addresses and legality of operations they do not know. This follows numerous reports of fraudulence on online business transactions in Nairobi and various parts of the Country.

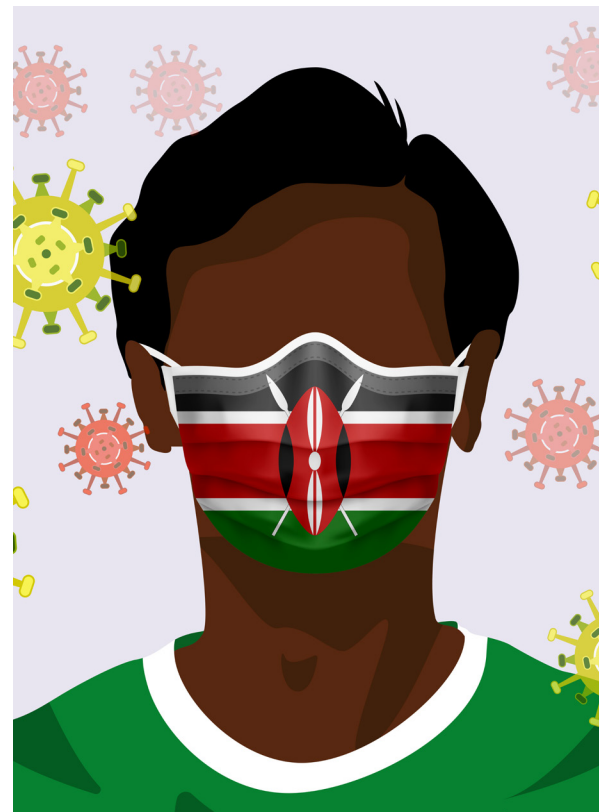
